THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for the next three years ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Auditors for the year next ensuing.
- 8. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges:
 - (a) To see if the town will vote the sum of \$2,274.00 for the completion of Bungy Road and Bridge Street, provided that the State will appropriate the sum of \$4,548.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts special aid that the Town shall not be entitled to State Aid for Class II roads.
 - (b) To see what sums of money the town will raise and appropriate for summer and winter maintenance of Town Roads.
 - (c) To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.
 - (d) To see if the Town will vote to instruct, authorize, and empower its Selectmen to purchase a suitable Town Truck, provided the Selectmen deem it necessary and conducive to the best interest of the Town; and to use money from the general fund not otherwise appropriated, in payment of the same.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$750. to be used by Road Agents and Selectmen for hiring special equipment to assist in the building and plowing of T. R. A. Roads.

- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to improve the road from the Aldrich Turn, leading to Bessie Eastman Farm, on Piper Hill.
- 15. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for:
 - (a) Sewer Maintenance
 - (b) New Construction
- 16. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days and the care of monument lots.
- 17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Ceneteries.
- 18. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise towards the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 19. (a) To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Dollars to lease a suitable plot of land within the limits of Colebrook Village, to be used for a Base Ball Field, for the High School and other athletic sports.
 - (b) To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its Selectmen to rent any such plot of land as set forth in Article 19, Sec. a, for such other purposes as in their judgment appears to be for the best interest of the said Town, and to execute such legal documents as may be necessary touching the premises.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.

- 21. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of Sidewalks.
- 22. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of removing snow off and from the principal streets of Colebrook Village.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to provide watchmen and additional police protection, and other necessary expense deemed necessary, due to the war emergency.
- 25. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise to maintain its information booth and to distribute or contribute toward the issuance and distribution through other agencies, of circulars and other written or printed matter, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of Town Hall to Public Schools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat light, and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year next ensuing.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Seselectmen to sell at public auction to such purchasers and for such price as they may determine, any real estate, acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.

- 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said Town for the year January 31, 1942, A. D.
- 30. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
