The Polls Will Be Open From 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at seven o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the Town of Pittsburg Ambulance.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the purchase of a new typewriter and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,644.21 for a hydraulic sander and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the support of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Emergency Services.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Summer & Winter Roads for the ensuing year and to authorize the Selectmen to apply \$17,120.86 revenue from the State Highway Department with the balance to be raised by taxes.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the General Expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,162.73 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event the State will contribute \$7,751.53.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the Business area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the plowing and sanding of sidewalks for the ensuing year.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,531.74 for Highway and Street Construction and authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend the additional Highway Subsidy funds for Class IV or V Highways for this purpose.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,320.00 as the Town's share for the operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1980. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Emergency Radio Communications for the ensuing year.

- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the principal of the Bond Issue for Sewerage Facilities.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Sanitary Landfill for the ensuing year.
- 25. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 26. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate as a contribution for the services of the Northern Coos Community Health.
- 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Services. (By petition)
- 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Ver-Shire Center UCVMHS. (By petition)
- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrant Services for the ensuing year.
- 31. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and the mowing of the Monument Lot.
- 33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction and repairs of sidewalks.
- 34. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,600.00 for purchase and repair of parking meters and the Town's share for the Summer Cadet and authorize

- the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking meter fund.
- 36. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
- 38. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Colby Street Drainage Project.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) toward the purchase of a new Town Grader and authorize the withdrawal of same from Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, such funds to be placed in Special Equipment Purchasing Fund for purchase of a new grader; and to authorize disbursement of said Fund for such purpose.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, to receive and use all funds or grants as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, Local, or Private agencies.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the purchase of police equipment (blue lights for cruiser-drug kit-camera-repairs to police room) and to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 42. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new backhoe and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, and the balance to be raised by taxes.
- 43. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Selectmen as agents for Special Truck Purchasing Fund, Pistol Permit Fund, Civil Defense Center Construction Fund, Parking Meter Fund, Special Equipment Purchasing Fund, Revenue Sharing Fund, Special Dump Fund and Pleasant Street Bridge Fund.
- 44. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and construction of storm drains for the ensuing year.

- 45. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the White Mountain Regional Association.
- 46. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year.
- 47. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at Public Auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 48. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen for the ensuing year.
- 49. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1979.
- 50. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF DIST. FOREST FIRE CHIEF AND FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.

Gentlemen:

Northern Coos Community Health Association continues to serve a population of 5,756 in the towns of Colebrook, Columbia, Errol, Pittsburg, Stewartstown, Clarksville and Stratford; an area of about 850 square miles. Home visits by Agency personnel provide skilled nursing, personal care, physical therapy and homemaking services to local residents. Efforts are made to restore and maintain health and to keep people independent and in their own homes whenever possible.

Nurses provide expectant parent classes and counseling and assistance to new mothers. Through the Bureau of Maternal Child Health, the Well-Child Program is being expanded. Monthly clinics are offering physicals, immunizations and a wide variety of screening procedures at no cost. Local doctors will be rotating service to the clinics.

Adult blood pressure clinics are held monthly in Stratford and Pittsburg, and twice monthly in Colebrook.

Northern Coos Community Health Association is governed by a Board of Directors made up of members from each community. Representing the Town of Colebrook on the Board are Rev. Leslie Leavitt, Gail Nugent, Secretary/Treasurer; and Janet Hicks.

In Colebrook this year, Agency nurses made 887 skilled nursing visits, 41 visits to new mothers and babies, 166 physical therapy visits and 1,446 visits by homemaker/home health aides. Many preschoolers had physicals and immunizations at our clinics. We encourage you to take advantage of our services in the coming year. We are concerned about your good health.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of Ewen F. Vaughn, Tax Collector of the Town of Colebrook, which was made by this Division in accordance with your request. The examination covered the period from January 1, 1973 to October 4, 1976.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records presented to us by the Tax Collector for examination were limited to the 1976 Cash Receipts Journal and copies of the Tax Collector's reports as reflected in the annual Town Reports.

Blotter books, from which the information needed to prepare the property tax warrants is elicited, were footed and agreed with the total amount committed to the Tax Collector for the years 1972, 1973, 1974 and 1975.

Remittances to the Treasurer as indicated in the accompanying exhibits were verified by reference to the Treasurer's records.

Prior to our arrival, all abatements were effected by a town drawn check to the Tax Collector, and hence are automatically included in the remittances to the Treasurer. Utilization of this method prevents the appearance of abatements in the Collector's reconciliation of warrants at the close of the year. However, the summary of warrants as presented in the annual town reports for the period under audit disclose abatements totaling \$5,093.51, detailed as follows:

Exhibits E, F, G and H (Summaries of Tax Sale Accounts) were prepared from information available in the offices of the Selectmen and the Register of Deeds. Adding machine tapes of 1975 property tax collections, provided by the Town Auditors, were traced to the 1975 blotter book, and payments recorded on the 1976 cash receipts journal were posted to the resulting lists.

Listing of uncollected and unredeemed taxes, showing individual names and amounts, as of October 4, 1976, could be reconstructed only for the following:

Verification of the above uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated on said listings. The return of some of the notices disclosed that a total of \$6,406.39, representing 1975 property taxes, was collected by the Collector but not remitted to the Treasurer.
