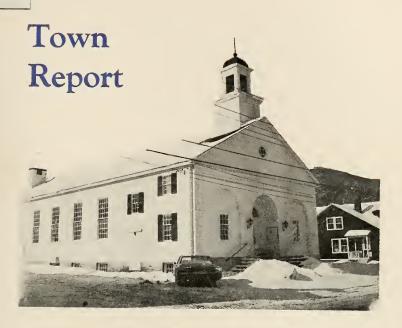

### WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at ten c'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- To act upon all of the following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Government Expenses for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Police for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution to Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution to the North Country Community Services, Inc.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for Care, Removal, and | or replacement of Trees.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.

- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,056.26 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in which event the State will contribute \$7,041.76.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise money necessary for same.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.

- 25. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$521.79 to the White Mountain Region Association, being .07c per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting, for the ensuing year.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted, from the Parking Meter Fund.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct and improve Colby Street and to raise money for the same, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for other streets in later years.
- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Sewer and Storm Drain Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for this same purpose in later years.
- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 32. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to investigate the purchase or lease of a suitable new site for a Town Dump, and to see what sum the Town will appropriate for the purpose of taking an option of sale or lease on any such site which may be deemed suitable by the Selectmen.
- 33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of trading the present Police Cruiser for a later model.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a truck for plowing and appropriate money for same.
- 35. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for the Sewerage Facilities.

- 36. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, for the ensuing year.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever the same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 38. To see whether the Town will adopt a resolution, pursuant to New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 36, Section 38, to become a member of a regional planning commission, with any other town or towns in the region having planning boards which have adopted or may adopt similar resolutions.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at Public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of the said Town for the year ending December 31, 1967.
- 42. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

In addition to the amount raised by taxes, it was also voted to apply the sum of \$1,000.00 left over from the 1966 appropriations on the Engine No. 2 loan. The application of this 1,000.00 paid off the loan in full.

During the year 1967 a new truck known as Engine No. 3 was purchased at a cost of \$19,711.00 to replace one that was over 20 years old. This new truck is a 750 gallons a minute pumper, and is also equipped with a 750 gallon water tank. To pay for this new piece of equipment \$4,711.00 was transferred from the "Truck Fund Reserve Account" and \$15,000.00 was borrowed from the Colebrook Guaranty Savings Bank. The loan is to be

repaid \$1,500 and interest each year over a period of 10 years, beginning December 1, 1968.

This new loan of \$15,000 constitutes the only indebtedness owed by the Precinct

# PROGRAMS OF THE WHITE MOUNTAINS REGION ASSOCIATION 1967 (30th year)

The White Mountains Region Association has had an active season.

This past summer we originated and sponsored an information booth at Ayer's Cliff, Quebec, to sell people leaving Expo '67 to the White Mountains region and New Hampshire.

We have prepared a 100-page application for a federal grant for research of snow erosion problems at ski areas.

Introduced for the first time whitewater racing to the region in our Androscoggin Weekend which was held in September and continued to boom the fall foliage promotion.

Supported the 4-H programs with awards; studied and promoted various east-west highway routes in the north country; researched and supported the need for bus connection from Littleton to Colebrook; received and answered 9,000 inquiries from outsiders who wanted to spend their money in the White Mountains region.

The development of recreation has and will continue to be a major factor in the economy of our towns. In addition to being an active industry by itself, it encourages the location of industry in our region.

We hope your town will support the White Mountains Region's appropriation request for 1968 which is seven cents per thousand dollars of the towns' equalized valuation. These activities which we are engaged in are limited to the amount of money we are able to raise.
