

Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town of Colebrook, on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Selectman for the next three years ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote, one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.

- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 11. (a) To see if the Town will vote to rescind that part of Article 11, in the Town Warrant of March 14th, 1939, relating to the borrowing of money, namely: "That said committee shall have full power and authority to borrow and pledge the credit of said Town of Colebrook, in a sum not exceeding, nine thousand seven hundred fifty and no 100 (\$9750.00) Dollars, for the purpose of erecting, constructing and building said new proposed Town House, but in no event shall said Committee pledge the credit of said Town for any credit created by such borrowing, due and payable, until the present indebtedness of the Town shall be fully paid and liquidated."
 - To see if the Town will vote to in-(b) struct, authorize and empower the Selectmen to pledge the credit of the Town in a sum of not exceeding nine thousand seven hundred fifty and no 100 (\$9750.00) dollars, to reimburse said town for money advanced to Darwin Lombard, Fred Jordan, and Harry La-Bar, New Town Hall Building Committee, said advancements having been expended by said committee in the building and construction of the new Town Hall; that any notes given for any such borrowings, as to time of payment, renewals and rate of interest, shall be upon such terms and conditions as in the opinion of the Selectmen is most conducive to the best interests of the Town.
 - (c) To see if the Town will vote to make further additions to the new Town Hall; if so, in what way and manner and make appropriation for the same.

- (d) To see if the Town will vote to continue Darwin Lombard, Fred Jordan and Harry LaBar, the present building Committee in office, to carry out any vote taken in the preceding article, and clothed with the same authority as heretofore voted them, with the exception of the right to borrow money.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges:
 - (a) To see if the town will vote the sum of \$2985.00 for the completion of the Bungy Road from the East side road to the Columbia town line, provided that the State will appropriate the sum of \$2985.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts special aid that the Town shall not be entitled to State Aid for Class II roads.
 - (b) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$721.45 for the T. R. A. construction provided the State will contribute the sum of \$2885.81 for the same purpose and the joint sum to be expended on roads which are designated by the State as T. R. A. roads.
 - (c) To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Roads.
 - (d) To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the plowing of Town Roads.
- 13. Te see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$1000.00 to be used by Road Agents and Selectmen for hiring special equipment to assist in the building and plowing of T. R. A. Roads.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct, authorize and empower the Selectmen of said Town to sell or lease, a portion of the Colebrook Cemetery Lot; provided any such sale or lease, as to the portion to be sold or leased, and the price to be paid therefore, is approved by the Colebrook Cemetery Association.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct, authorize and empower the Selectmen of said Town to enter into a contract, in behalf of said Town, with the Public Service Company of New Hampshire, for the purpose of furnishing lights for said Town in accordance with the present existing contract between said Town and Public Service Company; and to do all acts and things necessary in the execution of such contract.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote furnish electric lights outside of the village precinct as now lighted and make appropriation for the same.
- 17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for:
 - (a) Sewer Maintenance
 - (b) Sewer Construction
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days and the care of monument lots.
- 19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 20. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise towards the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the rent of premises known as

the ball ground, to be used as a baseball field for the High School, and for any other athletic games by any organization of and in the Town.

- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
- 23. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of Sidewalks.
- 24. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to permit appropriate lines to be painted in the new Town Hall, which in their discretion are for the best interest of the schools and town.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of Town Hall to Public Schools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat, light, and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year next ensuing.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for the payment of taxes on a sliding scale as follows: 3 per cent for payment on or before June 15; 2 per cent by August 1st; and 1 per cent by October 1st, for the year next ensuing.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell at public auction to such purchasers and for such price as they may determine, any real estate acquired by the

Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.

- 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$12.65 to reimburse Everett F. Holden, for one half the cost of sidewalk constructed at his own expense in the year 1939.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to provide compensation for a Clerk of the Municipal Court of the Town of Colebrook, and make appropriation therefore.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the "Municipal Budget Act" as set forth in the Public Laws of the Special Session of the 1934-1935 Legislature in Chapter 9.
- 33. To bring in your ballots for the election of Delegates at Large, Alternate Delegates at Large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Conventions of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Budget Committee, consisting of not less than three members, nor more than twelve.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said Town for the year ending January 31, 1940, A. D.
- 36. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

AUDITORS' REPORT

This is to certify that we have audited the records of the Tax Collector for the current year, and find all taxes accounted for. We have checked the revenue received from the Town Clerk for motor vehicle permits and dog licenses. The Selectmen's orders and receipts were checked with the vouchers and Treasurer's cash books, and were found correct. The Treasurer's balance in the Farmers and Traders National bank was reconciled with the Selectmen's cash book balance, and was found correct.

REMARKS

In order to clarify two or three items in the town report a few words of explanation are necessary.

- (1) The Building Committee were authorized under Article 11 in the Town Warrant of March 14, 1939 at which a favorable vote was taken, to pledge the credit of the Town in a sum not exceeding \$9750.00 not to be repaid until the present indebtedness of the Town had been paid in full, however, the Committee found it rather difficult to get a loan with a favorable rate of interest in as much as nothing was to be repaid on the loan until after 1946 which is the time the last installment on the issue of Town Bonds becomes due. Consequently, the Selectmen advanced the Building Committee the required amount from money which they had on deposit and on which they were paying a little less than one half of one per cent for an interest rate. This method saved the Town in the current year a sum of between two and three hundred dollars in interest which seemed to be for the best interests of the Town in both the opinion of the Building Committee and the Selectmen.
- (2) On the 1939 report, a sum of \$10000.00 was shown on the Financial Statement of the Town, as being due from various insurance companies in payment of a total loss upon the Town Hall. No account was made in this year's statement as the Selectmen complied with the vote of the people under Article 11 of last year's warrant and turned over to the Building Committee the sum of \$10000.00 which was on deposit in the two Savings Banks and not in our regular checking account.
- (3) We had a rather high overrun on our regular Town Maintenance of Roads this year, due to unforeseen circumstances. However, over \$1200.00 of this overrun is offset by the renting of Town Equipment to the State and also due to the fact that we charged each Road Agent the current rate per hour for every time that they used the Town Equipment in the regular maintenance of the summer roads. The above amount of money has been credited to the receipt side of the ledger and is now included in cash balance now on deposit in the Farmers and Traders National Bank.
