WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:---

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesdady the 12th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all the following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Government Expenses for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the voters will raise and appropriate for the employment of special policemen or policewomen to direct traffic during the time immediately preceding the opening and following the closing of schools on regular school days in the village of Colebrook during the academic year 1963-64.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for Care, Removal, and or Replacement of Trees.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing yaer.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$854.29 for maintenance construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$5,695.24.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town poor for the ensuing year.
- 19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating

rink for the ensuing year, and to raise money necessary for same.

- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$393.25 to the White Mountain Region Association, being 7c per \$1,000. of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for payment of rent of the Parking Lot Driveway, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500. for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting, for the year ensuing.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted, from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct and improve a portion of Monadnock Street, and to raise money for same, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for this same purpose in later years.

- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Sewer & Storm Drain Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for this same purpose in later years.
- 32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of trading the present Police Cruiser for a later model.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase the land necessary for the proposed ice control project now under study by the U. S. Engineers, if said project is approved by the U. S. Government, from the present landowners or the State of New Hampshire whichever is to the best interest of the Town and to appropriate the sum of \$10,000, or authorize the Selectmen to negotiate a short term loan for a sum not exceeding \$10,000.00
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town appraised by the New Hampshire Tax Commission and appropriate money for the same.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as a Board to license dealers in junk, to establish rules to be followed by said dealers and to carry out the regulations related thereto in accordance with Chapter 322, Section 1-13, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the ensuing year.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 38. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws, relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.

- 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors, deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interests of the Town.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they make their annual appraisal.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1962.
- 43. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Selectmen's Report

Listed below are several events that occurred during 1962 which should be recorded in their report as a permanent record of the Town:

1. A series of events that occurred during the year made it impossible to control the expenditures within the appropriated amounts. The unusual number of fires outside of the fire precinct, the need to borrow more money and to borrow it sooner are two instances that caused the general government expenses to soar. The loss of the Bean Bridge and the unusual snowfall caused the highway accounts to be exceeded. A broken sewer on Young's meadow was responsible for the fact that the sewer maintenance account was overrun. All these factors were uncontrollable.

This year a more realistic budget has been prepared. Most current maintenance expense items on the budget have been increased. To face facts, the residents of the Town are demanding these services. Gone are the days when automobile owners carry tire chains and shovels to get over the back roads in the winter. Colebrook's schools and businesses are never closed due to snow, as they are in other towns, and this is as it should be. However, it must be realized that the increased costs of labor, materials, equipment, and repairs increase the costs of town operations.

- 2. Just before the end of the year the Public Works Department of the State of New Hampshire awarded a contract to construct a new section of highway starting at the Mohawk River Bridge on Main Street and continuing north for over two miles. This project will be a benefit to the town in that a new sidewalk will be constructed to the cemetery, storm drains will be constructed, and the general approach to the village will be improved at no cost to the town. It is true that certain individuals will be inconvenienced and have their land altered. The Selectmen offer their services to these individuals in assisting them in the claims.
- 3. In December the Federal Home and Finance Agency approved an interest free loan to design a sewage

treatment facility. The firm of Stevenson, Seelye, Value & Kneck has been engaged to design a suitable system to fulfill the order of the New Hampshire Water Pollution Commission to clear up the Mohawk River of any sewage. Construction should start this summer.

- 4. The U. S. Engineers were granted authority to proceed with a study to prevent future ice, jams in the Mohawk River. They have completed the field work and are completing the study at the present time. The proposed solution to the problem is to construct an ice retaining dam at the dugway and a straight deep channel from the Main Street bridge to the Connecticut River. The Selectmen have been advised that if the project is approved by Washington, construction should commence in the fall.
- 5. During the coming year the Selectmen will hold hearings for the following:
- (a) Complete revision of the Zoning Ordinance.
- (b) Establishment of three streets.
 - (1) Now known as Edwards Street.
 - (2) On the Lawrence Moren, Jr. property.
 - (3) Now known as Brandy Lee Lane.
- (c) The disposal land of an abandoned road.
 (1) Road formerly leading to the Gordon Hurlbert property.

Residents of Colebrook are encouraged to attend these hearings. Dates of the hearings will be published.

Civil Defense

During The Cuban crisis the town showed considerable interest in Civil Defense. Sparked by this interest the local unit became active. It contacted the State Director and asked him to outline Colebrook's mission at the time of an emergency.

The State Director informed the Local Director that the immediate objective will not be to shelter, feed, and clothe, persons from other areas as was planned in the past, but to establish Colebrook's plan in case of an emergency.

Several meetings were held at which time the basic plans were worked out, the Department Heads were appointed and their duties outlined.

Colebrook's Civil Defense Unit comprises of the following Unit Leaders.

Director: Frank H. Owen; Deputy Director: George I. Labar; Warning-Communication: Richard Frizzell; Welfare-Refugee: Laurance Bryan; Firefighting: Earl Wadsworth; Police-Warden: Borden T. Helms; Rescue and Engineering: Robert Shaw; Transportation: Bertram Parker; Medical, Hospital, First Aid: Dr. Bruce Kelly; Radiological Monitoring: Sherwood Carbee. These Department Heads are ably assisted by other volunteers.

Other activities during the year were a Radiological Monitoring refresher course was held. The Instruments were reconditioned. Literature on Fall Out, Shelters, Food Storage, and other things to do during an attack was distributed. These booklets are still available at Hughes Radio and Electric Shop.

The Superintendent of Schools has worked out a program to evacuate the School Children in the event of an Alert signal. On a take cover signal the Children will be kept at school until the alert signal is sounded.

In the coming year we plan to have a course in Home Nursing.

The Director feels that definite thought should be given to the establishment of a permanent Control Center. This Center should be constructed in such a manner as to be safe from any expected attack. It should house a complete communications center including telephone, and radio and be equipped with emergency power supply. Also there should be storage space provided for supplies and equipment needed.

The Director also recommends that each family should have some type of Fall Out Shelter.
