You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at 6:00 in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

IN PLANNING AND PERFORMING OUR AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1993 WE CONSIDERED THE TOWN'S INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE TO DETERMINE OUR AUDITING PROCEDURES FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPRESSING AN OPINION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND NOT TO PROVIDE ASSURANCE OF THE INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE.

HOWEVER, DURING OUR AUDIT WE BECAME AWARE OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS THAT SHOULD BE CORRECTED IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN INTERNAL CONTROLS AND OPERATING EFFICIENCY. THIS LETTER DOES NOT AFFECT OUR REPORT DATED JUNE 3, 1993 ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE.

OUR FOLLOWING REMARKS ARE BEING MADE IN THE HOPE THAT THEY WILL IMPROVE EXISTING PROCEDURES AND ARE IN NO WAY A CRITICISM OF TOWN PERSONNEL.

1. CLASSIFICATION OF WATER AND SEWER_REVENUE

CLASSIFICATION ERRORS WERE NOTED DURING THE AUDIT OF WATER AND SEWER REVENUE. IN COMPARING WATER AND SEWER RENT COLLECTED BY THE TAX COLLECTOR WITH WHAT WAS RECORDED IN THE TOWN'S FINANCIAL RECORDS THE REVENUE OF ONE FUND WAS OVERSTATED BY OVER \$4,500.00 WHILE THE OTHER FUND WAS UNDERSTATED BY A COMPARABLE AMOUNT.

RECOMMENDATION

GREATER CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN INPUTTING REVENUE IN THE GENERAL LEDGER AND REGULAR RECONCILIATIONS SHOULD BE DONE BETWEEN THE TAX COLLECTOR'S AND THE TOWN'S RECORDS.

2. TAX LIEN AND TAX DEED

AS REQUIRED BY THE RSA'S, THE TAX COLLECTOR RELEASED MOST OF THE TAX LIENS WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF FULL PAYMENT. HOWEVER, WE NOTED THAT SOME TAX LIENS HAD BEEN RELEASED AFTER THIRTY DAYS OF PAYMENT. ALSO, ENDING TAX RECEIVABLES INCLUDED THE OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF THE TAX DEEDED PROPERTY.

RECOMMENDATION

THE PROCEDURES OF THE TAX LIEN PROCESS SHOULD BE REVIEWED AND ENDING TAX RECEIVABLES SHOULD BE REDUCED BY REMAINING OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF THE TAX DEEDED PROPERTY.

3. TRUST FUNDS

A. THE BEGINNING BALANCE ON THE TRUSTEE OF THE TRUST FUND REPORTS DID NOT AGREE WITH THE ENDING BALANCES FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR AUDITED. THIS WAS A RESULT OF A RECLASSIFICATION OF INTEREST INCOME FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR AS THIRTEEN MONTHS OF INTEREST INCOME WAS RECORDED IN THE YEAR ENDED 1992 AND SUBSEQUENTLY ONLY ELEVEN MONTHS OF INTEREST INCOME WAS RECORDED IN 1993. THE DIFFERENCE IN INCOME REPORTED FOR EACH YEAR WAS IMMATERIAL TO WARRANT A CHANGE AND ALL INCOME AT THE END OF 1993 WAS ACCOUNTED FOR AND BALANCES AT DECEMBER 31, 1993 AGREED WITH BANK BALANCES.

RECOMMENDATION

IN THE FUTURE, BEGINNING BALANCES FOR THE TRUST FUND ACCOUNTS SHOULD NOT BE CHANGED AND TWELVE MONTHS OF INTEREST INCOME SHOULD ALWAYS BE RECORDED.

B. BECAUSE THE BANKS DO NOT PROVIDE BANK STATEMENTS FOR CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT, ADDITIONAL AUDIT TIME WAS REQUIRED IN ORDER TO VERIFY THE CORRECT ENDING BALANCES FOR THE CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT.

RECOMMENDATION

THE TRUSTEES OF THE TRUST FUNDS SHOULD REQUEST A STATEMENT OF ACCOUNT AT DECEMBER 31ST SHOWING THE BALANCE IN THE ACCOUNT AND TO MAKE SURE THAT INTEREST INCOME WAS RECORDED PROPERLY.

WE EXTEND OUR THANKS TO THE OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE DURING THE COURSE OF OUR AUDIT.

IT IS OUR OPINION THAT THE SELECTMEN, TOWN MANAGER AND STAFF ARE DOING AN EXCELLENT JOB ADMINISTERING THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK.

REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

IT IS ONCE AGAIN TIME FOR ME TO MAKE MY ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CITIZENS OF COLEBROOK. LOOKING BACK THIS YEAR THERE HAVE BEEN MANY CHANGES IN THAT WE HAD TWO NEW SELECTMEN, A CHIEF OF POLICE, TOWN CLERK, TREASURER AND A PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR WHICH REPLACED THE ROAD AGENT. WHEN THE TIME COMES I SINCERELY HOPE THAT THOSE THAT WERE APPOINTED TO FILL IN THE UNEXPIRED TERMS OF ELECTED POSITIONS WILL CHOOSE TO FILE.

IN JULY CATHY CONWAY, A CIVIL ENGINEER FROM NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL, CAME TO DO THE ROAD SURFACE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM GRANT THAT I WAS ABLE TO OBTAIN LAST YEAR. THIS WILL GREATLY HELP US IN PREPARING OUR HIGHWAY BUDGET FOR ROAD REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE AS THE ROADS WILL BE PRIORITIZED IN THE ORDER OF NEED.

THE FEASIBILITY (CDBG) BLOCK GRANT ENABLED US TO DRILL A WELL LOCATED AT THE LOWER END OF BRIDGE STREET. FOR THE TIME BEING THE WELL HAS BEEN CAPPED AND A DECISION WILL BE MADE IN THE SPRING AS TO WHAT DIRECTION TO GO REFERENCE DEVELOPMENT.

THE JOB CORP GRANT ENABLED BOTH THE PARTICIPANTS AND THE TOWN AND OTHER NON PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO BENEFIT GREATLY THROUGH A NUMBER OF PROJECTS. SUCCESS FOR THIS WAS DUE IN LARGE TO THE COORDINATORS KENNETH BEAULIEU AND TOM ALLEN AND I WISH TO EXPRESS MY SINCERE APPRECIATION TO THEM BOTH FOR A JOB WELL DONE.

LAST YEARS REPORT STATED MY CONCERN FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF THE LANDFILL HAVING TO BE CLOSED AND COMPLETELY CAPPED BY OCTOBER 1, 1994. OUR PLANS SUBMITTED TO THE STATE WERE NOT REVIEWED AND CLOSURE FOR THIS YEAR WAS AVERTED. WITH UNUSUAL WEATHER CONDITIONS FOR THE FALL SEASON WE WERE ABLE TO COVER, SLOPE AND SEED THE AREA. SWALE AREAS WERE DEVELOPED TO DIVERT RUN-OFF WHICH WE HOPE WILL IMPROVE OUR WELL MONITORING REPORTS. AFTER THE PROJECT WAS COMPLETED AND THE INSPECTION WAS MADE BY THE STATE THEIR REPORT STATED HOW IMPRESSED THEY WERE WITH WHAT WE HAD ACCOMPLISHED.

WHEN THE STATE RECONSTRUCTED THE BRIDGE AT THE FOOT OF COOPER HILL WE WERE FORTUNATE TO BE ABLE TO REPLACE WATER AND SEWER LINES WITH ONLY THE COST OF MATERIALS AND A SMALL PORTION OF THE ENGINEERING COST. IT HAD BEEN FELT IN THE BEGINNING THAT THIS WAS GOING TO BE A REAL CONGESTIVE PROBLEM BUT WITH THE COOPERATION OF CITIZENS AND THE PROJECT DIRECTORS IT WORKED OUT VERY WELL.

FOR SEVERAL YEARS NOW I HAVE BEEN TRYING TO HAVE THE STATE CONSIDER RECONSTRUCTION ON PARK STREET (ROUTE 145) TO HAVE THEIR STORM DRAINS DIVERTED FROM OUR SEWER LAGOONS. IT LOOKS VERY FAVORABLE THAT IN 1995 THIS WILL BECOME A REALITY AND WE WILL ALSO BE ABLE TO REPLACE OUR WATER AND SEWER LINES FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS ONLY.

OUR TRANSFER STATION HAS BEEN IN OPERATION FOR OVER A YEAR AND IS PROVING FAR MORE ECONOMICAL TO RUN THAN OUR LANDFILL. COOPERATION OF THE CITIZENS HAS ENABLED US TO HAVE A WELL-RUN FACILITY AND MAY I EXTEND MY APPRECIATION TO THEM FOR THEIR COOPERATION.

AERATORS FOR THE SEWER LAGOONS WERE PURCHASED AND INSTALLED TO ENHANCE TREATMENT AND TO REDUCE ODOR.

WE PAID OFF OUR ULTRA VIOLET LOAN AND THIS HAS PROVED TO BE A VERY EFFECTIVE SYSTEM.

ONCE AGAIN THIS YEAR I WAS ABLE TO RECEIVE AN EARLY TAX RATE AND BILLS WENT OUT IN OCTOBER ALLOWING US TO HAVE NO OUTSTANDING NOTES GOING INTO 1995. WITH CAREFUL MANAGEMENT OF THE BUDGET I WAS ABLE TO RETURN A GOODLY AMOUNT OF SURPLUS WHICH HELPED TO REDUCE THE TAX RATE.

IN CLOSING I WISH TO EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION TO THE TOWN OFFICERS, DEPARTMENT HEADS AND EMPLOYEES FOR THEIR DEDICATED SERVICES AND THE CITIZENS OF COLEBROOK FOR THEIR COOPERATION.

COOS COUNTY RECYCLING CENTER 1994 ANNUAL REPORT

THE RECYCLING CENTER CONTINUES TO BE AN EXTREMELY POSITIVE SOLUTION TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FOR ALL MEMBER COMMUNITIES. THE CENTER IS COST EFFECTIVE, IN THAT THERE IS ONLY ONE FULL TIME EMPLOYEE AND THE REMAINING LABOR IS CONDUCTED BY AN INMATE POPULATION. INMATES LOGGED A TOTAL OF 5,792 HOURS AT THE CENTER THIS PAST YEAR. THE INMATE LABOR REALIZED IS EQUAL TO A SAVINGS OF \$24,617.00 AT MINIMUM WAGE TO THE COMMUNITIES SERVED. THIS LABOR INTENSIVE PROGRAM PROVIDES INMATES WITH A WORK PROGRAM THAT HAS PROVEN POSITIVE TO OUR INMATE POPULATION.

BOB BROWN, SUPERVISOR OF THE CENTER CONTINUES TO EXPLORE VIABLE MARKETS FOR THE COMMODITIES PROCESSED, ALWAYS SEEDING OUT THE BEST MARKET PRICE. THE CENTER PROCESSED 298.70 TONS OF RECYCLABLE MATERIAL WITH REVENUES OF \$41,731.72. THIS ALSO INCLUDED THE PROCESSING OF 5 CENT RETURNABLES THAT SHOWED A NET REVENUE OF \$8,583.50.

WE HAVE ALSO UNDERTAKEN AN INITIATIVE TO SEEK STATE MATCHING FUNDS FOR A HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROJECT. OUR APPLICATION WILL BE PROCESSED IN FEBRUARY 1995, WITH AN ANTICIPATED PROJECT DATE SOMETIME IN MARCH. OUR PREVIOUS COMMUNICATIONS ALSO ALERTED YOU TO THE NEED FOR CONCRETE PADS FOR OUR ROLL-OFF CONTAINERS. IT WAS THE DECISION OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AT OUR ANNUAL MEETING THAT THE COSTS FOR THESE PADS BE TAKEN FROM THE SAVINGS ACCOUNT. AS SPRING APPROACHES WE INTEND TO START ON THIS PROJECT WITH INMATE LABOR.

THE VOLUME OF GOODS PROCESSED CONTINUES TO CLIMB AND THE NEED TO KEEP OUR EQUIPMENT CURRENT AND LOOK FOR WAYS TO BE MORE EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT IS EVIDENT. WE WILL CONTINUE TO EXPLORE NEW MARKETS, NEW TECHNOLOGY AND WAYS TO BETTER SERVE YOU IN THE FUTURE.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

THIS YEAR THE COLEBROOK POLICE DEPARTMENT EXPERIENCED A LARGE TURN-OVER IN PERSONNEL WITH THE RESIGNATION OF WAYNE H. CROSS AFTER TWENTY (20) PLUS YEARS OF SERVICE. FOLLOWING HIS RESIGNATION I WAS APPOINTED CHIEF OF THE DEPARTMENT.

MANPOWER WAS DROPPED FROM A FOUR (4) MAN DEPARTMENT TO TWO (2) FULL TIME OFFICERS. IT WAS THEREFORE NECESSARY FOR US TO ADVERTISE FOR A FULL TIME OFFICER. IT WAS THE FIRST TIME THAT A HIRING PROCESS WAS IMPLEMENTED AS BOTH THE TOWN MANAGER SALLY S. WENTZELL AND MYSELF FELT IT WAS NECESSARY.

WITH THIS NEW HIRING PROCESS IN PLACE THE CANDIDATE TESTING IN ALL AREAS WITH THE HIGHEST AVERAGE WAS STEVE BRETON, WHO WAS WORKING AS A PART-TIME OFFICER. SINCE HIS EMPLOYMENT STEVE HAS DONE A GREAT JOB AND WILL BE ATTENDING THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE POLICE ACADEMY IN THE NEAR FUTURE. THE DEPARTMENT WISHES HIM WELL IN THIS ENDEAVOR.

WITH THE CHANGE OF COMMAND CAME A CHANGE IN PHILOSOPHY AND DIRECTION IN WHICH THE COLEBROOK POLICE DEPARTMENT IS HEADING.

THIS PAST YEAR WE ACTIVELY PURSUED AND WERE ABLE TO OBTAIN FEDERAL GRANTS TO START COMMUNITY PROGRAMS SUCH AS A CHILD SAFETY AND RESTRAINT PROGRAM CALLED "I AM A SAFE RIDER". OTHER GRANTS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED AND WE ARE AWAITING CONFIRMATION AS TO THEIR STATUS.

WITH THE FORMATION OF THE COLEBROOK ATHLETIC LEAGUE WE HAVE ORGANIZED AN ICE HOCKEY TEAM FOR YOUTHS IN GRADES NINE (9) THROUGH TWELVE (12) AND A FLOOR HOCKEY PROGRAM FOR GRADES FOUR (4) THROUGH EIGHT (8). THESE WILL CONTINUE THROUGH OUT THE YEAR WITH THE ADDITION OF FLAG FOOTBALL AND OTHER PROGRAMS. WE NEEDED ASSISTANCE IN OUR EFFORTS AND WE SOUGHT HELP FROM A NUMBER OF COMMUNITY GROUPS SUCH AS KIWANIS, COOS COUNTY HOME HEALTH, UPPER CONNECTICUT VALLEY HOSPITAL, DERBY'S LODGE AND JUVENILE SERVICES.

AS A COMMUNITY WE HAVE ALSO EXPERIENCED A HIGH RISE IN THE CRIME RATE, BOTH MISDEMEANORS AND FELONIES, THESE HAVE BEEN IN THE FORM OF RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DRUGS AND CRIMINAL MISCHIEF CASES. ALL OF THE ABOVE HAVE TAKEN HUNDREDS OF MAN HOURS TO INVESTIGATE AND PROSECUTE.

JUVENILE CRIME WAS DOWN DUE IN LARGE TO THE WORK OF MARTHA LONG AND RICHARD FOWLER. SINCE LAST SPRING MARTHA AND RICHARD HAVE BEEN MEETING AND WORKING WITH A LARGE GROUP OF JUVENILES AND THEIR PARENTS TO BUILD SELF ESTEEM AND CONFIDENCE AND TO ASSIST THEM IN BECOMING PRODUCTIVE MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY.

AS I MENTIONED EARLIER, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN SHORT ON MANPOWER SINCE EARLY SPRING. TO HELP COVER THE TOWN WHEN WE HAD NO OFFICER AVAILABLE AND AT OTHER TIMES THE NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE POLICE HAVE COME TO OUR AIDE. AS CHIEF I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE LOCAL TROOPERS THOMAS YORKE, SCOTT STEPANIAN, SCOTT PHILLIPS AND SGT. HOWARD WEBER FOR ALL THE WORK AND EFFORT THEY PUT IN TO ASSIST US. THESE MEN ARE TRUE PROFESSIONALS.

COLEBROOK PUBLIC LIBRARY

THIS IS MY FINAL REPORT AS LIBRARIAN. I HAVE OFTEN THOUGHT HOW LIBRARY SERVICE HAS GROWN AND CHANGED OVER THE YEARS. IN EARLY DAYS IT MUST HAVE BEEN DIFFICULT TO PROVIDE BOOKS AND SERVICE TO PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. IN THE LATE 1800'S AND EARLY 1900'S THE LIBRARY WAS HOUSED IN VARIOUS BUILDINGS UNTIL IVA H. DREW FORMED A COMMITTEE IN 1925 TO BUILD A LIBRARY BUILDING. FINISHED IN 1928, IT WAS MORE THAN ADEQUATE IN THOSE DAYS. AS THE LIBRARY CONTINUED TO GROW, MORE ROOM WAS NEEDED. IN 1980 THE CHILDREN'S ROOM WAS MOVED DOWNSTAIRS. SOON THE ADULT SECTION BECAME VERY CROWDED. WHEN RUSSELL INGRAM AND ROBERT SHAW DONATED MONEY TO THE MASONS TO BUILD AN ANNEX FOR THE LIBRARY WITH THE MASONS USING THE TOP FLOOR, IT WAS GRATEFULLY ACCEPTED BY THE TRUSTEES AND PEOPLE OF COLEBROOK, THIS NEW BUILDING HAS PROVIDED MUCH NEEDED SPACE FOR BOOKS AND OTHER MATERIALS, READING AND STUDY AREAS, AND SPACE FOR PROGRAMS. IN THE PAST YEAR THERE HAS BEEN AS MANY AS FOUR PROGRAMS GOING ON AT ONCE IN VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE LIBRARY. HOW THE LIBRARY HAS GROWN!

ACCORDING TO VARIOUS SOURCES, EARLY LIBRARIANS WERE J.H. DUDLEY, J.D. BRIDGES, AND MISS MARY BEDEL. SARAH ELIZABETH ROLFE WAS LIBRARIAN FROM 1895 TO 1925, MARTHA FRENCH FROM 1925 TO 1955, EDITH JACKSON FROM 1955 TO 1962, ELMERLINE VANCORE FROM 1962 TO 1971, MARY JANNENGA FROM 1971 TO 1985, AND FRANCES HAYNES FROM 1979 TO 1995- FIRST AS CHILDREN'S LIBRARIAN AND THEN DIRECTOR FROM 1985 TO 1995. EACH LIBRARIAN, WITH THE SUPPORT OF TRUSTEES, VOLUNTEERS, THE PEOPLE OF COLEBROOK AND THIS AREA AND THE PATRONS AND FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY, HAS STRIVED TO ADD MORE BOOKS, OTHER MATERIALS, AND SERVICES FOR THE PEOPLE OF THE "NORTH COUNTRY". MARTHA FRENCH'S 1942 N.H. STATE LIBRARY REPORT STATED \$324. WAS SPENT ON BOOKS (BOOKS COST ABOUT \$1.00 EACH IN THOSE DAYS), THE LIBRARY WAS OPEN 9 HOURS A WEEK, AND THE TOTAL BUDGET WAS \$600. THE LIBRARY NOW HAS OVER 23,500 BOOKS AND MATERIALS, HAS OVER 2,700 REGISTERED PATRONS, CIRCULATED 32,000 BOOKS AND OTHER MATERIALS IN 1994, AND IS OPEN 25 HOURS A WEEK. AGAIN, HOW THE LIBRARY HAS GROWN!

FUND RAISERS OVER THE LAST YEAR HAVE INCLUDED A BOOK AND FLEA MARKET SALE, RAFFLES, AND SELLING DR. GIFFORD'S BOOK, ROSES, AND VARIOUS OTHER ITEMS. MOST OF THIS MONEY GOES TOWARDS THE BOOK BUDGET. THE BALSAMS/WILDERNESS SKI AREA HELD A SKI RACE TO BENEFIT THE LIBRARY. SEVERAL BUSINESSES AND FRIENDS HAVE MADE DONATIONS TO THE LIBRARY. MANY BOOKS, MOSTLY NON-FICTION AND SCIENCE FICTION, HAVE BEEN DONATED.

A SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN IN THE FALL WAS CONDUCTED TO ADD TO THE MEMORIAL AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS. WHEN A DESIGNATED AMOUNT HAS BEEN REACHED, INCOME FROM THE MEMORIAL FUND WILL BE USED TO BUY BOOKS, AND INCOME FROM THE IMPROVEMENT FUND MAY BE USED FOR BUILDING, EQUIPMENT, OR IMPROVEMENTS.

THE LIBRARY PROVIDED VARIOUS TYPES OF PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS DURING 1994. CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS, ORGANIZED BY CHILDREN'S LIBRARIAN, ROSALIE SWEATT, INCLUDED STORY HOURS FOR PRESCHOOLERS, SUMMER READING PROGRAMS, THE "LITTLE RED WAGON" STORY AND PUPPET THEATRE, A CHRISTMAS PROGRAM, AND A SPECIAL PROGRAM CO-SPONSORED WITH THE LOVERING MT. ARTS ASSN. THAT FEATURED STORY-TELLER ODDS BODKIN. A GRANT FROM THE N.H. ARTS COUNCIL HELPED WITH THIS PROJECT.

ADULT PROGRAMS DURING 1994 INCLUDED A READING-DISCUSSION SERIES, GROWING ROSES WITH ROSE GROWER MIKE LOWE OF NASHUA, A PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP, A BOOK SIGNING OF "AUNT SARAH" WITH AUTHOR TRUDY PARKER, A READING PROGRAM "CONNECTION" WITH SPEAKER JOYCE HUBBARD, PARENTING WITH SPEAKER VALERIE HERRES, PROGRAMS BY THE EXTENSION SERVICE, AND A PROGRAM ON FEEDING DEER WITH SEVERAL SPEAKERS.

TWO EXHIBITS WERE HELD DURING THE YEAR - "FASHIONS OF YESTERDAY" DURING THE MOOSE FESTIVAL, AND AN ANGEL DISPLAY BEFORE CHRISTMAS.

THE LOVERING MT. ARTS ASSN. PROVIDED PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS THAT INCLUDE ONE ABOUT SCULPTURE BY EMILE BIRCH, SCULPTOR IN RESIDENCE, A LOCAL ARTIST EXHIBIT, A RUSSIAN ART EXHIBIT, WRITING WORKSHOPS WITH JAMES MACDONDALD, THEY HELD AN OPEN HOUSE, AND HAD AN AUCTION TO HELP RAISE MONEY FOR THE LMA. CALLIGRAPHY CLASSES WITH MICHELE JOHNSEN WERE SPONSORED BY THE N.H. LEAGUE OF CRAFTS.

THE COLEBROOK AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY HELD THEIR MEETINGS THE SECOND THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH, THE COLEBROOK GARDEN MET OCCASIONALLY AT THE LIBRARY, AND VARIOUS OTHER CIVIC MEETINGS WERE HELD IN THE COMMUNITY ROOM INCLUDING ONE ORGANIZED BY PRISCILLA MCGUIRE AND DAN FRENCH ON THE POSSIBILITIES OF INTERACTIVE TV IN THIS AREA. THE KIWANIS HELD THEIR MEETINGS IN THE COMMUNITY ROOM FOR A FEW WEEKS.

THE ADULT TUTORIAL PROGRAM HAS BEEN USING THE BASEMENT OF THE ORIGINAL BUILDING FOR OVER THREE YEARS. CLAIRE OWEN, WHO DOES THE LOCAL TESTING, REPORTED THAT SHE HAS TESTED 50 STUDENTS FROM THIS AREA LAST YEAR. THIS INCLUDES SEVERAL FROM THE TWO JOB OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS. THIRTY FOUR HAVE RECEIVED THEIR GED CERTIFICATES, SOME HAVE NOT FINISHED THEIR COURSES, AND SOME ARE RETESTING. THIS PROGRAM NOT ONLY BENEFITS THE PARTICIPANTS, BUT THEIR FAMILIES AS WELL.

TWO GRANTS WERE RECEIVED FROM THE NEW HAMPSHIRE COUNCIL FOR THE HUMANITIES. ONE WAS FOR A READING-DISCUSSION SERIES AND THE OTHER ONE FOR SPEAKER, JUDITH MOYER, WHO TOLD HOW TO START AN ORAL HISTORY PROJECT. THIS EXCITING PROJECT, SUPPORTED BY THE LIBRARY AND THE COLEBROOK HISTORICAL SOCIETY, IS CONTINUING TO GROW AND WILL PROVIDE LOCAL HISTORY FOR PATRONS AND STUDENTS OF ALL AGES.

ANOTHER GRANT WAS RECEIVED FROM THE NORTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE FOUNDATION TO PROVIDE MATERIALS TO PARENTS OF PRESCHOOLERS ON HOW TO PREPARE THEIR CHILDREN FOR SCHOOL, HOW TO USE THE LIBRARY, AND OTHER TOPICS. WE ARE CONTINUING THE "READ TO ME" PROGRAM WHICH PROVIDES PARENTS OF BABIES BORN AT THE LOCAL HOSPITAL WITH A LIBRARY T-SHIRT, A BOARD BOOK, AND MATERIAL ABOUT READING AND INFORMATION ABOUT THE LIBRARY. BECAUSE READING TO CHILDREN AT AN EARLY AGE IS SO IMPORTANT TO A CHILD'S DEVELOPMENT AND READINESS FOR SCHOOL, THESE PROJECTS WILL CONTINUE, AND HOPEFULLY EXPAND.

FRANCES HAYNES, JULIE COLBY, AND ROSALIE SWEATT ATTENDED SEVERAL LIBRARY MEETINGS DURING THE YEAR. FRANCES ATTENDED THE NH STATE LIBRARY ASSN. MEETING IN MAY AND NEW ENGLAND LIBRARY ASSN. MEETING IN OCTOBER. JULIE WAS PRESIDENT OF THE FORUM WHICH IS A GROUP OF NORTH COUNTRY LIBRARIES.

THE MAJOR CHALLENGES FOR LIBRARIES TODAY IS TO KEEP CHILDREN OF ALL AGES READING (DESPITE MANY DISTRACTIONS SUCH AS TV) AND TO KEEP UP WITH MODERN TECHNOLOGY AND TO FIND THE MONEY TO DO SO. THERE WILL BE MANY FASCINATING WAYS LIBRARIES CAN PROVIDE FOR THE EDUCATIONAL, INFORMATIONAL, AND RECREATIONAL NEEDS FOR THE PEOPLE OF THIS AREA.

IT HAS BEEN A PLEASURE FOR ME TO SERVE AS CHILDREN'S LIBRARIAN AND THEN LIBRARY DIRECTOR. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE TRUSTEES, THE STAFF, THE VOLUNTEERS, THE PEOPLE OF THIS AREA AND THE PATRONS AND FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY WHO HAVE SUPPORTED ME AND THE LIBRARY OVER THE LAST 15 YEARS. THE LIBRARY IS FORTUNATE TO HAVE A DEDICATED GROUP OF TRUSTEES, STAFF, AND VOLUNTEERS, AND THIS AREA IS FORTUNATE TO HAVE A LIBRARY OF THIS SIZE AND QUALITY. WITH THE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF EVERYONE, THE LIBRARY WILL CONTINUE TO GROW.

The exemption, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be \$5,000.00. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 5 years and own and occupy the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by a spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$5,000.00; if single, \$6,000.00 if married and own net assets not in excess of \$35,000.00 excluding the value of their person's residence. Per RSA 72:37-b & c.

Ballot vote: 281 yes and 88 no.

- Article 4 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Gordon Placy to instruct the Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law passed with a voice vote.
- Article 5 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Milton Adair to appropriate \$14,000.00 for a property valuation update and to authorize the selectmen to withdraw \$12,252.75, plus interest, from the Town of Colebrook Property Reappraisal Fund and the remainder to be raised through taxation passed with a voice vote.
- Article 6 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,500.00 for general repairs to the exterior of the Town Hall passed with a voice vote.
- Article 7 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate the sum of \$216,425.00 for General Government for the ensuing year. A motion was made by Haven Haynes, Jr. and seconded by Lawrence Rappaport to reduce the amount raised and appropriated for the General Government Budget to \$210,425.00. This amendment passed with a voice vote. The motion as amended passed with a voice vote.
- Article 8 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Milton Adair to raise and appropriate the amount of \$186,820.00 for Public Safety for the ensuing year passed with a voice vote.
- Article 9 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Kevin McKinnon to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,000.00 to be added to the existing Equipment Purchasing Capital Reserve Fund passed with a voice vote.

- Article 10 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Donald Gilbert to appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 to purchase a new police cruiser and to authorize the withdrawal of \$14,000.00 from the Equipment Purchasing Capital Reserve Fund passed with a voice vote.

Bruce Katz made a motion, seconded by Fred Miller, to postpone any action until a committee is formed and the Town knows what it wants to do. This motion passed with a voice vote.
- Article 14 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Milton Adair to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250,863.00 for the expenses of the Colebrook Water Works and the Colebrook Sewerage Facilities passed with a voice vote.
- Article 15 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Parker Hicks to raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary (\$7,100) for Welfare for the ensuing year passed with a voice vote.
- Article 16 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Donald Gilbert to authorize the Selectmen to close the Town of Colebrook Transfer Building and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund and to authorize the Selectmen to deposit these funds into the Colebrook General Fund passed with the necessary 2/3 standing vote of 239 in the affirmative
- Article 17 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Milton Adair to raise and appropriate the sum of \$255,463.00 for the maintenance and expenses of the Sanitary Landfill/Transfer Station for the ensuing year passed with a voice vote.
- Article 18 Motion made by Milton Adair and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Parks, Recreation, and Patriotic Purposes passed with a voice vote.
- Article 19 Motion made by William Guiffre to appropriate \$5,000 as a contribution for the support and services of the North Country Youth Council failed for lack of a second.
- Article 20 Motion made by John Fothergill and seconded by Haven Haynes to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the support of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Northern New Hampshire. Agreeable to a petition signed

- by Nancy J. Roberge and others. By petition. Passed with a voice vote.
- Article 21 Motion made by Herbert Gifford and seconded by Lillian Hicks to accept the provision of RSA 202-A:4-c providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the public library trustees to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the town meeting, unanticipated money from a state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year passed by a voice vote.
- Article 22 Motion made by Herbert Gifford and seconded by Almira McKinnon to raise and appropriate the sum of \$59,000.00 for the support of the Colebrok Public Library, such funds to be expended under the direction of the Board of Library Trustees, passed with a voice vote.
- Article 23 Motion made by Parker Hicks and seconded by Donald Gilbert to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,957.00 for the following agencies: UCVH; Ambulance District A-1; UCV Mental Health; Vershire Center; North Country Council; and Coos Community Action passed with a voice vote.
- Article 24 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Philip Ducret to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to appoint a Deputy Treasurer. Said Deputy will be swom, shall have the powers of the Treasurer, and may be removed at the pleasure of the Treasurer per RSA 41:29-a passed with a voice vote.
- Article 25 Motion made by Philip Ducret and seconded by Gordon Placy to vote to change the name of the Bean Bridge Capital Reserve Fund to the Town of Colebrook Bridge Fund and to appoint the Selectmen as agents to expend from the Fund passed with the required 2/3 standing vote of 215 in the affirmative.
- Article 26 Motion made by Donald Gilbert and seconded by Milton Adair to authorize the dedication of the northern portion of the Colebrook Village Cemetery, bounded on the west by Rt. 3, and on the east by a grove of trees, to be set aside as a Memorial Garden for cremation and infant burials passed with a voice vote.
- Article 27 Motion made by Fred King and seconded by John Harrigan to vote nonsupport of the concept of greenlining and so instruct the Board of Selectmen to inform our congressional delegation and governor of same passed with a voice vote.

 to the general court to enter legislation to the effect that any public acquisition of
 land have prior approval of the legislative body of affected town passed with a voice
 vote.
- Article 29 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Bradley Sheltry to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by Town meeting, money from the state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year, in accordance with RSA 31:95-b passed with a voice vote.
- Article 30 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Clayton Hinds to authorize

the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property which may be offered to the town for any public purpose, pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting any such gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the town to raise, appropriate or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair or replacement of any such personal property until rescinded passed with a voice vote.

- Article 31 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Philip Ducret to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed. Such conveyance shall be by deed following a public auction, or the property may be sold by advertised sealed bids, or may be otherwise disposed of as justice may require, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Until rescinded. Passed with voice vote.
- Article 32 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Philip Ducret to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept, on behalf of the town, gifts, legacies, and devises made to the town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by RSA 31:19 passed with a voice vote.
- Article 33 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Philip Ducret to accept the provision of RSA 33:7 providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes passed with a voice vote.
- Article 34 Motion made by Bud Hulse and seconded by Philip Ducret to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers, as contained in the Annual Report of said Town of Colebrook for the year ending December 31, 1993, passed with a voice vote.
- Article 35 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Motion made by John Fothergill and seconded by Donald Frizzell to reconsider Article 13 was passed with a voice vote. The reconsidation was defeated,

Motion made by Bruce Katz and seconded by Brad Sheltry to indicate an itemized account of the compensations and benefits for town employees in the Town Report. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Norman Brungot was recognized for his 49-50 years as Town Moderator with a round of applause. Outgoing Selectman Donald Gilbert was also recognized.

The Moderator declared the meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
