### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

### Warrant For Annual Town Meeting for Year 1929

To the inhabitants in the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- To choose by ballot and major vote a Selectman for the three years next ensuing.
- To choose by ballot and major vote one Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote one Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- To see if the town will vote to accept the Library Building and lot under the conditions mentioned in the deed already executed.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Town Library.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Charges.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.

- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial Day and care of Monument lots.
- 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of Cemeteries.
- 14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repairs of highways and bridges:
  - (a) Permanent Highways. (Must raise at least \$1702.50.)
  - (b) State Aid Maintenance.
  - (c) Trunk Line Maintenance.
  - d) Trunk Line Construction.
  - (e) Town Maintenance.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to have a free skating rink and make appropriations for the same.
- To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay on town indebtedness.
- 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repairs of side-walks.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to lease for a term of years
  - the attic over the Town Hall building to Colebrook Grange No. 223 for the purpose of holding Grange and Pomona meetings and other purposes usually pertaining to Grange work, it being understood that the expense of fixing up and repairing said attic shall be borne wholly by said Colebrook Grange No. 223.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to alter the Town Hall to fit the purposes for which the building is now used, and to raise and appropriate \$150 for this.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to cooperate with the State to build a wall on the property of William McNeely at the Dugway, to protect the State Highway, and see what amount of money they will raise for the same.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to build three piers on the Mohawk stream to protect the town from ice jams and to raise money for that purpose.

- 22. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the use of Electric Lights beyond Dugway on Mohawk road, below Hazen Hough's house, on lower Main street and between T. F. Johnson's house and the Bridge on Bridge street.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to install additional electric lights on Main street, and if higher powered lights are to be put in, to raise money to maintain the same.
- 24. To see what sum of money the town will raise to build a bridge on highway near the dwelling of Otis Bryan.
- 25. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.
- 26. To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen and to pass any motion relating thereto.
