TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at seven o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
- To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government for the ensuing year including outside fires and interest for short term obligations.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Emergency Radio Communications for the ensuing year.
- 6. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 7. To vote by ballot on the following questions:
 - 1. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment would establish minimum front, side and rear property line setbacks. It would also change the word "building" to "structure" and provide a definition thereof.

2. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment would change the building permit application fee and require permits to be posted on site.

3. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment would insert the word "junkyard", provide a definition thereof, and regulate their placement.

4. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 4 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment would establish a height restriction of structures; excluding communication towers, antennas, etc.

5. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 5 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

This amendment establishes new regulations as to the size, location, construction, and manner of display of signs.

- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) from the Town Hall Repair Fund and expend the same for a ramp and front doors for the handicapped at the Town Hall.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to remove parking meters from the business area permanently.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Control of Stray Dogs in the community for the ensuing year, pursuant to the provisions of RSA 466:30a as heretofore adopted by said Town.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00) for the purchase of portable radios for the Police Department, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw and apply said sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00) to be paid into the Equipment Purchasing Fund established by the 1986 Town Meeting, Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) of which is to be deposited toward the cost of a new Police Cruiser.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and ap-

propriate for the maintenance and expenses of Highways for the ensuing year and to authorize the Selectmen to apply Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) revenue from the State Highway Block Grant allotted under RSA 235:23 as amended.

- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars for Street and Road Paving and to authorize the Selectmen to use Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) from the State Highway Block Grant allotted under RSA 235:23 as amended, the balance to be raised by taxation.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Five Dollars (\$24,995.00) for repairs and renovations of Shore Road and to authorize the Selectmen to use Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and Ninety-Four Cents(\$20,766.94) from the State Highway Block Grant allotted under RSA 235:23 as amended, the balance to be raised by taxation.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the areas to be cleared, and to raise and appropriate money for same.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Plowing and Sanding of Sidewalks for the ensuing year.
- 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Cleaning Streets in the business area this summer and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the Construction and Repairs of Sidewalks and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw and apply said sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) for the purchase of a new Plow Truck, and apply to said appropriation:
 - (a) the sum of Thirty-One Thousand Dollars (\$31,000.00) to be withdrawn from the Equipment Purchasing Fund, and
 - (b) the balance of any funds available from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972;

the balance of said appropriation, if any, to be raised by taxation.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of

Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for Care of Trees, including the removal of dead or diseased trees.

- To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to RSA 35:1 (III) to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for financing all or part of the costs of future reappraisal of the real estate in said Town for tax assessment purposes.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to fill the office of Tax Collector by appointing a suitable person to said office, instead of filling said office by election. (RSA 669:17)
- 26. To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to RSA 231:62, to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Road Agent.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to RSA 35:16-2, to discontinue the Capital Reserve Fund established at the 1965 Town Meeting and known as the Civil Defense Center Construction Fund, and authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay all monies in said fund to the Town Treasurer.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Sanitary Landfill for the ensuing year.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$46,000.00) to purchase a new Crawler-Loader, to withdraw and apply to said appropriation the sum of Thirty-One Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Seven Dollars and Seventy-Six Cents (\$31,237.76) from the Colebrook Dump Equipment Reserve Fund established by the 1985 Town Meeting, and to defray the balance of said appropriation from funds budgeted for the maintenance of the Sanitary Landfill.
- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to establish a general cemetery maintenance fund pursuant to the provisions of NHRSA 31:19-a, the fund to be held and administered by the Trustees of Trust Funds for the Town of Colebrook and the income to be expended for the general maintenance of the public cemeteries in the Town of Colebrook.
- 32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.

- 33. To see if the Town will vote to have the Tax Collector collect the Property Taxes on a semi- annual basis as provided in RSA 76, 15-A.
- 34. Do you favor adoption of the Town Manager Plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated?
- 35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Manager for the ensuing year (Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00) Six (6) months) Twenty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) year.
- 36. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:37 for the exemption for the blind from property taxes? This statute provides that every inhabitant who is legally blind shall be exempt each year from the property tax on a residence to the value of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00) for repairs of Parking Meters, Crosswalk Police and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this amount from the Parking Meter Fund.
- 38. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 39. In the event that the foregoing Article #34, the Town Manager Plan, shall have failed to pass, to see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen to appoint an Administrative Assistant, and to see what sum the voters will raise and appropriate for the compensation of such Administrative Assistant.
- 40. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expenses of the Colebrook Water Works.
- To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expenses of the Colebrook Sewerage Facilities.
- 42. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to buy options on real property for a new well site, such options to be under such terms and conditions as the Sewer and Water Commissioners may in their discretion determine to be in the best interest of the Town.
- 43. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the purchase and installation of two (2) Aerators for the Sewerage Lagoons.
- 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars (\$1,774.00) as the Town's share for the operating expenses of the North Country Council for one (1) year, beginning July 1st, 1987. These funds

will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, state and federal agencies and other programs of the council. These funds may be used in conjunction with state and federal funds for planning purposes.

- 45. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the support of the Upper Connecticut Valley Emergency Services.
- 46. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operating expenses of Ambulance District A-1.
- 47. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate as a contribution for the services of the Northern Coos Community Health.
- 48. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1,260.00) for support of the Community Action Outreach Program. (By Petition)
- 49. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service. (By Petition)
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of Ver-Shire Center -UCVMHS. (By Petition)
- 51. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Planning Board for the ensuing year.
- 52. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Colebrook Skating Rink.
- 53. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrant Services for the ensuing year.
- 54. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and construction of Storm Drains for the ensuing year.
- 55. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the principal of the Bond Issue for Sewerage Facilities.
- 56. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, to receive and use all funds or grants as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from federal, state, local or private agencies in accordance with RSA 31:95-b.

- 57. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year.
- 58. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds, or owned by the Town or any agency thereof, and until such sale is made, to administer the property in the best interest of the Town.
- 59. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to non-profit organizations, including heat, lights, and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interest of the Town and at the discretion of the Selectmen, for the ensuing year.
- 60. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1986.
- 61. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

I have issued 2,520 motor vehicle permits amounting to the sum of \$133,337.00.

The sum of \$1,036.20 were paid to me on 253 dog licenses.

I have received \$16.00 in filing fees, \$37.00 in bicycle licenses, \$60.00 in check lists sold, \$20.00 in bad check collection fees, and \$390.00 in marriage licenses.

A total of \$134,896.20 were deposited with the Town Treasurer.

TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

Board of Selectmen Town of Colebrook Colebrook, New Hampshire 03576

Members of the Board:

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and accountgroups of the Town of Colebrook for the year ended December 31, 1985 and have issued our report thereon, dated June 1, 1986. As part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of such evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance thereon in determining the nature, timing and extents of other such auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements. Such study and evaluation disclosed the following condition that should be corrected in order to improve the Town's internal control system. Our following remarks are being made in the hope that they will improve existing procedures and are in no way a criticism of Town Personnel.

1. EXTREMELY POOR INTERNAL CONTROL IN WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENTS

The existing appointed water and sewer tax collector is responsible for computing the water and sewer bills, collecting and recording payments, maintaining all accounts receivable records and General Ledger. The water and sewer tax collector also prepares all bills for payment and reconciles the bank statements.

RECOMMENDATION

In order to introduce better internal control into the Water and Sewer Departments, more segregation of duties is needed; in other words, one person should not be doing all the billing, cash collecting and recordkeeping functions.

Someone other than Ms. Stone should be preparing the water and sewer bills, if she is involved in their collection.

The Water and Sewer Commissioner should prepare formal warrants for the collection of all water and sewer bills. The backup for Water Department customer deposits of appro-

The backup for Water Department customer deposits of approximately \$19,000.00 is inadequate. The Water Commissioner should insist on an alphabetical listing of all customer deposits at year-end and a reconciliation between years.

2. ELIMINATION OF IMMATERIAL SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

We noted that over the years the Town has created numerous special funds for various purposes. Many of these funds would seem to cost more to administer and control than their annual revenue. We recommend that the Town review its special revenue funds and consider the termination or consolidation of many of the special funds, such as, the Town Hall Repair Fund, Police Department Fund and the Parking Meter Fund. These funds could easily be included in the Town's Budget, and processed through the Town's regular checking account (Town General Fund).

3. INCONSISTENCIES IN PREPARATION OF BUDGET

Rental income of the Town Hall paid by the School District is included in the General Fund Revenue Budget. However, the rent is received by the Town Hall Repair Fund, who pays the annual debt service of \$4,800.00. The revenue is budgeted for the General Fund but the debt service expenditure is not. This results in a revenue shortfall for the General Fund.

RECOMMENDATION

The Town should either budget the expenditures as well as the revenue or consider simplifying the whole process by closing the Town Hall Repair Fund, and receive, expend and budget the rental income and debt service payments in the General Fund.

4. CIVIL DEFENSE CENTER CHECKING ACCOUNT

The checking account, which amounts to \$1,015.17 is in the hands of the Civil Defense Director. The money belongs to the Town of Colebrook and properly belongs in the custody of the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

5. CIVIL DEFENSE CENTER CONSTRUCTION FUND OF \$8,554.64

This account was created in 1969 to build a bomb shelter.

RECOMMENDATION

As the probability of using this money for its stated purpose is quite remote. The next Town Meeting should vote to either return the money to the Town or transfer the monies to another Capital Reserve Fund.

OTHER

The objective of internal control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgement by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgement, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect either to the execution and recording of transactions or with respect to the estimates and judgements required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control for the year ended December 31, 1985, which was set forth in the first paragraph, would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system.

PUBLICATION REQUIREMENT

The provisions of RSA 71-A:21 require that only this letter be published in the next annual Town report.

However, we suggest that you consider the publication of the entire report, which included auditor's opinion, financial statements and notes to financial statements.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town of Colebrook for their assistance during the course of our audit.

During the year Officer Jeffrey E. Cauller resigned for personal reasons, part-time positions were filled by the return of Officer Roger W. Pond, Sr. and the hiring of Officer Anna C. Reid.

Officer Reid graduated from the New Hampshire Police Academy in October 1980 and worked for the Wakefield Police Department before coming to the Colebrook area. Anna is also qualified as a juvenile officer which will be an asset to the community.

We are pleased to announce that our juvenile case-load has decreased, and we have had better cooperation from parents in dealing with these matters. We also hope that this relationship continues in the future.

In other activities for the year, Criminal investigations were increased expending more than normal man-hours. Examples are the two recent burglaries, Lavigne and Kelsea, which resulted in arrests in both cases.

Under Motor Vehicle activities there were more DWI arrests and prosecutions with many spending time in jail due to penalties being more severe. In the Accident catagory investigations were conducted on one fatality and an increase of normal accidents with property damage.

Child Abuse cases reported are consuming many man-hours investigating and processing of those cases that are found true. This is accomplished with coordination with the Division of Children and Youth Services. I would like to extend a large thanks to the men and women of this department, the Selectmen for their experienced guidance, and for the assistance of State Troopers Howard Weber, Charles West and Tom Yorke, along with other law enforcement agencies surrounding our area. Our thanks also goes out to the Colebrook Dispatchers, North Country Re-act Team, Fire Department and all other agencies to numerous to mention. A special thanks is extended to the Citizens of Colebrook for their continued support of this department.

With the influx of new people and business here in the North Country, it is our sincere hope that we can handle growth in the future as well as we have in the past.

COLEBROOK PUBLIC LIBRARY

Public libraries are to provide information, recreation, education, and inspiration, but not necessarily in that order. When you come through the door at the Colebrook Public Library, you have over 12,000 adult and children's books for people in this area to borrow. Among the other materials we have for loan are records, puppets, puzzles, patterns, pamphlets, and over 60 kinds of magazines. We also have access to thousands of other books through the New Hampshire State Interlibrary Loan System.

We are constantly trying to improve our services. Last year several hundred books and other materials were added to our collection. Several different kinds of programs were offered. Some of these were:

A preschool story and activity hour from January to May and another program in December.

Five reading-discussion programs titled "Let's Talk About It, Being Ethnic Becoming American" sponsored by our library, the New Hampshire State Library and funded by The New Hampshire Council for the Humanities. Several craft programs including one on growing and drying flowers for potpourri, ways to use them, and one on making various kinds of wreaths. A lecture by Audrey Noyes titled "A Profile of Colebrook".

During July and August a summer reading program "Treasures to Enjoy" for children in the first to sixth grades.

Nancy Dodge lectured twice on genealogy.

The Colebrook Arts Group and the library sponsored a marionnette show and the library sponsored "The Little Red Wagon" puppet show.

The first three of four reading-discussion programs "Rural and Small Town America" was held in late fall and funded by The New Hampshire Council for the Humanities.

All these programs were very well attended, and excellent speakers and volunteers helped to make them entertaining and educational.

Proceeds from a book sale held on July 3, an afghan donated by Sylvia Collins, and from other sales and donations were used to purchase a copier. This copier has proved very useful to us and our patrons. A four-drawer file was also purchased for our pamphlets, etc.

From the Frances Hughes Memorial Fund we bought an addition to our card file and ordered a new case for our New Hampshire and reference material.

Rosalie Sweatt and Barbara LaPerle are taking Library Technique courses at the Twin Mountain Office of the New Hampshire State Library.

In order to meet New Hampshire Public Library Standards, all librarians who do not have a masters degree in library science are required to take and successfully complete the required courses within six years.

The staff, the trustees, and I would like to thank the town, the volunteers, and all our patrons for their continued support. We always welcome suggestions and comments. Your input as well as your support will insure that the Colebrook Public Library continue to provide quality services and programs for the people in this area.

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL

ANNUAL REPORT

Calendar year 1986 was a busy and productive year for the North Country Council as it continued to provide a wide range of assistance to towns and cities in the North Country.

The Council is a regional non-profit, public agency chartered under NH RSA 36:45 and is responsible for providing its member communities assistance in local community planning, economic development, solid waste, transportation, and various other community services. Besides the direct assistance the Council provides each member community, it is an advocate for all North Country towns in legislative and funding issues at the state and federal governments.

Growth and development is no longer unique to southern New Hampshire; North Country towns are experiencing similar growth pressures. The Council recognizes the impacts associated with this development to schools, roads, waste disposal, water, etc. The Council is dedicated to assisting town officials with these complicated issues. Because most of the Council member towns do not have a staff of their own to do the research, answer the questions and respond to incoming requests, the Council has revised the way we help member towns. Now, each town has a staff person assigned to assist the local officials of that town with their daily needs. In this way, the Council serves its membership more efficiently.

In Colebrook NCC provided technical assistance to the Planning Board on Master Planning, Zoning Amendments, Subdivision Regulations, and Site-Plan Review. We also administered the Town's Housing Improvement Program, and provided road standards. The Council helped the Town with several economic activities including development of a Community Profile to be used for industrial development promotion, in cooperation with the Colebrook Industrial Development Corporation. We also coordinated the development of a regional industrial promotion program aimed at creating manufacturing jobs in Colebrook and the region.

Economic Development is an improtant part of the Council's overall agency mission. This year the Council developed two marketing products: a regional brochure promoting the region and community profiles which the ten growth communities in the region are using to market their industrial development potential. The Council also produced a series of magazine advertisements, along with a display at the Eastern States Exposition, promoting the North Country as the sensible place to do business. The Council is now developing a workshop series on industrial development marketing for local officials in the region who are actively seeking economic development. This past summer the Council co-sponsored the very successful North Country legislative tour. Over 285 legislators and their guests toured the North Country getting a glimpse of the life, economy, and culture that makes our region unique. A follow-up legislative reception was held in December to develop a legislative agenda for 1987. The tour and reception should have future beneficial legislative impact to the North Country.

The Council again provided information and guidance to several towns on federal and state grant and loan programs. This past year saw the Council administer over \$3.0 million in Community Development Block Grant Funds. The funds cover such activities as housing rehabilitation, downtown revitalization, business revolving loan funds, and housing rehabilitation feasibility studies.

Community planning assistance has emphasized master planning and improvement in local land use controls. New state mandates and commercial and residential growth in several towns have created busy work loads for planning boards. The Council's assistance takes many forms: regional workshops, newsletters, regulation review and update, and assistance on a regular or onetime basis for subdivision and site plan applications.

The Council again co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture series with the NH Municipal Association. The Law Lecture this year covered such topics as local planning board procedures, administration and enforcement of ordinances and review of recent court cases and state law changes regarding local land use planning.

Overall, the Council's major objective is to work with North Country towns in solving local and regional problems. We rely on and appreciate the involvement of town officials and residents and look forward to assisting your town this coming year.

It was voted to authorize the Wardens to close the present Truck Fund Savings Account established pursuant to Article 14 of the Warrant for the Annual Fire Precinct Meeting of March 29, 1932 by authorizing the Wardens to close out said account and establish a Trust Fund therefrom; this Trust shall be an expendable trust established pursuant to New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 31:19a, and the Wardens were appointed as agents to expend sums from the Trust Fund when an appropriation exists.
