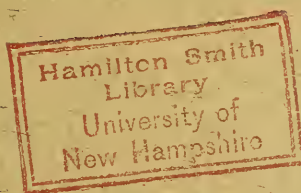

Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the Ninth day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Selectman for the next three years ensuing.
 - (b) To choose by ballot and major vote, a Selectman for the two years next ensuing.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
5. To choose by ballot and major vote, one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
6. To choose by ballot and major vote an Overseer of the Poor for the year next ensuing.
7. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days and the care of monument lots.
12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
13. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise towards the maintenance of a free skating rink.
15. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Sidewalks.
17. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of Town Hall to Public Schools in said town, for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of town, for the year next ensuing.
18. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for the payment of taxes on a sliding scale as follows: 3 per cent for payment on or before June 15; 2 per cent by August 1st, and 1 per cent by October 1st, for the year next ensuing.
19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray expenses of the town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell, either at public auction or private sale, to such purchasers and for such price as they may determine, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the Town.
21. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Construction of Highways and Bridges:
 - (a) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,893.00 for the completion of the Carleton Hill road and other work, provided that the State will appropriate the sum of \$2,893.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts special Aid, that the Town shall not be entitled to State Aid for Class II roads.
 - (b) To see if the Town will accept State Aid construction for the class II roads known as Carleton Hill and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$2,893.-00, or will accept State Aid for construction of class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$697.19.
 - (c) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the purpose of constructing a bridge near the farm of Arthur Brackett. (Beaver Brook.)
 - (d) To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Roads.
 - (e) To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$697.19 for State Aid Construction, provided the State will

appropriate the sum of \$2,788.74 for same purpose and the joint sum to be expended in a similar manner to the Emergency Relief Funds of 1934 and 1935.

22. To see if the Town will vote to furnish electric lights outside of the village precinct as now lighted and make appropriation for the same.
23. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for:
 - (a) Sewer Maintenance.
 - (b) Sewer Construction.
24. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the purchase of snow fence.
25. To see if the Town will vote to extend the water line to the Colebrook Cemetery and appropriate money for same.
26. To see if the Town will vote to erect a placque at the Colebrook Cemetery in memory of Joseph Loomis and appropriate money for the same.
27. To see if the Town will vote to pay on its indebtedness the sum of \$4,500.00, which sum will be paid from the balance of \$18,244.26 on hand February 1, 1937.
28. To see if the Town will vote to issue bonds in the amount of \$45,000.00 at interest rate of $2\frac{3}{4}$ percent per anum, said sum being the total amount of debt owed by the town. All present note holders will be given the privilege of being paid in full or exchanging note for bond. (To be explained fully at meeting).
29. To bring in your ballots to vote whether it is expedient to change the State Constitution.

30. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said Town for the year ending January 31, 1937, A. D.
31. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
