# Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for the next three years ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Trustee of Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Library Trustees.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to elect, or authorize the Selectmen to appoint one road agent to care for summer maintenance of all town roads.
- 7. To choose by ballot and major vote, or authorize the Selectmen to appoint the necessary road agent or agents.
- 8. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Auditors for the year next ensuing.

- 9. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of the same.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges.
  - a. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for summer and winter maintenance of Town Roads.
  - b. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.
  - c. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$791.14 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in which event the State would contribute \$3,164.57.
  - d. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for bulldozer or shovel work and graveling following such work to facilitate the plowing of winter roads.
  - e. To see if the Town will vote to reimburse Albion Lyons the sum of \$242.00 for money paid by him to the Town in excess of appropriation for road work in his district, on what is known as the Golf Links road, and to instruct the Selectmen to take this money from road funds raised this year.
  - f. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate to build a new bridge on the so-called Rich Road.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the two Town Trucks, and to see what sum of money will be raised to purchase a new truck.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the Village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 16. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
- 17. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of sidewalks.
- 18. To see what sums of money the Town will raise for sewer maintenance.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to extend the sewer line on Park Street, making it available to the Nelson Boudle and Harry Little homesteads, or build other means of sewage disposal for these houses, and make an appropriation for the same.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 21. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise toward the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300 for the observance of Memorial Day, and the care of the monument lots.
- 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of promoting a Welcome Home Day for World War II Veterans and make appropriations for same.

- 25. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to Public Schools in said town, for school purposes, including heat, lights and janitor service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, for the year next ensuing.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of assessed valuation (1-100th of 1%) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to equip the Chief of Police car with two-way radio and the Police Station with a receiving set and appropriate money for the same.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian Ballot for its town meeting in 1948, in accordance with Chap. 34, Sec. 86 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the Forristall barn and one acre of land with same, at a price the Selectmen believe to be for the best interests of the town.
  - a. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to put a new roof on the Forristall barn.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,425 to reimburse the State of New Hampshire for the temporary bridge across the Connecticut River.
- 31. To see if the Town will accept the funds in the hands of the Swimming Pool Committee if turned over to the Town Treasurer to be kept separate as a special swimming pool recreational fund.

- 32. To see if the Town will vote to continue the swimming pool committee of six members and authorize said committee to draw on such recreational funds as they deem for the best interest of the Town and instruct the Town Treasurer to pay such bills as approved by said committee from the special recreational fund in his hands.
- 33. To see if the Town will empower the swimming pool committee to accept voluntary gifts of money in the Town's name for construction of said swimming pool and to sponsor various recreational activities to raise money for the swimming pool fund.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to continue the liability insurance and Workmen's Compensation on all town employees.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to paint the Town Hall and to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell at public auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer such property in the interests of the Town.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said town for the year ending December 31, 1946.
- 39. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
