WARRANT

The State Of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday the 13th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all the following articles contained in this Warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town officers as required by law.
4. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for Care, Removal, and/or Replacement of Trees.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
13. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$895.49 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$5,969.92.
14. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town poor for the ensuing year.
18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
20. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise money necessary for same.
21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$393.25 to the White Mountain Region Association, being 7c per \$1,000. of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region .
25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for payment of rent of the Parking Lot Driveway, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500. for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote taken at the 1952 Town Meeting, for the year ensuing.
27. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Tarring Streets and for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted, from the Parking Meter Fund.
28. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct and improve a portion of Monadnock Street, and to raise money for same.
29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Sewer Construction.
30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to complete the retaining Walls along the Mohawk River, as proposed by the U.S. Army Engineers.
31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of a Road Grader.
32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of a Sewer Cleaner.

33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.
34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available in the construction of a sewage disposal system, and pass any vote relating thereto.
35. To see if the Town will vote to raise, and appropriate the sum of \$250,000. for the purpose of financing and constructing a municipal sewage disposal system, including sewerage, interceptors, pumping stations, treatment works, and such other related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements and rights of way as are required, such sum to be raised by the issuance of not exceeding \$250,000. in Serial Bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds, as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Colebrook, and pass any vote relating thereto.
36. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the town, for the year ensuing.
37. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the year ensuing.
38. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws, relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.
39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in

anticipation of taxes, for the year ensuing.

40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interests of the Town.
41. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1961.
42. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Selectmen's Report

Listed below are several events that occurred during 1961 which should be recorded in in this report as a permanent record of the Town.

1. A public hearing was held June 20, 1961, upon the petition of certain citizens of the Town of Colebrook, to lay out two streets as described briefly below:
 - a. Starting at the traffic lights on the new State Highway and running in a northwesterly direction in a straight line to the unnamed street leading from Colby Street to the ballground.
 - b. Starting on the new State Highway at the west exit near the Richard Frizzell property and running two hundred feet west at right angles to the new highway, thence running parallel to the new highway approximately four hundred feet, thence parallel to the ballground property to the above mentioned street.

After hearing all testimony for and against the petition, the Selectmen, in the interest of the Town, resolved to lay out the streets as petitioned. Procedures were initiated to acquire the necessary rights of way at no cost to the Town, and the Road Agent was directed to deposit all surplus fill on these rights of way for future street development.

2. In accordance with the vote of the citizens at the Town meeting on March 14, 1961, the Selectmen held a public hearing to determine the ownership of the retaining walls along the Mohawk River in the Village of Colebrook. After hearing all testimony given, even though it all stated that the walls were the property of the Town, the Selectmen were unable to determine the true ownership. Certain testimony did bring out the fact that after the flood of 1928, the walls were repaired by the Town and the landowners were only assessed a token amount of the cost. In view of the fact that the Town had previously repaired the walls, and in the interest of the Town and the adjoining landowners, the Selectmen resolved to make only those repairs and replacements that the U. S. Army Engineers required to be repaired or replaced before,

it would proceed with its Flood Control Survey. It is to be stated here that the Town did not acknowledge ownership of any walls.

3. In accordance with the vote of the citizens at the Town Meeting on March 14, 1961, the Selectmen held a conference with Mr. Ferraro, President of the Colebrook Water Company, to determine on what terms he would sell the water company to the Town. Mr. Ferraro stated that he was an unwilling seller and would do so only upon direction of the Public Utilities Commission under the appropriate Statutes. That states that the Town has a right to buy and the owner must sell at any time. It further states that if the two parties do not agree on the selling price, the selling price will be determined by the Public Utilities Commission. Mr. Ferraro's price is approximately \$250,000 for his saleable assets. This price is not acceptable. The Public Utilities Commission has been requested to detail the procedures of acquisition. However, at this writing the information has not been received. If it is received before Town Meeting, it will be read and discussed at that time.
