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# **WARRANT**

## **The State of New Hampshire**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 7th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Government Expenses for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate as its contribution to the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association toward the cost of construction of the new area hospital.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Care, Removal and/or Replacement of Trees.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance for the ensuing year.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.



14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,040.04 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event, the State will contribute \$6,933.61.
15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of publicizing and promoting by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and North Country region.
24. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to appoint a person to serve on a joint advisory committee of all towns in New Hampshire and Vermont involved in the proposed Connecticut National Recreation Area - Coos Scenic Unit, so called, in order to formulate a shared statement regarding the preservation and/or development of land in the Upper Connecticut Valley,
25. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$840.47 to the White Mountain Region Association, being .07c per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting for the ensuing year.



27. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted from the Parking Meter Fund.
28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
29. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct and improve Spring and Edwards Streets and to raise money for the same, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for other streets in later years.
30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Sewer and Storm Drain Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for this same purpose in later years.
31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to purchase new equipment.
33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for the Sewerage Facilities.
34. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to be placed in the Special Dump Fund established at the 1969 Town Meeting.
35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-one Thousand Dollars (\$41,000.00) to be applied with the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) raised at the 1971 Town Meeting, to repair the Pleasant Street Bridge, in which event the State will contribute two-thirds of the total cost thereof, and further, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply against said appropriation Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00) of the surplus, and any other funds which may become available.
37. To see what sum, not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the replacement and extension of water and sewer lines on Route 26 from Main Street to such point as the Water and Sewer Commissioners may determine.

38. If the above Article is approved, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to raise the necessary funds so voted, by issuing bonds or serial notes on such terms and rates of interest as the Selectmen may determine, pursuant to Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 23, the Municipal Finance Act.
39. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for perambulation of boundaries of the Town of Colebrook as required by Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 51.
40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs and maintenance of the Town Hall.
41. To see whether the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to pay the balance due on the preliminary survey of the extension of the waste water collection system.
42. To see if the Town will vote to establish a conservation commission under the provisions of R. S. A. 36A, and that the selectmen shall appoint said commission, to consist of (three to seven) members, within 60 days of the said annual meeting, and that said selectmen shall also designate, for the purpose of calling the first commission meeting, a temporary chairman.
43. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to eliminate the odor problem at the sewer system lagoons.
44. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, lights, and janitor services whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town, for the ensuing year.
45. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
46. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year.
47. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.

48. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of the said Town for the year ending December 31, 1971.
49. To Transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## SUMMARY PROGRAM WHITE MTNS REGION ASSN 1971

Pioneered an engineering project at the University of New Hampshire in researching problems of snow erosion at ski areas. This project is well underway now and it appears that some practical solutions have been arrived at.

Maintained an active legislative program through the formation of a joint committee of the four regional promotional groups in the White Mountains.

Helped defeat an increase in the rooms and meals tax and gave strong support regarding the 16-mile extension of the Spaulding Turnpike.

Continued to promote new outdoor sports compatible to the region: namely, white-water canoeing, ski touring and bicycling.

Posted the annual 500 miles of fall foliage tour leaves.

Participated in a citizens' review committee on the controversial 4 million dollar federal Connecticut Basin study and were successful in altering some of the recommendations of this study.

Continued to develop the concept of promoting the off-season for tourists as against the high season.

Gave awards to 4-H groups in Grafton and Coos Counties.

Received 6,593 inquiries for the season which were answered with kits of folders.

Wrote 49 news releases. Wrote 259 personal letters.

Wrote four magazine articles and had twenty-five photographs appear in magazines and newspapers.

Printed and distributed 275,000 folders.

Appeared on four radio programs and attended two travel shows.

Total income for 1971, \$33,833.

Presently we are working to make the state regional planning effort coincide with the six existing region associations.

Presently we are working with the Neighborhood Youth Corps to develop a course in hotel management for high school drop-outs, etc.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

### LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellarholes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947. Nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand - a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them **dead out** when leaving.
4. **Most important** - Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

SERVICE, INC.**

**REPORT OF SERVICE RENDERED IN THE TOWN OF  
COLEBROOK**

**February 15, 1971 to December 31, 1971**

On February 8, 1971, Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service Inc., was formally incorporated as a locally based and managed mental health program for nine communities from Groveton north to Pittsburg. All State and professional standards for mental health programs are met by this agency.

Of the approximately 160 individuals seen for counseling thus far, only three have had to be referred outside of our area for hospital care or other treatment. Thirty individuals have been treated on an in-patient basis at Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital for emotional problems requiring a temporary period of hospital care. Previously, many of these patients would have been sent to New Hampshire Hospital or other facilities.

Referrals for counseling have included 59 Colebrook residents. Problems represented include marriage difficulties, school adjustment problems, severe depression, problems of old age, and work adjustment situations.

Under the leadership of Dr. James Lianos, a school consultation program was initiated in April, and children were seen through the summer months as well. In October, Dr. John Chappell replaced Dr. Lianos, and he is now offering regularly scheduled consultation visits to the Colebrook Schools.

All staff are available to the community and to the schools. Staff members include:

Since Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service is still quite new, it is likely that many people who could use this program are not yet aware that it is available; and I would like to suggest that a local advisory committee be formed, to include at least one selectman. This would help us in publicizing who we are and what we are offering in the area.
