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

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 13th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for the next three years ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote a Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Auditors for the year next ensuing.
- 8. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges.
 - (a) To see what sums of money the town will raise and appropriate for summer and winter maintenance of Town Roads.
 - (b) To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$710.46 for Town Road Aid, in which event the State will contribute \$2,841.84.
 - (c) To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the Village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for bulldozer work to facilitate the ploughing of winter roads.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the purchase of a new truck, if available.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
- 17. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of sidewalks.

- 18. To see what sums of money will be raised for Sewer Maintenance.
- 19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 20. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise towards the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Clock repaired so it will strike the hours correctly, and to appropriate money for the same.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial and Armistice Days, and other patriotic observances; and the care of monument lots and the erecting and maintaining of a Service Honor Roll for and during the fiscal year of 1945. All funds appropriated under this Article shall be turned over by the Selectmen to the American Legion and expended by it in such way and manner as it deems expedient for the purposes for which said funds are raised.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt that part of Chapter 441, Sections 8—13, Curfew Regulations of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its Selectmen to provide an exit of sufficient height and width in the rear of the Town Hall, and make appropriation for the same.
- 26 (A) To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money not exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.) Dollars, for the purpose of purchasing a plot of land for the deposit of garbage, debris, refuse, waste etc., commonly known as a "Town Dump."

- (B) To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen of said Town of Colebrook to decide and determine, if and when purchased, as aforesaid, where said plot shall be located for the purpose as set forth in subdivision A of this article.
- (C) To see if the Town will vote, in event a plot of land is purchased, to take a duly executed deed in the name of the Town of Colebrook, and to do any and all acts necessary in effectually passing of said deed.
- (D) To see if the Town will vote, in event of a lot being purchased as aforesaid, to remove all garbage, debris, refuse, waste etc., from the present Town Dump, and leave the same in a clean and wholesome condition.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a certain highway in said Colebrook:

Commencing at a point on the road leading from Kidderville, so-called, to Diamond Pond, directly opposite the residence of Stephen Loomas and continuing in a southeasterly direction until it intersects the Frank Keazer Road, so-called, in said Colebrook.

- 28. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract for street lighting.
- 29. To raise and appropriate to the White Mountain Region Association for its program of advertising etc., as a part of cooperative investment by regional towns, an amount equal to 10 cents per \$1,000. of the assessed vaulation of the Town for 1944.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of Town Hall to Public Schools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat, light, and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with

the best interests of the Town for the year next ensuing.

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- 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell at public auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the Town.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of internationl cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said town for the January 31, 1945, A. D.
- 36. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

The general health of the community has been very good. There were quite a few cases of chicken pox and three cases of scarlet fever reported.

There have been three cases of undulant fever in this vicinity during the past six months. Because of these cases it seemed advisable, at first, to require pasteurization of the milk supply. It was impossible to accomplish this for several reasons.

First, the State Board of Health does not require pasteurization of all milk supplies.

Second, no individual could afford to install a pasteurizing plant unless the community as a whole wanted pasteurized milk.

At present, there seems to be too large a percentage who prefer raw milk.

There have been no other milk or water borne diseases reported.
