### TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### The Polls will be open from 10:00 A. M. to 6:00 P. M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

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You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday the 2nd of March, next at seven o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant,
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for General Government for the ensuing year including outside fires and interest for short term obligations.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civil Defense for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay on the construction debt of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise towards the support of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Emergency Services.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Care, Removal and/or Replacement of Trees.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.

- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$1,013.00 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event the State will contribute \$6,753.31.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the Business area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise money for same.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks for the ensuing year.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$35,000.00 for Highway and Street Construction and authorize the withdrawal of \$25,156.00 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxes.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive and expend Federal Housing and Urban Development Funds for the improvement and upgrading of the Town's Water System.
- 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase additional land for expansion of the Town's Water Reservoir and to see what sum of money will be raised for such purchase and to further authorize withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,162.00 as the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1976. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the completion of the Tax Map and to authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established

under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of new Parking Meters.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on the principal of the bond issue for Sewerage Facilities.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation and construction of the sewer and water departments and sewer and water storm drain maintenance and direct the sewer and water commissioners to place any unexpended balance in a special fund to be used for the same purpose in later years.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for emergency radio communications for the ensuing year.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 and authorize the transfer of this amount to the Special Reserve Fund known as the Special Dump Fund established at the 1969 Town Meeting and augmented by further appropriation under Article 32 of the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of 1974.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Recreation Commission of five members in accordance with RSA 31:47 to exercise the powers vested in such a commission by RSA 31:44 through 31:50-a inclusive.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hold all future Special Town Meetings during evening and not during daytime hours (inserted by petition).
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to designate the South Hill Road, from Route 145 to the Colebrook-Stewartstown town line, as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 and 18, for the purpose of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of the Town of Colebrok, and further, that the Selectmen of said Colebrook shall, regarding such road designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for

suspension of specifications when making applications to the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways for Town Road Aid Funds under RSA 241:7(1) (inserted by petition).

- 33. To see if the Town will vote to designate the so-called Fish Hatchery Road, from Route 26 to the intersection with South Hill Road, as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 and 18, for the purpose of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of the Town of Colebrook, and further, that the Selectmen of Colebrook shall, regarding such road designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways for Town Road Aid Funds under RSA 241:7 (1) (inserted by petition).
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal of \$7,344.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for the payment of the principal balance of the debt for the Fire Precinct Truck Fund.
- 35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for improvements to the Town Parking Lot and to authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 36. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 37. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 38. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc.
- 39. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Convalesce (submitted by petition).
- 40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 41. To see what sum of money the Town of Colebrook will appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$350.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.
- 43. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the use

of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.

- 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting for the ensuing year.
- 45. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 46. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$1,315.65 to the White Mountain Association, being .07 cents per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 47. To elect a public representative from the Town of Colebrook to the Revised Board of Directors of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association for a term of one year.
- 48. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 49. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year.
- 50. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 51. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1975.
- 52. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# **Report of Forest Fire Service**

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a. m. and 5 p. m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city

Technical assistance with the preparation of town's subdivision regulations, assistance in preparing a grant application for community development funds, assistance with the flood insurance program, and assistance in preparing an application for planning funds for downtown improvement are the local services the North Country Council provided to the town in 1975. NCC staff attended (8) evening meetings with town officials.

On the regional level, the North Country Council prepared a public transportation plan and is working toward the implementation of its recommendations. The Council became the economic development district for northern New Hampshire on July, 1975, and is currently carrying out this function. Several region-wide meetings on Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission regulations, economic development, seminars for planning board members, and recycling of newsprint were sponsored. A recently completed report entitled "The Regulation of Mobile Homes in the Community", prepared by the Council, provides technical information to planning board members and local officials in the area of mobile homes.

In 1975, the Council increased its base of local support from 19 to 29 towns. The Council coordinates its activities with other agencies in order to avoid any possible duplication of effort.

Planning News, the Council's bi-monthly newsletter, disseminates useful information on land use, state legislation, court decisions, and general activities to interested persons in town. A town resident can be placed on the mailing list by contacting the town's NCC representative or the the Council office in Franconia, N. H. (Tel. 823-8108)

In performing its duties, the Council attends approximately 200 night meetings a year.

For the future, continued activity in community planning assistance will be emphasized along with major regional efforts in economic development, land use, and housing. Dissemination of planning information will be continued. The Council is working closely with the NH Public Utilities Commission in the improvement and upgrading of the North Country's rail lines especially the Lincoln line and the North Stratford to Beecher Falls line.

The Council sincerely appreciates and thanks the town for its support and participation. This support has enabled the Council to provide a good deal of local and regional services.

#### NORTHERN COOS COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSOCIATION REPORT OF SERVICES RENDERED

#### IN THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK

Northern Coos Community Health Association is one of the forty New Hampshire Community Health Agencies whose purpose is to provide health services to people in their homes, and to help both sick and well people to attain and maintain health.

One of the advantages of a locally controlled health agency is that its services can be developed in response to local needs. Our Board of Directors is made up of your friends and neighbors and they are willing to listen to and act upon your suggestions and comments.

Last year, our home visiting program served 1,330 patients in Colebrook, providing nursing, physical therapy, personal care, homemaking and health and welfare information to the townspeople.

Community wide services included expectant parent classes which touched the lives of about 25 families. These sessions are held in the fall and in the spring and are open to anyone who is interested

Immunization clinics are held monthly on a rotating basis in Colebrook, Pittsburg, North Stratford and Errol, and we are in hopes of expanding the services offered to include health screening tests and informational services.

Our Family Planning Program offers education, counseling, referrals, and free physical exams and contraceptives for low income people.

Community services are generally free. Home visiting services are often covered by Medicare, Medicaid, or special State and Federal Grants and sometimes by private insurance. Those not covered by these are charged on a sliding fee basis geared to the financial capabilities of each patient. These free or partial fee services result in our dependence on the towns we serve for financial aid. Contributions this year are especially important, as they will help us obtain matching funds to continue and expand Homemaker/Home Health Aide Service as well as our Maternal and Child Health Services, (immunization programs, expectant parent classes and family planning).

Thank you for your continued support of our activities.
