STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

The Polls will be Open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at seven o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
3. To see if the Town will instruct it's Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government for the ensuing year including outside fires and short term obligations.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense for the ensuing year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for the purchase of a new plow truck and to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
8. To authorize the Selectmen to sell the 1969 Dodge plow Truck and to use the proceeds of the sale towards the cost of equipment for any truck purchased under Article 7 above.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Ambulance.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate as a contribution for the services of the Northern Coos Community Health.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the support of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Emergency Services.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Ver-Shire Center - UCVHMS. (By Petition)
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Services. (By Petition)
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads for the ensuing year and to authorize the Selectmen to apply \$17,200.98 revenue from the State Highway Department with the balance to be raised by taxes.
15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,154.50 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in the event the State will contribute \$7,696.63.
17. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the Business Area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise and appropriate the money for the same.
18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the plowing and sanding of sidewalks for the ensuing year.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,022.46 for the Highway and Street Construction and authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend the additional Highway Subsidy Funds for Class V and IV Highways for this purpose.
20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for Street Paving and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the Provisions of State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the

sum of \$1,336.00 as the Town's share for the operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1981. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Emergency Radio Communications for the ensuing year.
25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the principal of the Bond Issue for Sewerage Facilities.
26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
27. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) for Toilet Facilities and Communications for the Sanitary Landfill and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Special Dump Fund.
28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Sanitary Landfill for the ensuing year.
29. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
30. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrant Services for the ensuing year.
32. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink.
33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for a Summer Recreation Program and to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a recreation committee, in accordance with RSA 31:47.
34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the

sum of \$500.00 for the observance of Memorial Day and mowing of the Monument Lot.

35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction and repairs of sidewalks.
36. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 for purchase and repair of parking meters for the Summer Cadet and Crosswalk Police, and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund. *Income*
38. To see what action the Town will take towards replacing the iron fence facing the Village Cemetery.
39. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
40. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions RSA 76:152a relative to semi-annual collection of property taxes.
41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, to receive and use all funds or grants as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, Local or Private agencies.
42. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and construction of storm drains for the ensuing year.
43. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the White Mountain Regional Association.
44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be put into the Special Bridge Fund and to authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
45. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent.

46. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year.
47. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at Public Auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any other agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the town.
48. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen for the ensuing year.
49. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1980.
50. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Gentlemen:

It is again with great pride that I present my annual report to the Selectmen and citizens of the Town of Colebrook for the year 1980. It has been a rewarding year for the department in that no major crimes were committed. More formal training was completed by myself as well as some of my men.

Officer Roland Martin completed his eight-weeks of schooling at La-Salle Seminary at Enfield, N.H. last spring and is now a Certified Police Officer in the State of N.H. For almost two years this department was without a Breathalyzer operator and that meant trying to get a physician anytime of day and night to take blood from an individual charged with D.W.I. I attended a Breathalyzer School in October in Enfield, N.H. and now I am a Certified Operator for the Breathalyzer machine. Officer Ronald Streeter was promoted last year to the position of Sergeant.

The two active special officers, Douglas Jordan and Steve Brooks, are in the process of taking their exams to become Certified Special Officers. They have studied many hours on their own time, different aspects of law, with assistance from the rest of the department and our two local State Police Officers. The exam must be completed before the summer of 1981. Legislation was passed a while ago, and it is now mandatory that Special Officers be certified.

I attended the N.H. Chiefs of Police Convention at the Balsams last June, as a participating member. It was useful to me, attending the seminars and also getting to meet the different Chiefs from around the State, some of whom I have had contact with during the year.

Our court load was larger this year than last, due to the fact that more man hours were employed and more violators were apprehended. All parking meter fines have been paid to date, due to the updated system, through the help of our office personnel and our Micro-Fiche machine.

I would like to thank the Selectmen for their help and guidance throughout the year, the assistance of Trooper John Barthelmes, Trooper Howard Weber, Deputy Sheriff Thomas Pryor, the citizens of Colebrook, and especially the men in my department. It has been a banner year for the Colebrook Police Department and the Town of Colebrook.

With the present spirit of cooperation, I have the confidence that 1981 will be another successful year for law enforcement in Colebrook.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FOREST FIRE CHIEF AND FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest Fire Prevention: Your Business, Our Business, Good Business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

Board of Selectmen
Town of Colebrook
Colebrook, N.H. 03576

Members of the Board:

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and account groups of the Town of Colebrook for the year ended December 31, 1979 and have issued our report thereon, dated January 15, 1980. As part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of such evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance thereon in determining the nature, timing and extent of other such auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements. Such study and evaluation disclosed the following conditions that we believe to be material weaknesses.

Timely Closing of Town Books

During our examination, we noted that the books of several departments, notably the water and sewer departments and the district court, were not closed on a timely basis. Sound business practice requires a clean cut-off and prompt closing of bookkeeping activity annually. We urge that all town books be closed on a timely basis as of December 31 of each year.

Budget Preparation

For 1979, appropriations for outside fires and tax anticipation note interest were inadvertently omitted from the annual budget. Due to an error in the 1979 tax rate, these omissions had no material effect on the Town's financial condition. We recommend that the selectmen develop controls which will insure that all necessary appropriations are presented to the Town meeting. We also recommend that the selectmen adopt procedures that will insure a review of the tax rate for accuracy before the billing process is undertaken.

Tax Collector-Remittance of Cash Receipts and Reports

Our examination revealed that the Tax Collector did not turn over tax receipts to the Town treasurer on a timely basis as required by New Hampshire R.S.A. 41:35. This practice deprives the Town of its projected cash flow, resulting in possible additional borrowing costs and maximizes the Town's exposure to loss by theft and accidental destruction. We recommend that the Tax Collector deposit directly to

the Town account on a weekly basis as prescribed by Statute and more frequently if the volume of cash receipts necessitates. We also noted that the tax collector prepared annual reports without reconciling uncollected taxes to the books which necessitated a \$10,000.00 adjustment to January 1, 1979 fund balance. New Hampshire R.S.A. 41:35 states that upon written request the tax collector shall provide selectmen with an itemized list of the uncollected taxes at year end. We recommend that the selectmen annually request an uncollected tax listing and reconcile the lists with the tax collector's report.

Special Revenue Funds and Capital Reserve Statute

We noted that over the years the Town has created numerous special funds for various purposes. Many of these funds would seem to cost more to administer and control than their annual revenue. Others are for future capital outlay and must under state statute be in the custody of the Town Trustees of Trust Funds. We recommend that the Town review its special revenue funds and turn over to the Trustee of Trust Funds the capital reserve funds and consider the termination or consolidation of many of the other special funds.

Water and Sewer Commissioners

Custody of Funds - Under the current organizational structure in Colebrook, the Water and Sewer Commissioners have custody of their respective funds. This practice is not consistent with State Law (RSA 41:29) which requires that the Town treasurer hold these funds. We recommend that all water and sewer funds immediately be turned over to the Town treasurer.

Sewer Billings - New Hampshire RSA 252:13 requires that in order for sewer rentals to be subject to the same liabilities as taxes, they must be committed to and collected by the tax collector. This is not the current practice in the Town and we recommend that all future sewer charges be committed to and collected by the tax collector.

Water Billings - Our tests of the Colebrook Water Works billing procedures revealed the following: (1) Water Route Books for the reading of meters did not consistently maintain account numbers. (2) Billings were frequently adjusted without formal approval of the Water Commissioners. (3) No controls appeared to be in effect to insure that amounts due as determined by the meter reading were those billed the customer. The Water Commissioners have neither aged their accounts receivable nor established a reserve for possible uncollectible accounts. In light of the fact that both the Water and Sewer Departments rely on water meter readings for their revenue, we recommend that the water and sewer commissioners review the entire billing process as soon as is practical and restructure the process under sound business management practices.

Sewer Fund Deficit - Under the current Colebrook Sewer Commission rate structure, the 1979 Sewer revenues were inadequate to

cover operating costs. The accumulated deficit at December 31, 1979 of approximately \$110,000 suggests that historically the rates have been inadequate. Ultimately the deficits may have to be funded through taxation. We recommend that the Sewer Commissioners and the Selectmen jointly review this potential problem and take appropriate action.

Trust Funds

We noted that current reports by the Colebrook Trustees of Trust Funds have not been published in the annual Town report for several years. New Hampshire RSA 31:33 requires that the audited report of the Trustees be printed in the Town report. Currently approximately 65% of the Trust Funds are accounted for on a different fiscal year than the rest of the town. While this presents no material difference in reporting it does involve accounting and therefore managerial problems for the Cemetery Commission. We recognize that the Trustees are in the process of upgrading their accounting and reporting practices and urge that they continue their efforts in order to comply with state law, facilitate cemetery management, and report to the Town on a timely basis.

District Court

Our examination of the District Court revealed that cash receipts were undeposited for periods of time exceeding two months, monies due the Town were not paid over for as much as six months and that the books were not posted for like amounts of time. During 1979 the District Court was in the process of implementing a new accounting system mandated by the State Administrative Committee of the District and Municipal Courts. While we recognize that a period of transition can be difficult for operating staff, we do not feel that it warrants the subordination of such basic business procedures as depositing cash receipts, posting books, or paying bills on a timely basis. We recommend that the court thoroughly review its established practices and restructure them along efficient lines. It is our understanding that the Administrative Committee of the District and Municipal Courts is available to assist in these areas.

Inventory of Fixed Assets

As is the practice with many New Hampshire municipalities, the Town has not maintained a record of its fixed assets. In order to adequately maintain control of its existing fixed assets, we recommend the Town conduct an inventory of these assets as soon as is practical. As part of their long-term policies, Town Officials should initiate fixed asset records. Cost or consideration given is the generally accepted method for valuing fixed assets, and should be recorded on all new acquisitions. Where adequate documentation of cost is unavailable for existing fixed assets, an estimate of original cost is an acceptable standard under accounting principals for governmental entities. The existance of fixed asset records will not only aid Town Officials in their control of these assets, but should be an invaluable tool in long range planning.

Property Record System

Our tests of the taxable property records revealed that the Town had an unusually well developed system for a municipality of its size. We feel, however, that the addition of current use data to the property record files would facilitate annual preparation of the tax warrant under either manual or machine production.

Other

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgment by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgement, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect either to the execution and recording of transactions or with respect to the estimates and judgments required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control for the year ended December 31, 1979, which was set forth in the first paragraph, would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system.

Publication Requirement

The provisions of RSA 71-A:21 require that only this letter be published in the next annual Town Report.

However, we suggest that you consider the publication of the entire report, which includes auditor's opinion, financial statements and notes to financial statements. No portion of either the auditor's opinion, financial statements or notes to financial statements may be published separately.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town of Colebrook for their assistance during the course of our audit.
