To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, gualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at 6:00 in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town to be elected by ballot for the Town of Officers Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.
- 3. To vote by ballot on the following question:

Shall we adopt an exemption for the totally and permanently disabled?

The exemption, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be \$5,000.00. To qualify, the person must have been a New hampshire resident for at least 5 years and own and occupy the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by a spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$5,000.00; if single, \$6,000.00 if married and own net assets not in excess of \$35,000.00 excluding the value of their person's residence. Per RSA 72:37-b & c.

4. To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law. (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for a property valuation update and to authorize the selectmen to withdraw \$12,252.75 plus interest from the Town of Colebrook Property Reappraisal Fund and the remainder to be raised through taxation. 21. Shall the Town accept the provisions of RSA 202-A:4-c providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the public library trustees to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the town meeting, unanticipated money from a state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year. - 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to appoint a Deputy Treasurer. Said Deputy will be sworn, shall have the powers of the treasurer, and may be removed at the pleasure of the Treasurer per RSA 41:29-a. (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to change the name of the Bean Bridge Capital Reserve Fund to the Town of Colebrook Bridge Fund and to appoint the Selectmen as agents to expend from the Fund.

- 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property which may be offered to the town for any public purpose, pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting any such gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the town to raise, appropriate or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of any such personal property until rescinded. (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed. Such conveyance shall be by deed following a public auction, or the property may be sold by advertised sealed bids, or may be otherwise disposed of as justice may require, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Until rescinded (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).

- 32. To see if the town will vote to authorize the board of selectmen to accept, on behalf of the town, gifts, legacies, and devises made to the town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by RSA 31:19. (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).
- 33. Shall the town accept the provision of RSA 33:7 providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes? (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1993. (The Selectmen recommend this article pass).
- 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

IN PLANNING AND PERFORMING OUR AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1992 WE CONSIDERED THE TOWN'S INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE TO DETERMINE OUR AUDITING PROCEDURES FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPRESSING AN OPINION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND NOT TO PROVIDE ASSURANCE OF THE INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE.

OUR FOLLOWING REMARKS ARE BEING MADE IN THE HOPE THAT THEY WILL IMPROVE EXISTING PROCEDURES AND ARE IN NO WAY A CRITICISM OF TOWN PERSONNEL.

UTILIZATION OF COMPUTER SYSTEM

TOWN PERSONNEL ARE MAKING SOLID PROGRESS IN CONVERTING EXISTING MANUAL SYSTEMS TO COMPUTERIZED SYSTEMS.

WE EXTEND OUR THANKS TO THE OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE DURING THE COURSE OF OUR AUDIT.

IT IS OUR OPINION THAT THE SELECTMEN, TOWN MANAGER AND STAFF ARE DOING AN EXCELLENT JOB ADMINISTERING THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK.

A FEASIBILITY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FOR A SECONDARY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM WAS APPLIED FOR AND AWARDED TO THE TOWN IN THE AMOUNT OF \$11,000.00.

ANOTHER CDBG IS BEING WORKED ON FOR \$700,000.00 TO BE RECEIVED OVER A TWO YEAR PERIOD TO HELP INSTALL THE SECONDARY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM.

THROUGH A SUMMER SCHOOL WORK PROGRAM WE WERE ABLE TO HAVE THE AREA ALONG THE ROAD SIDE TO THE LANDFILL CLEARED, THE WATER SHED BUILDINGS PAINTED AND HELP WITH MAINTAINING THE CEMETERY GROUNDS. I HOPE THE PROGRAM WILL BE IN EFFECT THIS COMING SUMMER TO ASSIST WITH OTHER PROJECTS.

AN APPLICATION FOR A JOB CORP GRANT WAS PROCESSED AND AWARDED TO THE TOWN IN THE AMOUNT OF \$277,000.00 AND WITH THIS MONEY WE WILL BE ABLE TO HELP THIS GROUP OF YOUNG MEM AND WOMEN COMPLETE THEIR EDUCATION WHILE RENDERING SERVICES TO HELP BENEFIT THE TOWN AND OTHER MON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS.

A TRANSFER STATION PERMIT WAS APPLIED FOR AND GRANTED BY THE STATE. THE STATION WAS CONSTRUCTED WITH THE MAJORITY OF THE WORK BEING DONE BY TOWN EMPLOYEES AND IS FULLY OPERATIONAL WITH GREAT SUCCESS AND IS PROVING TO BE MUCH MORE ECONOMICAL TO RUN THAN THE SANITARY LANDFILL.

NEGOTIATIONS WITH JAMES RIVER LED TO A CONTRACT COMING THROUGH WITH A FIGURE OF \$14.62 PER TON COMPARED TO \$65.00 PER TON AT SANCO FOR HOUSEHOLD REFUSE. DEMOLITION DEBRIS, FURNITURE ETC, HAS TO BE TRANSPORTED TO SANCO AT \$120.00 PER TON. A HAULING CONTRACT WAS NEGOTIATED AND AWARDED TO NORMANDEAU TRUCKING, TO HAUL RUBBISH FROM THE TRANSFER STATION TO JAMES RIVER AND SANCO. EACH LOAD COST \$185.00 PER AND WE AVERAGE ONE A WEEK.

A TRAILER TO HAUL OUR NEWSPAPER ETC. TO THE RECYCLING CENTER IN STEWARTSTOWN WAS CONSTRUCTED BY TOWN EMPLOYEES AND WILL SAVE THE \$100.00 A MONTH RENTAL FEE WE HAVE BEEN PAYING COOS COUNTY.

I HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL, INC. TO OBTAIN A \$3,000.00 GRANT FOR THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, ROAD SURFACE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (RSMS) FOR 1994. WE WILL DOCUMENT CONDITIONS OF ALL TOWN ROADS, NECESSARY IMPROVEMENTS WITH ASSOCIATED COSTS AND PRIORITIZED LISTING OF ALL ROAD REPAIRS.

WHEN THE TAX RATE WAS SET I WAS ABLE TO USE \$60,000.00 IN SURPLUS (MONIES SAVED OVER THE YEAR'S ON UNEXPENDED FUNDS) TO HELP REDUCE THE TAX RATE. EARLY MAILING OF THE TAX BILLS HELPED TO REDUCE THE RATE OF BORROWING MONEY, AND WE WERE ABLE TO PAY OUTSTANDING NOTES AND DID NOT HAVE TO BORROW AGAIN ALLOWING THE TOWN TO GO INTO THE NEW YEAR WITH NO DEBT.

ON DECEMBER 20, 1993 A MEETING IN CONCORD MADE US AWARE OF THE POSSIBILITY OF OUR LANDFILL HAVING TO BE CLOSED AND COMPLETELY CAPPED BY OCTOBER 31, 1994. I CONTACTED BOTH SENATOR GREGG'S AND CONGRESSMAN SWEAT'S OFFICES TO REQUEST THEIR SUPPORT IN OVERRIDING THIS EPA RULING.

IN CLOSING MAY I EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION TO THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN FOR THEIR CONTINUED LEADERSHIP, TOWN OFFICERS, DEPARTMENT HEADS AND EMPLOYEES FOR THEIR DEDICATED SERVICES AND THE CITIZENS FOR THEIR COOPERATION.

- Article 1 Officers elected by ballot from 10:00 am to 7:00 p.m.
- Article 2 To act upon all of the following articles contained in the warrant.
- Article 3 To vote by ballot on the following guestion:

Bo you favor the continuation of the Town Manager plan as enforced by this town?

Pursuant to RSA 37:13 ballot to be prepared according to RSA 37:15 (by petition) 258 yes and 256 no ballots were counted three times. A recount was requested by petition, persons present were Donald Gilbert, Milton Adair, Fred King, Solange Hebert and Haven Haynes Jr. the recount stayed the same 258 yes and 256 no.

- Article 4 Motion made by Granvyl Hulse and seconded by William Gifford to instruct the Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as requested by law, Voice vote and passed,
- Article 5 To vote by ballot on the following questions:

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

Amendment 1. To remove article IV, 6, A. sentence-The permit application fee shall be ten dollars for single family, residential structures and twenty five dollars for multi-family, commercial, and industrial structures. To replace article IV,6, A, sentence-The permit application fee shall be as set forth in the Colebrook Planning Board fee schedule.

Ballot vote 295 yes and 226 no.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

Amendment 2. To remove article IV, 12, C. The Board of Selectmen or their designee, upon well founded information of any violation, is hereby authorized to initiate immediate steps for enforcement of this ordinance by issuing due notice to stop and desist such violation and/or to be subject upon conviction of ten dollars for each day violation continues.

To replace article IV, 12, C. The board of selectmen or their designee, upon well founded information of any violation, is hereby authorized to initiate immediate steps for enforcement of this ordinance by issuing due notice to stop and desist such violation and/or to be subject upon conviction to penalties up to the maximum allowed by state statue.

Ballot vote 344 yes and 162 no.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

Amendment 3. To have a new paragraph added to article IV, 12, F. as follows: If the permit applicant is the Town of Colebrook or a department or a subdivision thereof, and the Town of Colebrook would be responsible for paying the fee, the Colebrook Planning Board may waive such fee.

Ballot vote 367 yes and 145 no.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 4 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board? Amendment 4. To remove article VI, 3. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to enforce the provisions of this ordinance; upon any well-founded information that this ordinance is being violated the said Planning Board shall, on its own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this ordinance by seeking an injunction against said violation or by other means.

To replace article VI, 3. It shall be the duty of the Board of Selectmen to enforce the provisions of this ordinance; upon any well-founded information that this ordinance is being violated the said Board of Selectmen shall, on its own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this ordinance by seeking injunction against said violation or by other legal means.

Ballot vote 378 yes and 122 no.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 5 to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?

Amendment 5. To remove article IX, sentence-This shall not limit the right of the Planning Board to enforce such state statutes and regulations as might apply to such violation.

To replace article IX, sentence-This shall not limit the right of the Board of Selectmen to enforce such state statutes and regulations as might apply to such violations.

Ballot vote 367 yes and 128 no.

- Article 6 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Parker Hicks to raise the sum of \$239,690.00 for General Government for the ensuing year. A motion was made by Phillip Dauphanias and seconded by Granvyl Hulse to reduce the General Government Budget by a total of 5%, standing vote 169 yes and 71 no, amendment carried and the sum to be voted on is now \$227,705.50, which passed with a voice vote.
- Article 7 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Scott Phillips to raise and appropriate \$185,577.61 for the Public Safety for the ensuing year. Voice vote passed.

- Article 8 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 to be added to the existing Capital Reserve Fund for the Police Cruiser. Voice vote passed.
- Article 9 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Parker Hicks to raise and appropriate \$80,000.00 for the purchase of the new grader and to authorize the withdrawal of \$60,000.00 from the Equipment Purchasing Capital Reserve Fund, and the remaining \$20,000.00 to be raised by taxation. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 10 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Milton Adair to raise and appropriate \$258,500.00 for the maintenance and expenses of highways and streets for the ensuing year. Amendment was made to reduce the total by 10%, total is now \$232,650.00 the amendment was made by Roger Griffin and seconded by Clayton Hinds. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 11 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$40,000.00 for the purpose of Secondary Water System, funds to be raised by user fees. Voice vote, article was passed.
- Article 12 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Parker Hicks to raise and appropriate \$287,104.00 for the expense of the Colebrook Water Works and the Colebrook Sewerage Facilities. Voice vote, article was passed.
- Article 13 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Milton Adair to Pass over article at this time, and to be discussed after article 16, Voice vote and passed.
- Article 14 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$9,865.00 for Welfare for the ensuing year. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 15 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Farker Hicks to change the purpose of the existing Town of Colebrook Dump Equipment Capital Reserve Fund to Town of Colebrook Transfer Building and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund and to appoint the Selectmen Agent to expend from the fund. Standing vote 180 yes and 60 no motion passed.

- Article 16 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$80,500.00 for the proposed Transfer Station and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Town of Colebrook Transfer Station Building and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund the amount of \$55,000.00 and the remaining \$25,500.00 to be raised by taxation. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 17 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$112,608.00. \$57,525.00 is to be used for the Transfer Station and \$55,083.00 is to be used for the Sanitary Landfill for maintenance and expenses. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 18 Motion me by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Parker Hicks to raise and appropriate \$7,500.00 for painting of the exterior and the renovation of the second floor of the Town Hall. Amendment was made by Ronald Hughes and Seconded by Bernie Hicks, to use \$4,500.00 towards the possibility of siding, and the \$3,000.00 to be used for renovations of the second floor. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 19 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Milton Adair to raise and appropriate \$3,200.00 for Parks, Recreation, and Patriotic purposes. Voice vote, article was passed.
- Article 20 Motion made by William Gifford and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate \$57,240.00 for the support of the Town Library for the ensuing year. Voice vote, article was passed.
- Article 21 Motion made by William Gifford and seconded by Francis Haynes to raise and appropriate \$12,000.00 for capital improvement and equipment additions to the basement of the "NEW" Library. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 22 Motion made by Granvyl Hulse and seconded by Felix Weingart to raise and appropriate \$30,300.00 for all Community Health Agencies, Voice vote and passed.
- Article 23 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Bradley Sheltry to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by Town meeting, money from the State, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year, in accordance with RSA 31:95-b. Voice vote and passed.

- Article 24 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Milton Adair to authorize the Selectmen to accept a gift of a parcel of land owned by Robert Shaw and surrounding the sanitary landfill. The monitoring wells required in the process of the closure of the landfill will be placed on a portion of this land. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 25 Motion made by Granvyl Hulse and seconded by Ronald Hughes to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property which may be offered to the Town for any public purpose, pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. The selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting any such gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the town to raise, appropriate or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of any such personal property. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 26 Motion made by Granvyl Hulse and seconded by Gordon Placy to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money to defray the expense of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 27 Motion made by Ronald Hughes and seconded by Gordon Placy to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed. Such conveyance shall be by deed following a public auction, or the property may be sold by advertised sealed bids, or may be otherwise disposed of as justice may require, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Voice vote and passed.
- Article 28 Motion made by Gordon Placy and seconded by Ronald Hughes to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1992. Voice vote and passed.

The Moderator declared the meeting adjourned at 9:50 p.m.

THE HONORABLE SELECTMEN DONALD W. GILBERT, CHAIRMAN MILTON E. ADAIR PARKER A. HICKS

GENTLEMEN:

THIS YEAR WAS THE SMALLEST TURN-OVER IN PERSONNEL WITHIN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN YEARS. OFFICER MYRON CROSSLEY RESIGNED TO BECOME A POLICE OFFICER WITH THE TOWN OF LANCASTER, NH. OFFICER MICHAEL SIELICKI RETURNED TO THE AREA AND WAS HIRED TO REPLACE MYRON. OFFICER SIELICKI IS A CERTIFIED FULL-TIME POLICE OFFICER IN NEW HAMPSHIRE.

THE DRUG ABUSE RESISTANCE EDUCATION PROGRAM CAME INTO PLACE DURING THE YEAR. OFFICER LANGLEY DID A GOOD JOB IN THE LOWER GRADE SCHOOL. THE DEPARTMENT GRADUATED OVER ONE HUNDRED CHILDREN GIVING THEM DIPLOMAS AND T-SHIRTS. THIS PROGRAM IS GIVEN TO DIFFERENT YOUNG CHILDREN ONCE A YEAR.

THE COURT CASES BOTH MOTOR VEHICLE AND CRIMINAL REMAINED ABOUT THE SAME AS LAST YEAR, WITH MANY MAN HOURS SPENT IN CASE PREPARATION AND COURT ATTENDANCE.

OUR JUVENILE CASES WERE FEWER. DAVE DEWER, OUR NORTH COUNTRY YOUTH COUNSELOR AND HIS PROGRAMS ARE STILL WORKING VERY WELL WITH OUR AREA YOUTH.

DURING THE LATE SUMMER AND FALL THE NORTH COUNTRY HAD NUMEROUS BURGLARIES, THREE PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED AND CHARGED AFTER THE IGA STORE IN COLEBROOK WAS ENTERED AND MONEY TAKEN FROM A SAFE.

THE DEPARTMENT ENFORCED THE LICENSING OF DOGS LAST YEAR. NEARLY THREE HUNDRED DOGS WERE LICENSED, WHICH MAKES SURE DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES SHOTS. RABID ANIMALS WILL BE A LARGER PROBLEM IN THE FUTURE.

I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE MEN OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR DEDICATION, THE CITIZENS OF THE TOWN AND DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE. INCLUDED ARE THE PERSONAL OF THE DISPATCH CENTER, THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, AMBULANCE CORPS, STATE POLICE, BORDER PATROL, FISH AND GAME, THE SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE.

COLEBROOK PUBLIC LIBRARY

LIBRARIES ARE USED BY ALL KINDS OF PEOPLE. IT IS ONE OF THE FEW PLACES TODAY WHERE ALL AGES AND CLASSES MEET. LIBRARIES, AT COST PER CAPITA PER YEAR, HAS TO BE ONE OF THE BEST EDUCATIONAL BARGAINS AROUND. MORE AND MORE PEOPLE ARE GETTING THE MESSAGE ABOUT THE WEALTH OF MATERIALS WE HAVE FOR INFORMATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL AND RECREATIONAL READING AND VIEWING. WE ARE KNOWN TO HAVE ONE OF THE LARGEST COLLECTIONS OF SCIENCE FICTION IN THE STATE BECAUSE OF GENEROUS DONATIONS BY ONE OF OUR PATRONS. MANY PEOPLE HAVE DONATED SEVERAL DIFFERENT TYPES OF BOOKS AND VIDEOS TO ADD TO OUR COLLECTION. LAST YEAR WE HAD 29,412 ITEMS GO OUT WHICH WAS AN INCREASE OF 3,062 OVER A YEAR AGO. THIS INCLUDES BOOKS, MAGAZINES, VIDEOS, CASSETTES, PUPPETS, AND PUZZLES. ILL (INTERLIBRARY LOAN), VERY CAPABLY DONE BY JULIE COLBY, IS ANOTHER SERVICE WE OFFER. ABOUT 1,000 REQUESTS WENT OUT LAST YEAR TO OTHER LIBRARIES FOR BOOKS WE DID NOT HAVE. THE STAFF AND TRUSTEES ARE PLEASED THAT EACH YEAR WE ARE INCREASING OUR SERVICES AND NUMBER OF REGISTERED PATRONS, BUT WE WOULD LIKE TO REACH EVEN MORE PEOPLE AND MAKE THEM AWARE OF WHAT WE HAVE.

WE HAD SEVERAL PROGRAMS LAST YEAR FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS. SOME OF THE CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS WERE PRESCHOOL STORY AND ACTIVITY PROGRAMS WITH DIANE BRADFORD, MARY ANN NEARY, AND ANN MARIE GOOCH, A PROGRAM ABOUT DINOSAURS BY PAULETTE MORIN, A SCHOOL ART DISPLAY ORGANIZED BY CINDY KETTREDGE, AND "THE LITTLE RED WAGON" STORY AND PUPPET THEATER. DURING THE YEAR, SEVERAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CLASSES VISITED THE LIBRARY, SOME ON A REGULAR BASIS. DURING THE SUMMER READING PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN THERE WERE SEVERAL PROGRAMS ABOUT BIRDS AND ANIMALS WHICH INCLUDED ONE ON OWLS BY THE VERMONT SCIENCE CENTER, ONE ON MOOSE BY ERIC STOHL, AND ONE ON BEARS BY CHARLES WILLEY. MUSIC WAS PRESENTED BY ORGANIST CAROLYN BROOKS AND FIDDLER PATRICK ROSS, AND STORY TELLING BY ROSALIE SWEATT.

FOR ADULTS THERE WERE PROGRAMS ON BUDGETING, WILLS, UFO'S, COOKING WITH SOY BEANS, CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT SPONSORED BY THE NCEF, TAXES, AND FINANCIAL RETIREMENT. WE ALSO HAD MAKING A T-SHIRT BY ELAINE HAYNES. THERE WERE A READING DISCUSSIONS SERIES, A 'CONNECTION' SERIES THAT WAS FOR NEW READERS AND PEOPLE LEARNING ENGLISH, A BUSINESS PLANNING MEETING BY THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, AND A FARM PROGRAM BY STEVE TURAJ, EXTENSION LEADER. THE REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE COLEBROOK AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY ARE ON THE SECOND THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH. TWO OF THE COLEBROOK GARDEN CLUB MEETINGS WERE HELD AT THE LIBRARY. THE LOVERING MOUNTAIN ARTS ASSOCIATION, WHICH IS A BRANCH OF THE LIBRARY, MEETS ON THE SECOND TUESDAY OF EACH MONTH. THE LMA SPONSORED A REGIONAL ART SHOW, PHOTOGRAPHY CLASSES, WRITING, PUPPET MAKING, AND DRAWING WORKSHOPS, MUSICAL PROGRAMS WHICH INCLUDED FIRESIDE WINDS, VILLAGE HARMONY AND CAROLING AT THE CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PROGRAM, AND ACTIVITIES DURING THE MOOSE FESTIVAL. THE LIBRARY HELD AN OPEN HOUSE DURING THE MODSE FESTIVAL AND HAD A DISPLAY OF SEVERAL KINDS OF NEEDLE WORK AND CRAFTS. AT CHRISTMAS TIME WE HAD A WELL-RECEIVED DISPLAY OF OVER 200 TEDDY BEARS. OVER 400 PEOPLE VISITED THE LIBRARY DURING THE WEEK OF THE DISPLAY. THIS UNIQUE COLLECTION OF BEARS WAS ARRANGED IN MANY DIFFERENT SETTINGS BY DEE SULLIVAN, NANCY BIRON, AND FRANCES HAYNES.

WE HAD SEVERAL FUND RAISERS DURING THE YEAR WHICH INCLUDED A BOOK, FOOD, AND PLANT SALE, FLEA MARKET ITEMS, AND RAFFLES, AND IN DECEMBER OTHER ITEMS WERE RAFFLED THAT INCLUDED AN AFGHAN MADE BY VIRGIE STICKNEY. THE BALSAMS WILDERNESS SKI AREA HELD A SKI RACE TO BENEFIT THE LIBRARY. WE SOLD DR. GIFFORD'S LATEST VERSION OF 'COLEBROOK, A PLACE UP BACK OF NEW HAMPSHIRE'. DR. GIFFORD HAS GENEROUSLY DONATED ALL PROCEEDS FROM HIS BOOK TO THE LIBRARY. VARIOUS OTHER ITEMS WERE SOLD DURING THE YEAR INCLUDING COLEBROOK MEMORABILIA, HERBAL VINEGARS MADE BY SINI FOSKETT, AND A MAPLE COOKBOOK PUT TOGETHER BY FRANCES HAYNES.

MANY TASKS, SUCH AS BOOK PROCESSING, HAVE BEEN DONE BY OUR VOLUNTEERS JEAN CAIRD, STACEY CAMPBELL, SINI FOSKETT, HELEN HULSE, AND JANE MARKSTROM. JEAN CAIRD AND STACEY CAMPBELL HAVE ALSO WORKED AT THE DESK. HELEN HULSE IS NOW READING THE "NEWS AND SENTINEL" ON TAFE SO THAT THOSE WHO HAVE VISION PROBLEMS CAN HEAR THE 'NEWS'. JANE MARKSTROM HAS HAD SEVERAL BEAUTIFUL ORCHIDS ON DISPLAY AT THE LIBRARY.

JULIE COLBY IS CONTINUING TO TAKE LIBRARY TECHNIQUE CLASSES, JULIE AND FRANCES HAVE GONE TO CO-OF, FORUM, AND FIVE RIVERS' MEETINGS AND REFERENCE TRAINING CLASSES, FRANCES HAS GONE TO NEW HAMPSHIRE AND OTHER LIBRARY ASSOCIATION MEETINGS.

EXCEPT FOR A RESTROOM, THE BASEMENT OF THE NEW LIBRARY WILL BE FINISHED VERY SOON.

OUR GOAL IS TO PREVENT ILLITERACY BY PROMOTING THE <u>JOY</u> OF READING, KEEPING READING ALIVE, ENHANCING THE QUALITY OF LIFE, AND PROVIDING INFORMATION TO THOSE WHO NEED.IT. WE ARE TRYING TO DO IT WITH A SMALL PERCENTAGE OF YOUR TAX DOLLAR. WITH YOUR CONTINUED ENCOURAGEMENT, WE CAN GO A LONG WAY TO ACCOMPLISHING THIS GOAL.

THE STAFF AND TRUSTEES WISH TO THANK OUR PATRONS, FRIENDS, AND THE PEOPLE OF THIS AREA WHO HAVE DONATED TO THE LIBRARY AND SUPPORTED US IN THE PAST YEAR.

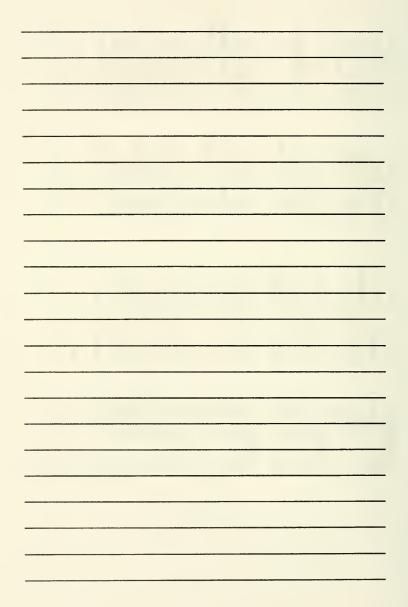

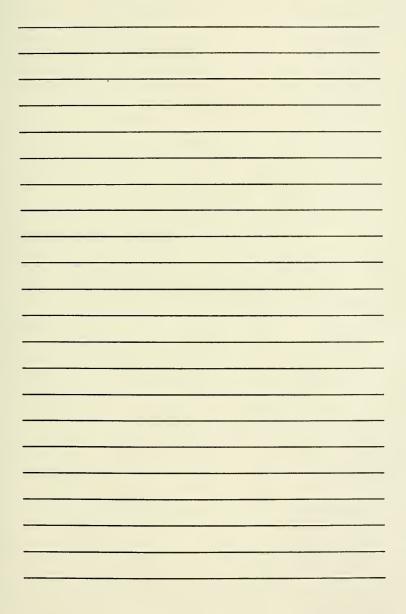
