STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 13th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote a Selectman for the three years next ensuing.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
5. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Highway Agents of the year next ensuing.
6. To choose by ballot and major vote an Overseer of the Poor for the year next ensuing.
7. To choose by ballot and major vote a Surveyor of Wood and Lumber for the year next ensuing.
8. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year next ensuing.
9. To see if the town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.

10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of poor.
11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Library.
12. To see if the town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by budget.
13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days and the care of monument lots.
15. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of cemeteries.
16. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of Highways and Bridges:
 - (a) State Aid Construction
 - (b) Town Maintenance
17. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise toward the maintenance of a free skating rink.
18. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
19. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise, if any, to pay on Town indebtedness.
20. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the building and repair of sidewalks.
21. To see if the town will vote to give the free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said town, for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor services, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of the town, for the year next ensuing.

22. To see if the town will vote to adopt a discount for payment of taxes on a sliding scale as follows: 3% for payment by June 1st; 2% by August 1st, and 1% by October 1st for the year next ensuing.
23. To see if the town will, by a major vote, authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray expenses of town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
24. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell either at public auction or private sale to such purchaser and for such price as they may determine any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.
25. To see if the town will vote to pay, on the outstanding notes of said town, the sum of \$5,000.00 of the \$9,968.66 which has been saved during the past three years.
26. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as might be necessary to take advantage of any State or Federal Aid, offered or available, for the use and benefit of such town for the ensuing year, if considered by its Selectmen for the best interests of the town.
27. To see if the town will vote to allow beer and other lawful alcoholic beverages to be manufactured or sold locally during the year next ensuing.
28. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$108 to maintain lights on the new bridge on Main street.
29. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

any motion relating thereto.
