THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 10th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote a Selectman for the three years next ensuing.
 - (b) To choose by ballot and major vote a Selectman for the two years next ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot ard major vote a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote an Overseer of the Poor for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Poor.

- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Library.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 11. To raies such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days and the care of monument lots.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by Budget and raise money for the payment of the same.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise towards the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 15. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Town Indebtedness.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Sidewalks.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of Town Hall to public schools in said town, for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of town, for the year next ensuing.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for the payment of taxes on a sliding scale as follows: 3% for payment on or before June 15; 2% by August 1st and 1% by October 1st for the year next ensuing.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray expenses of the town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell, either at public auction or private sale to such purchasers and for such price as they may determine any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.
- 22. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Construction of Highways and Bridges.
 - (a) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,890.50 for the construction of the Carleton Hill road provided that the State will appropriate the sum of \$2,890.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts special aid, that the Town shall not be entitled to State Aid for class II roads.
 - (b) To see if the Town will accept State Aid construction for the class II roads known as Carleton Hill and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$2,591.19, or will accept State Aid for construction of class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$647.79.
 - (c) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for the purpose of constructing a bridge near Wendell Haynes' farm.
 - (d) To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town roads.

- (e) To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$647.79 for State Aid construction, provided the State will appropriate the sum of \$2,591.19 for same purpose and the joint sum to be expended in a similar manner to the Emergency Relief Funds of 1934 and 1935.
- 23. To see what action, if any, the Town will take relative to removal of snow from the streets, in the village of Colebrook, during the Winter season of 1936 and 1937.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of carrying out any action taken in the previous article requiring appropriation.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to purchase Auto Trucks, one or more Snow Plows, and equipment necessary thereto, together with the expense of operation of the same, for the purpose of plowing and keeping open all roads, in the Town of Colebrook, for auto travel thereon, during the fall and winter season of 1936 and 1937.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to furnish electric lights outside of the village precinct as now lighted and make appropriation for the same.
- 27. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Sewer Maintenance.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said town for the year ending January 31, 1935, A. D.
- 29. To bring in your ballots to vote for Delegates to the Republican and Democratic National Conventions.

30. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
