THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all other following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for care and removal of trees.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for sewer maintenance for the ensuing year.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the town dump for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of summer and winter roads, for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lighting for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$742.50 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$4,950.02.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for plowing and sanding sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and the care of the Monument Lot.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise the money necessary for same.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500. for hydrant rental for the ensuing year.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$264.05 to the White Mts. Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000. of the assessed valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$300. for payment of rent of the Parking Lot for the year ensuing.
- 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for replacing the sidewalk on Main Street, from Parsons St. corner to the Spring St. corner and for maintenance of existing sidewalks.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a back hoe attachment to be used in connection with the presently owned payloader, and if so, to raise the necessary funds to pay for same.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction of a sewer connection between the Main and Colby Street sewers.

- 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction of storm drains.
- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for reconstruction of the Pleasant Street road from Main Street to the Mohawk River.
- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for tarring streets for the ensuing year.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use as much as may be required of the proceeds received from parking meters, to pay such appropriation as may be voted under Article 31.
- 33. To see if the provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to paying Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public Schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year ensuing.
- 35. To see what action the voters will take on giving up the following pieces of road:

 Covell Road 1 mile

Covell Road - 1 mile Holden Road, Titus Hill, 4-10 mile Paul Gleason Road, Titus Hill, 1-10 mile Arthur Shallow Road, 23-100s mile Pratt Road, 45-100s mile Part Lost Nation Road, 1 mile Bean Road - 61-100 mile

- 36. To see if the voters will authorize the use of the accumulated interest on the Frank Leonard trust fund, to be withdrawn and used toward the purchase of a new mower for cemetery use.
- 37. To see what action the voters will take on the report of the Zoning Commission as required by Article 40 of the Warrant of March 1956, in ac-

cordance with sections 31:60 to 31:89 inclusive, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated. The proposed Zoning Ordinance is as follows:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The preliminary report of the Zoning Commission appointed by the 1956 Town Meeting is the adoption of the following zoning ordinance:

Proposed Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Colebrook, N. H.

An ordinance to promote the health, safety, convenience, and general welfare of the community by regulating the use and construction of buildings and premises in the Town of Colebrook.

ARTICLE I

Preamble

In pursuance of authority conferred by Chapter 31, Sections 60-89, N. H. Revised Statutes, Annotated, 1955, and for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, prosperity, convenience of general welfare, as well as efficiency and economy in the process of development, of the inhabitants of the incorporated Town of Colebrook. New Hampshire, by securing safety from fire panic and other dangers, providing adequate areas between buildings and various rights of way, by preserving the rural charm now attached to our town, the promotion of good civic design and arrangements, wise and efficient expenditure of public funds, and the adequate provision of public utilities and other public requirements and by other means, now therefore, the following ordinance is hereby enacted by the voters of the Town of Colebrook, New Hampshire, in official Town meeting convened.

ARTICLE II

Districts

For the purpose of this ordinance the Town of Colebrook is divided into two districts, as shown on the Zoning Map heretofore filed with the Town Clerk and dated February 27th, 1956, and including the following: (1) Residential and Commercial district being that portion of the Town of Colebrook bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the Colebrook-Columbia Town Line and the Connecticut River; thence easterly along said Town Line to a point twenty (20) rods easterly of U.S. Route 3; thence running northeasterly in a straight line to the intersection of the Fish Hatchery Road, so-called with U.S. Route 26; thence running northerly in a straight line to the interseciton of the Hughes Road so-called with the Stewartstown Hollow Road N. H. Route 3; thence westerly along said Hughes Road and the projection thereof to the Connecticut River; thence southerly on said Connecticut River to the point of beginning at the Columbia Town Line; and (2) Rural District.

ARTICLE III

Rural District

This section, identified as all Town areas not enclosed within the boundaries of the Residential and Commercial District, shall in no way be subject to ordinances or provisions of this ordinance, specified for said Residential and Commercial District.

ARTICLE IV

Residential and Commercial District

1. In no case shall any building in said district be erected, altered, or re-located so as to be located nearer the highway than the fronts of the adjoining buildings.

No owner or occupant of any land in said district shall permit any building or other structure, or fire ruins, to be left unfinished or incompleted there on but shall complete or remove the same within one year, unless specified by the Board of Adjustment.

3. Trailers and Mobilehomes:

Trailer Parks and Mobilehome Parks

a. Trailers or mobilehomes may not be located within such District without written permission from the Board of Adjustment, except for temporary locations for periods not to exceed fifteen (15) days.

b. Trailers and Mobilehomes:

A single trailer or a single mobilehome may be located anywhere in this District provided it meets all frontage, front yard, side and back yard minimum land area, and Sanitary Protection requirements in this ordinance.

c. Trailer Parks and Mobile Parks:

Trailer parks and mobilehome parks may be located anywhere in the District provided that they are 500 feet distant from the nearest dwelling at the time of establishment and further provided that:

- i. Each mobilehome space shall contain a minimum of 2400 square feet; shall be at least 25 feet wide; and shall abut on a roadway of not less than 30 feet, if off-street parking is provided, otherwise 40 feet. Such spaces shall be clearly defined, and trailers or mobilehomes shall be parked in such spaces so that there will be a minimum of 15 feet between trailers or mobilehomes and so that no trailer or mobilehome will be less than 10 feet from the exterior boundary of the park.
- ii. In all trailer and mobilehome park's roadways shall be well drained, graveled, hard-surfaced or

paved and maintained in good condition and shall be lighted at night.

- iii. Access roads shall be provided to each trailer or mobile space. Each access road shall be continuous; shall connect with a street or highway; and shall have a minimum width of 20 feet.
- iiii. Areas shall be provided for the parking of motor vehicles. Such areas shall accommodate at least the number of vehicles to the number of trailer or mobilehome spaces provided.
- 4. Tanks and pumping equipment for dispensing petroleum products may not be installed in this District.
- 5. After passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful to erect any building or relocate any building in the Residential and Commercial District without first having obtained a building permit from the Board of Adjustment.
- 6. No permit shall be issued unless the proposed structure will present an appearance reasonably satisfactory and in keeping with the general nature and character of the area in which it is to be constructed; nor unless said building is to be finished on the exterior in a permanent manner, and whenever the same is of wood or of a material customarily painted is to be painted.

It being the intent of this ordinance to prevent the erection of structures of such temporary, insubstantial, unsanitary, unattractive, or hasty construction, that they may be a damage or threat to the health of the community, unreasonably subject to fire hazards, or otherwise of such appearance and nature as to cause a substantial decrease of property values in the immediate vicinity of such structures. When an objection on the account of the appearance of a proposed structure, for any or all reasons above set forth, is expressed in writing by a majority of the owners of property within a radius of 500 feet of the property in

question, the Board of Adjustment shall hold a public hearing to receive evidence on both sides and shall have the authority to decide whether or not a permit shall be issued.

- 7. No land in the Residential and Commercial District shall be used for a dump, or a place for refuse, waste, or junk of any kind, nor for abandoned automobiles, carriages, or other vehicles, machinery, or other tools of appliances, nor left excavated and abandoned, nor used in any manner which is disorderly, unsightly, noxious, or offensive to the public, or to the owners or occupants of adjacent property, or otherwise of such appearance and nature as to cause a substantial decrease of property values in the immediate vicinity of same, without the approval, in writing, of the Board of Adjustment, upon such conditions as they may determine.
- 8. Signs: No outdoor advertising structure may continue as a nonconforming use for more than two years after effective date of this Ordinance unless it is designed to direct attention to a business or profession conducted on the premises on which the sign is actually erected.

Property owners with business, profession, or service enterprises shall be allowed two advertising signs not to total over eight (8) square feet in area for each sign; also, two signs pertaining to the lease, sale, or use of a lot or building on which placed, not to exceed a total area of five (5) square feet. This provision shall not apply to signs placed flush with the front of and against the actual business building.

ARTICLE V

Effect not to be Retroative

1. All buildings and properties presently used and occupied or under actual construction as of the date of this ordinance is passed may continue to be used and occupied indefinitely, even though

their present use does not conform to the provisions of this ordinance.

2. A non-conforming use, nonetheless, which becomes non-operative or vacant for a continuous period of one year, shall not thereafter be reoccupied except for a use conforming to the district in which it is located.

ARTICLE VI

Enforcement

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Board of Selectmen, and said Board is hereby given power and authority, to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.
- 2. The Selectmen shall issue any and all building permits requested when such permit is in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
- 3. Upon any well-founded information that this Ordinance is being violated the Selectmen shall, on their own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this ordinance by seeking an injunction against said violation or by any other legal means.

ARTICLE VII

Board of Adjustment

Within thirty days after the adoption of this Ordinance and thereafter as terms expire or vacancies occur, the Board of Selectmen shall make appointments to a Board of Adjustment of five members conforming in duties to the provisions of Chapter 31 of the N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. Thereafter as terms expire or vacacies occur, the appointing authority shall be responsible for filling vacancies and maintaining full membership on the Board of Adjustment. The Board of Adjustment shall conform in membership and term of office to the provisions of

Section 67, chapter 31, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

ARTICLE VIII

Ammendments

This ordinance may be ammended by a majority vote of any legal town meeting when such ammendment shall have been published in the warrant calling for such meeting.

ARTICLE IX

Penalty

Every person, persons, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance, may be fined not more than ten dollars upon conviction for each day such violation may exist.

ARTICLE X

Saving Clause

The invalidity of any provision of this Ordinance shall not effect the validity of any other provision thereof.

ARTICLE XI

When Effective

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

A public hearing on such preliminary report will be held as required by law at the Town Hall in Colebrook, New Hampshrie, at 8 p. m. on Monday, March 4th, 1957.

- 38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year ensuing.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds, and until the sale is made, to administer such property in the best interests of the Town.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1956.
- 41. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Note 1.

The Town Officers' Expense account was increased generally because of the general higher costs of materials and services. However, three items are of special interest.

1. Printing, office supplies and notices.

The sum of these three special items produces a figure of \$1,077.01. If this figure could be deducted

there would be an unexpended balance of \$351.87. The budget has been increased \$1,500. to meet the increased costs, and to absorb the Special Security appropriation. A figure of \$12,000. is shown on the chart and budget. However, street lighting has been set as a separate appropriation with a budgeted figure of \$4,500.

Note 2.

The death of Chief Towle left the town without a trained policeman. In order to obtain a suitable chief, a substantially higher salary had to be paid. In addition the new chief had to be outfitted and equipped. At the request of a citizens' committee, a patrolman was stationed at the intersection of Main, Parsons and Colby Streets to give protection to the school children. This service was provided until the meters were removed for the season. A plan to use school children for this assignment was unsuccessful. The increased budget figure provides for a fulltime chief and patrolman.

Note 3.

The sewage system has become a serious problem in town. The street storm drains discharge into the system and cause them to become clogged with the dirt washed in. No one has any knowledge of the location of the system and this causes extra expense in trying to locate the clogged section. The budget figure has not been increased. However, separate appropriations are being asked to start a storm drain system and to make an improvement to the sewage system.

Note 4.

Due to the action taken at the last town meeting, the former dump site was closed and a new one established. It was very difficult to locate a site that was desirable. The site chosen seemed most desirable although it too, has its disadvantages and has been unpleasant to some.

Note 5.

This year the town started a long range program of improving the town roads. The brush was cut over the entire system. A widening project was completed on the Reed Road. Culverts were installed on the Hughes Road, Herman Cross Road, Jay Sweatt Road and Steven Cross Road. Culverts were lowered on the Piper Hill Road. New stringers were added to the Jerry Bean Bridge. Due to a washout a new abutment was constructed on the Wendell Haynes Road. The total expenditures are shown to be \$23,480.19. However, the following items should be deducted:

Under the budget figure it is planned to do more widening, repair the situation on Joe Grandbois' meadow and to do extended ditching. The figure remains the same as last year.

Note 6.

This is the most unpredictable account on the budget and is the one that requires the most care to administer. This year the budget figure has been reduced \$2,000. It remains high due to the fact an attempt is being made to use the snow plowing equipment as is

for another year. This equipment will require more repairs. In addition extensive repairs are required on the grader.

Note 7.

Last year the town did the T. R. A. work itself and was reimbursed by the State. This enabled the town to get more mileage for the same cost and to use its equipment for revenue purposes. The budget figure was given to us by the State Public Works Dept.

Note 8.

A survey was made of all cases and it was found that certain cases could repay the town at least part of the relief given. In those cases arrangements were made for repayment to the account.

Note 9.

It was felt that the Main Street sidewalk needed replacing and it was thought it could be kept within the limits of the fund. However, emergency repairs on Main Street by the Mohawk River and on Bridge St. by the Town Hall, along with the Main St. sidewalk called for exepnditures beyond the limits of the Fund.

Note 10.

An article has been installed for the purchase of a back hoe attachment for the Hough Payloader. It is felt that with the increased amount of ditching required for sewers and drains, and the fact that there isn't any back hoe available in Colebrook, this unit will not only pay for itself in a short while, but will be a source of revenue.

Note 11.

It is felt that if the Main St. and Colby St. sewers are connected, it would help relieve the situation in that area. After a severe storm the sewers back up into the basement of the Parsons Block.

Note 12.

The budget figure has been increased to \$300. because of the increase in rate. However, this amount will be absorbed in the general government appropriation and no appropriation is required for this item.

Note 13.

The amount of \$651.94 is an item of expense paid by the Town but later reimbursed by the State Dept. of Public Works. There is an unexpected amount of \$2,248.01 on the books of the Dept. of Public Works. This amount will be expended this year on resurfacing and tarring the project. The work is subject to the State Engineer.

Note 14.

There are 75 to 100 trees in town that have been condemned. Last year only those which were a safety hazard to the public were removed. It will be costly to remove all condemned trees. There is a procedure to protect the present healthy trees. This is a question to be discussed.

Note 15.

Street lighting being the size appropriation that it is has been put as a separate item and removed from the general government expense. See note 1.

Note 16.

As mentioned before, a system of storm drains is badly needed in Colebrook. Because the sewers have been clogged with street dirt and the increased loads put on them by new construction and appliances, they have become inadequate in certain locations. This year it is planned to install catch basins at the foot of High St. by George Cummings' residence where the sewers overflow each year.

Note 17.

All the money spent on Pleasant St. from Main St. to the Mohawk River is wasted, as there is no foundation under it. It is planned to excavate to a depth four feet below the pavement and fill this excavation with gravel.

Note 18.

This year all the streets were tarred for the first time in a number of years at a little more than it has cost in the past to do about one-half the streets. It is felt that they all should be done over again. This money is to be taken from the meter fund.

Note 19.

The revenue of the parking meters was disbursed in three items:

It should be mentioned that the meters will be paid for in full this year. After they are paid, the town will gross \$3,000. Then deducting \$1,000. for expenses there will be \$2,000. per year net from this source.

Note 20.

Although this appears to be a large expenditure it is merely a transfer to the State of the monies collected as head taxes. In fact a small amount of revenue is obtained from this account.

Note 21.

The abatements paid this year, was to correct administrative errors, such as omission of veteran exemption, property listed in Precinct that was in the outside district, and some head tax abatements.

During the year 1956, two Salk Vaccine Clinics were held in Colebrook. These clinics were sponsored by the N. H. State Department of Health in coopera-

tion with the Local Parent Teacher Association, and the Superintendent of Schools. The towns of Clarksville, Colebrook, Columbia, Pittsburg, West Stewartstown, and Beecher Falls, Vt., were included in these clinics.

From the town of Colebrook, 877 children between the ages of six months and twenty years of age, received the vaccine. These were first and second shots only. This includes Our Lady of Grace Convent.

In 1957 we will hold clinics in January and May, for first, second, and third shots, and we hope the Town of Colebrook will take advantage of these clinics.

I would like to thank the people in Colebrook for their cooperation in making these clinics a success, and at any time I hope they will feel free to call on me if I can be of any service to them.
