### Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of delegates at large, alternate delegates at large, delegates and alternate delegates to the National Convention of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.

#### 1A. To bring in your ballots:

- a. For the election of all Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- b. To act upon all other following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 2. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payments of same.

- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges.
  - a. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for summer and winter maintenance of Town Roads for 1952.
  - b. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$732.46 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V. highways, in which event the State will contribute \$4,883.06.
- 7. To hear the report of the Sidewalk Committee, as printed in the Town Report, and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for 'construction of sidewalks for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 9. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
- 10. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the plowing and sanding of sidewalks.
- 11. To see what sums of money the Town will raise for sewer maintenance.
- 12. To see what sums of money the Town will raise for the relocation of the sewer at the River end of Bridge Street.

- 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for purposes of Civilian Defense.
- 16. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano shall be adopted in Colebrook.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise toward the maintenance of a free skating rink.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500 for hydrant rental for the ensuing year.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300 for the observation of Memorial Day and the care of the Monument Lots.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to Public Schools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat, lights and janitor's services, whenever such does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year next ensuing.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns of the White Mountain Region.
- 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for expenditures by the Chamber of Commerce for advertising the Town of

Colebrook, or otherwise promoting the resources and welfare of the Town.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy additional land for a Town Dump and appropriate money for the same.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Zoning Commission of five members to recommend to the next Town Meeting the boundaries of zoning districts and appropriate regulations to be enforced therein, in accordance with Sections 50-71 inclusive, Chapter 51, Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942, as amended. The Zoning Commission to make a preliminary report and hold public hearings thereon before submitting its final report to Town Meeting for action.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to see at public auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer such property in the interests of the Town.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1951.

28. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

In November of 1951, the Committee made a survey of the town and found that there is approximately 2,000 yards of streets without sidewalks of any kind, as follows:

This creates a situation that is very dangerous to the children going to and from school.

After conferring with the local contractors, we estimate the cost of new sidewalks at \$10,000.

The Committee also found that many of the present sidewalks were in very poor condition and unsafe to walk on after dark. Also, we are all aware of the fact that the sidewalk on Main Street is much in need to extensive repairs.

After due consideration of the above survey, your Committee recommends that there be established a ten year program and the amount of \$1500 be appropriated each year to be spent on the building of new sidewalks and the repairing of the old ones.
