WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 14th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all the following articles contained in this Warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the budget and raise money for the payment of same.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for care, removal, and/or replacement of trees.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
13. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$889.89 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$5,932.62.
14. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for plowing and sanding sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor for the ensuing year.
18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.

20. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free Skating Rink for the ensuing year, and to raise money necessary for same.
21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$355.26 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for payment of rent of the Parking Lot Driveway, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote taken at the 1952 Town Meeting, for the year ensuing.
27. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Tarring Streets and for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted,

from the Parking Meter Fund.

28. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct that portion of Pleasant Street from Lombard Street to Cross Street, and to raise money for same.
29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of a sidewalk snow plow.
30. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$800 to gravel a portion of the roads in the Cemetery.
31. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$250 to construct racks in the Cemetery Tomb, on which to place the caskets.
32. To see if the Town will vote to use the interest on the Frank Leonard Trust Fund toward the purchase of a new mower for use in the Colebrook Cemetery.
33. To see what sum of money the town will vote for Sewer Construction.
34. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to repair the Retaining Walls along the Mohawk River, as proposed by the U.S. Army Engineers.
35. To hear the report of the Committee appointed at the March 1960 Town Meeting, as to the feasibility of purchasing the water system from the Colebrook Water Company and to act upon the recommendations of that committee.
36. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, light, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the town, for the year ensuing.
37. To see if the provision of Chapter 171-A of the

Revised Laws relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.

38. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay the outstanding obligation against the Beaver Brook Falls property, in order to enable the State Department of Recreation to take it over as a State Park.
39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year ensuing.
40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interests of the Town.
41. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1960.
42. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The sum of \$924.13 was paid to Blanchard Associates, Inc., of Winthrop, Maine, for a complete overhaul job on the pump on Engine 1. This was necessary because nothing had been expended on this pump since it was bought fourteen years before and many parts had become worn to the extent the pump would not function properly at fires. No money was appropriated by the voters for this purpose because it was not learned until the middle of the year the serious condition of the pump due to its constant use.

The truck repairs were paid from money in the General Fund which would ordinarily have been transferred to the truck fund which was created in 1932 for the purpose of having money available for a new truck when the time came to replace old or worn out trucks. The amount which would ordinarily have been transferred to the truck fund this year end was \$1,021.47.
