STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

The Polls will be open from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday the 4th of March, next at seven o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for General Government for the ensuing year including outside fires and interest for short term obligations.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
- To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay on the construction debt of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Care, Removal and/or Replacement of Trees.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.

- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,023.13 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event, the State will contribute \$6,820.90.
- 13. To see if the Town, will vote to remove the snow from the Business area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tarring Streets.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Street Construction, and to direct the Selectmen to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for other streets in later years.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the resurfacing of South Main Street and to authorize the withdrawal of such sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the reconstruction of Colby Street.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of repairing and resurfacing roads outside the precinct and to authorize the withdrawal of such sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the Provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 21. To see whether the Town will, pursuant to revised Statutes Annotated, 245.6 by major vote authorize the Selectmen beginning and effective as of the Town

Meeting of 1976, to appoint one or more Highway Agents instead of electing same by ballot, said vote if passed to continue in effect until changed by major vote at an annual or special Town Meeting. (inserted by Committee Request)

- 22. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$4,440.00 to reimburse the Colebrook Development Co. for the cost of paving Gould St.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for the Sewerage Facilities.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation and construction of the sewer and water departments and sewer and storm drain maintenance and direct the sewer and water commissioners to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for the same purpose in later years.
- To see what sum of money the Town will raise for emergency radio communications for the ensuing year.
- 28. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$14,394.00 for the purchase of a new 2 way radio system for the Fire Department and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw such sum from the Revenue Sharing Funds established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of new Parking Meters.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund

to be transferred to the capital reserve fund known as the Special Dump Fund established at the 1969 Town Meeting and augmented by further appropriation under Article 36 of the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of 1973.

- 33. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Town Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof as provided N.H. RSA 36: Section 19-29 inclusive and Section 34.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to grant site plan review authority to the Planning Board in accordance with RSA 36:19a. This will provide the Town with an opportunity to review and approve or disapprove plans for non-residential development.
- 36. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 37. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc.
- 39. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Convalesce. (Submitted by Petition)
- 40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,185.00 as the Towns share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1975. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

- 42. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the preparation of a Tax Map pursuant to R.S.A.
- 43. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the repair or replacement of the wall on the Monument Lot.
- 44. To see what sum the Town of Colebrook will appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink.
- 45. To see what sum the Town of Colebrook will appropriate for the purchase and installation of Trash Cans.
- 46. To see if the Town will allow the Town Clerk to issue Food Stamps during regular business hours and to see what sum of money the Town will raise for this purpose.
- To see what sum of money the Town will raise to be used by the Colebrook National Bicentennial Executive in the planning for the Towns participation in the celebration during 1976.
- 48. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
- 49. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
- 50. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of painting the Town Hall and to authorize the withdrawal of the amount for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 51. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting for the ensuing year.
- 52. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 53. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$1,031.11 to the White Mountain Association, being .07 cents per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

- 54. To see if the Town of Colebrook will approve a curfew to be instituted immediately, said curfew to be effective at 10:00 P.M. Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and 12:00 midnight Friday and Saturday, for children under 16 years of age, said curfew to be strictly enforced taking into consideration events that may let out after curfew starting time. (Submitted by Petition)
- 55. To elect a public representative from the Town of Colebrook to the Revised Board of Directors of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association for a term of one year.
- 56. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 57. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year.
- 58. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 59. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of the said Town for the year ending December 31, 1974.
- 60. To see if the Town will vote to reimburse Victor Roy for the cost of paving a portion of the Town right of way next to the "Speedy Chef". (Inserted by Request)
- 61. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year 1974 was a busy year for all Town Departments and one in which some projects were completed and others started. The July 1973 flood damage repairs were completed in November and we are awaiting a final audit by the Federal Disaster Relief Office which must be completed before we can receive the final payment from the Federal Government.

The road to the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital was finally paved as was Dumont St. In East Colebrook the road was resurfaced with T.R.A. funds under the direction and control of the State Highway Department. We are hopeful that this method of surface treatment for these country roads will prove to be the best method over the years.

This year saw the completion of the Manchester Manufacturing Inc. new factory on Gould St. and with the completion many new jobs for the areas residents became available. The Water Co. completed its water line extension to the factory site and installation of the line made possible a loop connecting Colby St. and Bridge St.

The Town Hall renovations were completed except for the painting of the outside of the building. William Cummings, the contractor, did a fine job and this building should now serve Colebrook for many years. Rents from the School District and the District Court will pay the outstanding construction debt and the taxpayers will only be asked to raise money to maintain and operate this building. Provisions were made during construction for another floor that would be reached by way of the stairs which originally went to the balcony. The Town was fortunate to obtain Federal Crime Commission funds for the purchase of new courtroom and police department furniture and carpet in the courtroom. The Selectmen would like to acknowledge the very generous gift of furniture from Beecher Falls Manufacturing for the town officers' and town clerk's office.

During 1975 the reevaluation fo real property in the Town will be completed by the State of N.H. Department of Revenue Administration personnel. A tax map of the town will be started using available Federal manpower funds. All the towns will be required to have such a tax map by 1980. By July 1, 1975 the town will have to have a plan ready for changing the present method of solid waste disposal. The Selectmen are investigating alternative methods such as an incinerator or land fill. Townspeople will be asked to consider flood plain zoning at this years town meeting. Town welfare costs continue to be low but with

the uncertainty of the economy 1975 may see a drastic change in this picture.

The Selectmen wish to thank the employees of the Town and all of the citizens for helping to make their jobs easier during 1974.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owend by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occured at any time during the year.

CONNECTICUT VALLEY EFFORT TO SERVE THE CONFINED EFFECTIVELY CONVALESCE

Report of Services Rendered in the Town of Colebrook

CONVALESCE is one of the forty New Hampshire community health agencies whose purpose it is to provide health services to people in their homes, and to help both sick and well people to attain and maintain health.

One of the advantages of a locally controlled health agency is that its services can be developed in response to local needs. Our Board of Trustees is made up of your friends and neighbors, and they are willing to listen to and act upon your suggestions and comments.

Last year our home visiting program served about 25 new patients monthly. A total of 1,148 home visits, providing nursing, physical therapy, personal care, homemaking, and health and welfare information, were done in the town of Colebrook.

Community-wide services included expectant parent's classes which touched the lives of about forty families. These sessions are held in the fall and in the spring, and are open to anyone who is interested.

This spring, immunization clinics will be held for all pre-school children from the age of two months up. We hope to eventually hold these clinics on a monthly basis, and to expand the services offered within this program to include various health screening tests and informational services.

Family planning services are also being planned for, to be available in the spring.

Community services are generally free. Home visiting services are often covered by Medicare, Medicaid, or special state and federal grants, and sometimes by private insurance. Those not covered by these are charged on a sliding fee basis geared to the financial capabilities of each patient. These free or partial fee services result in our dependence on the towns we serve for financial aid. Contributions this year are especially important, as they will help us obtain matching funds to continue and expand homemaker/home health aide services, as well as our maternal and child health services (immunizations program, expectant parent's classes and family planning).

Thank you for your continued support of our activities.

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
