Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

The polls will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 8th of March, next at seven O'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for General Government for the ensuing year including outside fires and interest for short term obligations.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civil Defense for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the support of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Emergency Services.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Care, Removal and/or Replacement of Trees.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents (\$1,029.30) for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V

Highways, in the event the State will contribute six thousand eight hundred sixty-two dollars and two cents (\$6,862.02).

13. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the Business area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Plowing and Sanding Sidewalks for the ensuing year.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand three hundred fifty dollars and twenty cents (\$1,350.20) for the purchase of a Sidewalk Sander.
16. To see if the Town will vote the sum of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) dollars for Highway and Street Construction and authorize the withdrawal of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) dollars for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by Taxes.
17. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount voted from the Parking Meter Fund.
18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$380,000), contingent upon approval by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, for the improvement and upgrading of the Town's water system, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive, and expend Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development funds for this purpose.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, contingent upon approval by the federal Economic Development Administration, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 as amended, for the pupose of improving and upgrading the Town's water system, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive, and expend federal Economic Development Administration funds for said purpose.
20. To see if the Town will vote, contingent upon approval of the Federal Bureau of Outdoor Recreation, to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), for the construction and equipping of a community swimming pool, and to apply against said appropriation funds of one-half the total cost from the Federal Bureau of Outdoor Recreation, Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) from the revenue sharing fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 as amended, and private contributions already made or to be made to the swimming pool fund, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive, and expend said federal

matching funds; provided further, that any portion of said appropriation not actually expended for the construction and equipping of said community swimming pool shall be retained in the swimming pool fund for operation and maintenance of said pool.

21. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$1,255.00) as the Town's share for the operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1977. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.
22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on the principal of the Bond Issue for Sewerage Facilities.
24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation and construction of the sewer and water departments and storm drain maintenance for the ensuing year.
25. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, until directed to the contrary at a subsequent Town Meeting, to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State or other assistance as may be available for the design and construction of improvements to the sewerage and sewerage treatment facilities, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlined in N. H. R. S. A. 33: 7-b et seq., as amended, and pass any vote relating thereto.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00), for the purpose of preparing plans and specifications on sewerage and sewerage treatment facilities which are requirements contained in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U. S. C. 1251 et seq.) and will qualify the Town for Federal Funds, such sum to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds or Notes not to exceed Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Colebrook and to allow the Selectmen to expend such monies as become available from the Federal Government under the Financial Assistance Program of the Construction Grants section of the Federal Water Pollution Control

- Act, as amended (33 U. S. C. 1251 et seq.) and pass any vote relating thereto.
27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
 28. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Emergency Radio Communications for the ensuing year.
 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
 30. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a lease or contract arrangement with Robert Shaw and/or Tillotson Corporation for community waste disposal and to see what sums the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for said purpose.
 31. In the event of a favorable vote on the foregoing article, to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for purchase or lease of equipment and/or construction of a building in connection with said waste disposal arrangements, and authorize withdrawal of all or part of said appropriation from the Dump Fund.
 32. To see if the Town will vote to provide hospital and medical insurance at Town expense for permanent employees of the Town, with said employees to have the option of purchasing additional family coverage at their own expense, and further to see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for said purpose.
 33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for finishing hottopping the Town Parking Lot.
 34. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for construction of a sidewalk through the Monument Lot.
 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) for the purchase of the George Gould Garage and Lot near Brandy Lee Lane.
 36. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
 37. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the purpose of assisting Alpha House, so-called, a place where remedial activities are carried on relative to the health of the bodies and minds of the persons who go there for treatment. (By petition)
 39. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc.
 40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and

appropriate for operating expenses and matching funds for Northern Coos Community Health Association. (Suggested sum by petition, \$5,000.00)

41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Three Hundred Forty-four Dollars (\$7,344.00) for the payment of the principal balance of the debt for the Fire Precinct Truck Fund.
42. To see if the Town will vote the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) toward the purchase of a new Town Plow Truck and authorize the withdrawal of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxes; such funds to be placed in a special Fund for purchase of a new truck in later years.
43. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new police cruiser.
44. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
45. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink.
46. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) for the observance of Memorial Day and the mowing of the Monument Lot.
47. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
48. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the construction of sidewalks in accordance with the vote at the 1951 Town Meeting for the ensuing year.
49. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of Nine Hundred Thirty-nine Dollars and Seventy-five cents (\$939.75) to the White Mountains Region Association, being .05 cents per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of equalized valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
50. To see if the Town will raise the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred Forty Dollars (\$2,240.00) to purchase five hundred feet (500) of four inch (4") hose for the Fire Protection and authorize the withdrawal of Two Thousand Two Hundred Forty Dollars (\$2,240.00) from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, with the balance to be raised by Taxes.
51. To see what action the Town wishes to take as to the use of the

Town Grader for the purpose of plowing snow from the Airport Runway during the winter months.

52. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
53. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from its Social Security plan services performed by election officials or election workers for each calendar Quarter in which the remuneration paid for such services is less than \$50.00.
54. To elect a public representative from the Town of Colebrook to the Revised Board of Directors of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association for a term of one year.
55. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
56. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year.
57. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
58. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1976.
59. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
60. To hold future fire precinct meetings at the same time and place as the town meeting so that future expenditures can be voted on at that time. (By petition)
61. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$851.00 of antirecession fiscal assistance funds authorized by Title II of the Public Works Employment Work Act (P.L. 94-369) for part of salaries expended in training town radio communications personnel.

This Fund was established in 1970 for the purpose of building a new bridge on Pleasant Street. At the 1972 Town Meeting, the Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to use any unexpended monies in the fund for repairing and rebuilding other bridges within the Town. In 1973, \$3,929.07 was applied to the reconstruction cost of Ouimette Bridge over the Mohawk. In 1974, the bridge over the Mohawk at the Washburn farm was rebuilt at a cost of \$5,136.17. During 1975 the final payment for the right of way damage for the Pleasant Street Bridge was made. At the September 11, 1975 Special Town Meeting \$25,000.00 was appropriated for the Town's share of a new bridge over the Mohawk near the Mohawk Campground. Construction will begin during 1976 on this structure which will be a joint Federal, State and Town project with a projected total of \$200,000.00. When this is complete all Town bridges over the Mohawk with one exception will have been completely rebuilt or undergone major rehabilitation within the last few years.

Report of District Fire Chief And Town Forest Fire Warden

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to a three year term.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and in such places as the fire warden deems as safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States for the past 20 years.

REPORT OF SERVICES RENDERED IN THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK

Northern Coos Community Health Association is one of the forty New Hampshire Community Health Agencies whose purpose is to provide health services to people in their homes, and to help both sick and well people to attain and maintain health.

One of the advantages of a locally controlled health agency is that its services can be developed in response to local needs. Our Board of Directors is made up of your friends and neighbors and they are willing to listen to and act upon your suggestions and comments.

Last year, our home visiting program provided 1,039 visits to people in Colebrook, providing NURSING, PHYSICAL THERAPY, PERSONAL CARE, HOME MAKING, and health and welfare information to the townspeople.

Community wide services include:

IMMUNIZATION CLINICS held monthly on a rotating basis in Colebrook, Pittsburg, North Stratford and Errol. We are in hopes of expanding the services offered to include health screening tests and informational services.

EXPECTANT PARENTS CLASSES touched the lives of about 25 families. These sessions are held in the fall and in the spring and are open to anyone who is interested.

FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAM offers education, counselling, referrals, free physical examinations (by your own physician) and contraceptives.

Community Services are generally free. Home visiting services are often covered by Medicare, Medicaid, or special State and Federal Grants, and sometimes by private insurance. Those services not covered are charged on a sliding fee basis geared to the financial capabilities of each patient. These free or partial free services result in our dependence on the towns we serve for financial aid. Contributions this year are especially important as they will help us to obtain matching funds to continue and expand our Homemaker/Home Health Aide service as well as our Maternal and Child Health programs which include immunization clinics, expectant parents classes and family planning program. \$1.00 of local funds enables us to obtain \$3.00 of Federal money for Homemaker/Home Health Aide services and \$1.00 of local funds enables us to obtain \$9.00 of Federal money for the Family Planning Program.

North Country Council, Inc.

The Council assisted the town in its successful effort to secure a \$60,000 grant from the Farmers Home Administration for the acquisition of industrial land, and assisted the town with its application for the HUD community development grant for the water reservoir and water line, and the Local Public Works Act application for the Bridge Street water line. The Council provided information on solid waste, and general planning information to the Planning Board. Council representatives met with local officials on 13 occasions in 1976. The Council has identified the improvement of the Beecher Falls line as a top priority and will be assisting the N. H. Public Utilities Commission in preparing an application for federal EDA funds.

On a regional level, North Country Council, Inc. completed the Overall Economic Development Program, a blueprint for increasing the region's economic potential. The Council assisted several communities in making progress with the development of their Industrial Parks, projects which will benefit residents of adjacent communities. With the passage of the Local Public Works Act of 1976, the Council provided some form of technical assistance to 25 potential grant applicants. A wood utilization project is investigating how forest products, the region's most important natural resource, can be used more advantageously to the region's benefit. Word was received in late 1976 that the Federal Highway Administration approved the Public Transportation Demonstration project.

On a community planning level, in addition to local technical services, the Council prepared a report entitled "Model Subdivision Regulations" as a guide for local planning boards. A series of four lectures on planning board activities was sponsored in the spring; the Council co-sponsored a series of five municipal law lectures in September and October. Both were well attended. "Guidelines for Municipal Tax Mapping" provides communities with information on what to look for when preparing a tax map.

Planning News, the Council's quarterly newsletter, disseminates useful information on community planning, economic development, state legislation, court decisions, and general activities to interested persons in town. A town resident can be placed on the mailing list by contacting the town's NCC representative or the Council office in Franconia, N. H., at 823-8108.

In helping communities with their planning, the Council attends approximately 200 night meetings a year.

In 1977, the Council will continue to provide community planning services to member municipalities. The Council will complete work on a Land Use Program and Housing Program in 1977. Efforts to help communities with economic development will continue. The Council's Economic Development Committee will be investigating

the probable impact of the lessening of energy supplies for the North Country and how the Council can assist through the community and regional planning process.

The Council sincerely appreciates and thanks the town for its support and participation. The support and participation of the town has enabled the Council to provide an impressive package of local and regional services.

Report of Service to the Town of Colebrook — 1976

Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service, Inc. is a non-profit organization governed by an Executive Board composed of Northern Coos County people:

Last year the Agency provided services to 63 Colebrook people for a total of 399 direct service hours on either an out-patient or hospitalized basis. In addition, consultation and testing were provided to the schools to assist them in designing suitable academic programs for individual students.

Starting in January of this year, we have been mandated to provide a 24-hour-7 days a week Emergency Service. There are no special funds for this service.

As in the past, we are asking the towns to help us in maintaining these essential services within our local area.

Report of Recreation Committee

The Colebrook Recreation Committee has held a number of meetings since it was established by the 1976 Town Meeting. Information from other towns with swimming pools has been obtained by correspondence and consultation, and a preliminary engineer's design of an outdoor recreational pool, 25' by 45' in size, has been drawn by Robert Shaw, C. E.

A number of possible sites for the pool, including a parcel of land which Mr. Robert Rainville generously offered to donate, have been considered, and preliminary soil tests taken. The committee has selected a site in the far southwest corner of the Colebrook athletic field, just off Colby Street, as most suitable for the pool.

The Committee has considered the alternatives of "going it alone" by financing the pool entirely with local money, or obtaining one-half the cost in matching funds from the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation. With the cost of the pool estimated at \$100,000, the BOR funding has been decided upon as the only feasible method.

Because pool construction costs are unusually sensitive to inflation (one town setting aside \$5,000 a year found it wasn't quite keeping up), the Committee has reluctantly decided to ask the taxpayers to underwrite this year the balance of the cost of the pool. Besides BOR funds, \$10,000 is being asked from Revenue Sharing, approximately \$16,000 in contributions was already on hand as of February 15, and further contributions are expected. The net tax appropriation of \$20,000 is being asked to enable the Committee to request BOR funds immediately, with the hope that the pool can actually be built in time for use this coming summer.

The Committee wishes to express its appreciation to Mr. Shaw, to the Coos County Soil Conservation Service for assistance with soil surveys, to Mr. Lou Leaver of the Col. Town community house in Lancaster for his time and assistance, and to Mr. John Keach, Recreation Director of the City of Concord, for assisting with the BOR application.

Particular appreciation is extended to Mr. Edward Poulin, who did yeoman work on the pool before the official Committee was formed, and who has assisted as consultant with the work of the Committee.
