THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all other following articles contained in this Warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor, for the ensuing year.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of summer and winter roads, for the ensuing year.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the general expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
10. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$744.66 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$4,964.39.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to complete the repairs to the bridge near the James Keazer farm.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase or rental of a "Pay-loader" for the use of the Highway Department.
13. To see what sum the Town will appropriate for tarring streets for the ensuing year.
14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use as much as may be required of the proceeds received from parking meters, to pay such appropriation as may be voted under Article 13.
15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for plowing and sanding sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote taken at the 1952 Town Meeting, for the year ensuing.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,693.26, to defray the cost of emergency sewer construction at the end of Bridge Street, as expended during the year 1954.
19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for sewer maintenance, for the year ensuing.
20. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise the money necessary for same.
21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
23. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the observation of Memorial Day and the care of the Monument Lot.
25. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for hydrant rental for the year ensuing.
26. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.
27. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat, lights and janitor services, whenever such does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, for the year ensuing.

28. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising foiders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$269.39 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000 (1/100th of 1 per cent) of the assessed valuation of the town for the previous year, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.
30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of painting the Town Hall.
31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expense of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year ensuing.
32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell at public auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' Deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer such property in the best interests of the town.
33. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1954.
34. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
