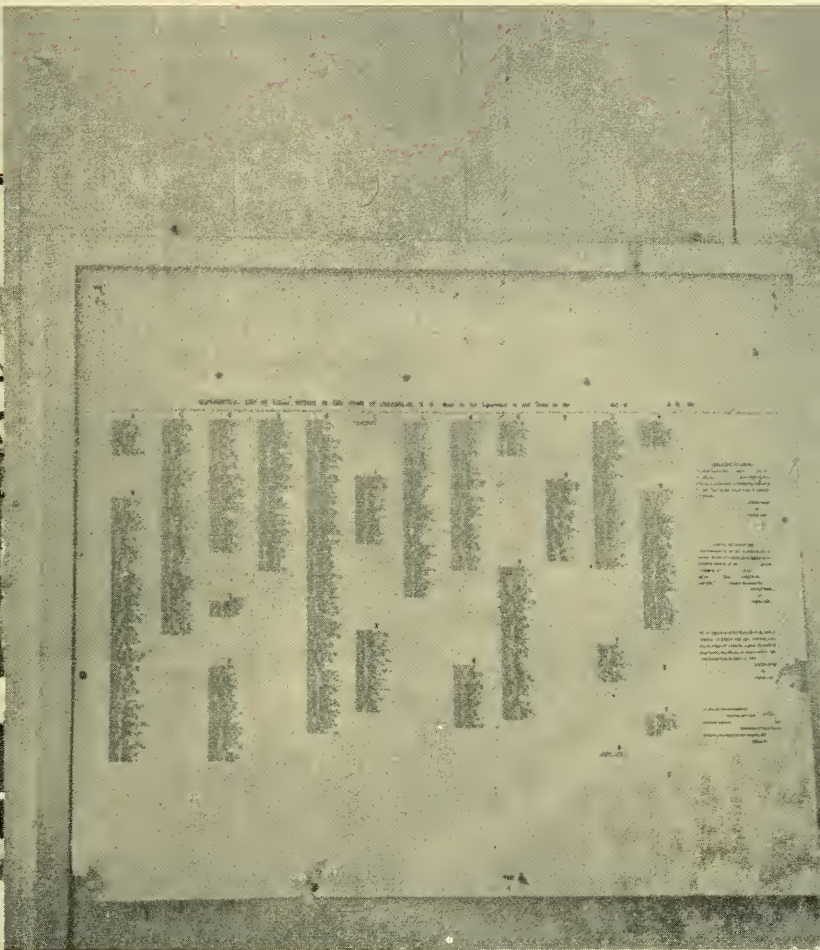

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WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 10th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all the following articles contained in this Warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To hear the report of the Selectmen as to the financial status of the town.
5. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for care or removal of trees affected by Dutch Elm disease.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads, for the ensuing year.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$894.48 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$5,963.22.
15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for plowing and sanding sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor for the ensuing year.
19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and

care of the Monument Lot.

21. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise the money necessary for same.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500. for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$289.10 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000. of assessed valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
26. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$335. for payment of rent of the Parking Lot and Driveway for the year ensuing.
27. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500. for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote taken at the 1952 Town Meeting, for the year ensuing.
28. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for tarring streets and for cleaning the streets in the business area this summer.
29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Parking Meter Fund, the amounts expended for tarring and cleaning streets, and for parking lot rental, dur-

- ing 1958, and the amounts to be used in 1959, as voted under Articles 26 and 28 of this Warrant.
30. To see if the provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.
 31. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year ensuing.
 32. To see if the Town will vote to pave the Pleasant Street Road from the concrete bridge to Lombard Street, and to raise money for the same.
 33. To see if the Town will vote to construct a piece of road approximately 1-4 mile in length from the Harvey Swell road to the Gordon Hurlbert farm, and raise money for same.
 34. If the above article is voted, to see if the Town will vote to discontinue the B. Rich road from the Diamond Pond Road to the Gordon Hurlbert farm, a distance of 1 1-4 miles.
 35. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of Pleasant Street from the Donald Covell driveway to Route 26.
 36. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase land for the purpose of changing the course of the brook at the east of the present dump site, in accordance with the directive of the State Board of Health.
 37. To see if the Town will vote to purchase and maintain the property in front of Beaver Brook Falls, to be used as a Public Park, and to appropriate the money for same. Maintenance of the Park is to be in accordance with the wishes of Fay Keazer; namely, that it not be used for commercial purposes, but only as a Public Park and that a large field stone or boulder be set, bearing a placque stating that the property has been

purchased from the Keazer family.

38. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to exercise the option of the Town to purchase the Parking Lot any time within 25 years from the date of the lease, and to also authorize them to withdraw the necessary funds from the Parking Meter Fund, the purchase price, however, not to exceed the amount of ten (10) years rental fees.
39. To see if the Town will vote to purchase 10 new meters, and to authorize the funds to be withdrawn from the Meter Fund.
40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year ensuing.
41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds, and until the sale is made, to administer such property in the best interests of the Town.
42. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1958.
43. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

selectmen's report

We have been asked many times during the last few months, "What will the tax rate be next year." This is a very difficult question to answer due to the fact that there are four factors that have a direct bearing on the computation of the tax rate. These factors are:

1. Amount of appropriations raised at town, school and precinct meetings.
2. The amount of taxable property and stock in trade in the town.
3. The amount of the estimated revenue other than that obtained from taxable property.
4. Surplus or cash on hand at the end of the year.

A brief discussion of each factor may assist in the understanding of the problem.

The amount of the appropriations raised at the various meetings is the responsibility of you, the voter. It can be easily seen that for any appropriation favorably voted at any of the meetings increases the tax rate and any appropriation not favorably voted helps to keep the tax rate down. The articles in the present Town Warrant can be justified and are wanted by certain groups in the town. It might be mentioned that the Selectmen are not in agreement with all the articles. We cannot overstress the fact that the burden rests entirely on the voter's shoulders.

The second factor is as well known as the first. It is only common sense that the more real estate and stock in trade there is in a town the less will be the tax rate. This year Colebrook is faced with a serious problem and that is that farmers are taking advantage of the Soil Bank Program offered by the U. S. Government. Entry into this program will not change the valuation of the real estate. However, the loss of stock will have a damaging effect. It is unlikely that the

new construction will offset the loss of stock.

It is the responsibility of the Selectmen to estimate revenue other than that raised by local taxes. It should be brought out that these sources of revenue are diminishing rapidly. For example, the revenue received from automobile registrations dropped last year, \$1,500. It had been increasing every year since World War 11.

Colebrook has reached the point where it will not receive any reimbursement from the State in lieu of lost valuation from standing timber. The Yield Tax from timber cut has been reduced drastically.

The amounts received from the State for Railroad Tax, Interest and Dividend Tax have also been reduced. In other words, the sources other than local taxes have been reduced and therefore more income must come from local taxes. This in turn raises the tax rate.

Surplus, or the money on hand at the end of the year also has a bearing on the tax rate. The Selectmen attempt to keep this figure at \$5,000. Any amount over can be declared as income and helps reduce the tax rate. However, this year there is not any extra cash, because the estimated revenues other than local taxes were not received and some appropriations were exceeded. However, there are articles in the Warrant to authorize the Selectmen to deduct from the Meter Fund sums for projects that can be paid for with meter money. It must be realized there are only certain projects that can be paid for by the meter money in accordance with the law. The Selectmen plan to use this money as much as possible, thereby increasing the surplus and lowering the tax rate. These procedures as well as the depletion of the surplus are subject to the approval of the State Tax Commission.

selectmen's report – numerical section

The numerical section of the Selectmen's Report consists of the following:

1. Financial Statement
2. Budget
3. Statement of Revenue
4. Statement of Expenditures
5. Comparison of Appropriations
6. Summary of Valuations
7. Listing of Town Property

All of the above reports are recommended by the State Tax Commission and each serves a definite purpose

The Financial Statement is the report that shows the true financial status of the town. Upon this report is listed the surplus account described above as a factor in computing the tax rate.

The Budget lists the amount of revenue estimated as income for last year, the amount of income actually received, the amount of income estimated for next year, the amount of last year's appropriations, the amount expended for these appropriations and the estimated appropriations for next year.

Above it is mentioned that income received was lower than the estimate, which was based on the previous year's income. This fact can be verified on the budget. For every article in the Warrant that requires an expenditure, an estimated amount is listed for that expenditure. The difference between the estimated expenditures and the estimated income (plus any available surplus) is the amount that is required to be raised by local taxes. However, the primary purpose of the Budget is to give the voter information to assist him in analyzing the true value to the town of each article in the Warrant. Needless to say, the Budget is obsolete at the completion of Town Meeting.

The Statement of Revenue lists all sources of re-

venue received by the Town Treasurer. Adjustments have been made to these accounts that do not show the true picture. For example, cancelled checks, head taxes, temporary loans and direct payments for expenditures are merely a transfer of money rather than a source. The adjusted total is the amount of actual revenue received that can be used for expenditures.

The Statement of Expenditures lists all expenditures for each appropriation. Here again, adjustments have been made to these accounts that do not show the true picture. It can be noted that for all adjustments on the Statement of Revenues, there is a corresponding adjustment on the Statement of Expenditures. The adjusted total is the amount actually expended and should be compared to the adjusted total of revenues that were received.

The Statement of Expenditures is the report that attracts the most attention from the voter. For this reason it has been expanded to show how much, for what, and to whom the expenditure was made. The report consists of four sections:

1. General Summary
2. Payroll Summary
3. Use of Equipment Summary
4. Purchase and Service Summary

In the General Summary all appropriations and expenditures are listed. Where ever applicable, the appropriation is broken down into categories common to that particular appropriation. For example, the Summer and Winter Road Appropriation lists payroll, use of equipment, and purchases. The purchases and services are further broken down into gravel, culverts, bridge timbers etc. This breakdown is general but it gives a comprehensive picture of the expenditures. To proceed, by examining the Payroll Summary it can be found that every person working for wages is listed. After each name are the total wages received and this total is broken down for the appropriation for which the wages apply. The total for each appropriation is shown on the General Summary. The

Use of Equipment Summary lists all persons and the type of equipment rented. The breakdown is the same as for the Payroll Summary. The Purchase and Service Summary lists all other persons, firms and organizations for whom town orders were drawn. Although every individual expenditure is not listed, every person, firm and organization is listed on one or more of the last three summaries. Briefly these expenditures to each person, firm or organization are extended to the particular appropriation or appropriations to which they apply. Each appropriation on each summary is totaled and listed on the General Summary. For charity purposes the totals transferred from the three summaries are subdivided on the General Summary.

The Comparison of Appropriations is a check sheet that should be followed faithfully by all voters during town meeting. It lists last years appropriations, actual expenditures, adustments, adjusted expenditures, unexpended and over-expended balances and the budget amount for this year's appropriations. After studying the above reports the voter can decide what aciton he desires to take on the various articles requiring an appropriation. This comparison summarizes the Budget and Statement of Expenditures and lists them in an abbreviated form. As the meeting progresses, the voters can note on this form the action taken on each appropriation and make any decision changes he feels warranted.

The Summary of Valuation lists all classes of property taxed this year. In the future, prior years will be listed to enable the voter to observe any trend.

All property owned by the Town must be listed each year.

The Selectmen feel justified in stating why some appropriations were exceeded last year. The chief factor for the road accounts going over was the weather. Last Spring we experienced several costly wash-outs in East Colebrook. If the State Department of Public Works had not allowed us to spend our TRA on the road leading to the Balsams Golf Course the overexpenditures would have been a great deal more. The fact that there was an unusual snowfall in Decem-

ber accounts for further over expenditure on the roads and snow removal in the Village. An excessive amount was required to clear up the paving condition on Main and Pleasant Streets. The situation was one that was a detrement to all the businessmen on Main Street and if Pleasant Street had not been paved all prior expenditures would have been lost. Not only the fact that the recession added to the rolls of the Overseer of the Poor but this year that officer had to contend with several very expensive hospital cases as shown in Summary of Purchases and Services.

It is felt that the Warrant is self explanatory. Attempt has been made to hold most maintenance appropriations the same as last year. Care of trees, Snow Removal in the Business Area, General Highway Expense and Town Poore have been increased based on last years expenditures and the unusual snowfall. The new appropriations which include a betterment project at the Town Dump, a new section of road to the Gordon Hurlbert Farm, paving Pleasant Street, sidewalk construction and purchase of the property in front of Beaver Brook Falls are being placed before the voters to take whatever action they deem advisable at this time. The dump project is required by the State Board of Health, the new section of road, approximately one quarter of a mile in length, is to replace the present Rich Road approximately one and a quarter miles in length. The present Rich Road is very costly to maintain and contains a bridge which also requires maintenance. The Pleasant Street paving and the sidewalk construction are part of an improvement program for the village. The Beaver Brook Falls property is again being offered to the Town by the Keazer Estate. To repeat, all these projects are desired and can be substantiated by certain groups within the town. However, the decision rests with the voters.

Finally, there has been a great deal written lately about the so called "Right-to-Know" program. The Selectmen wish it to be known that the public is not only authorized to attend the Selectmen's meetings and to inspect its' records, but it is urged to do so. Closed executive meetings are only held to discuss disciplinary action of a town officer or an employee.

Licenses were paid to me on 143 dogs for which the Town Treasurer was paid \$291.61.

During the year I have issued 1229 Motor Vehicle permits amounting to the sum of \$12,550.21, which was also paid to the Town Treasurer.

I also received \$118.00 from parking fines, \$9.00 for dump fines and \$16.00 from filing fees. These sums were also paid to the Town Treasurer.

I have on hand receipts or cancelled checks for all amounts stated in the report above.

In July of this year I had the seven oldest volumes of Vital Statistics rebound, which has made them much easier to use and which also insures the Town of having permanent records for many years to follow.

To The Citizens of Colebrook:

During the year 1958, 28 visits were made to the town. In the Spring 194 children received injections at the Triple Toxoid Clinics. 48 children started the series of 3 injections but only 39 finished, 55 children received Booster injections. In May, an Orthopedic Clinic was held at West Stewartstown sponsored by

the New Hampshire State Department of Health, in cooperation with the local School Nurse and the local physicians, 13 children were examined at this time, and we will be holding another clinic there in May 1959. In June 196 children received Salk Vaccine Immunizations at the Clinic. In December, 1-5, 270 students and instructors at Our Lady of Grace Academy, were given the Tuberculin Patch Tests.

It is hoped that a Preschool Dental Program will be held in the area in the Spring, and that we can look forward to having a good attendance.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Colebrook, and at this time I would like to thank them for their cooperation, and at any time I hope they will feel free to call on me if I can be of any service to them.

Amount authorized for construction of the New Fire Station May 8, 1956—\$45,000.00

At the May 8, 1956 Meeting, it was voted to use the money on hand in the Capital Reserve Fund towards the construction of this New Fire Station. At the same Meeting, the Fire Wardens were authorized to borrow up to \$28,000.00. They found it necessary to borrow only \$24,000.00. At the close of 1958, a payment of \$2,200 was made on this debt and the unpaid balance now stands at \$21,800. This amount will be retired by annual payments during the next nine years.
