Action taken at prior Town meetings

1994 Town Meeting Article #30

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property which may be offered to the Town for any public purpose, pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting any such gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the Town to raise, appropriate or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of any such personal property until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #31

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed. Such conveyance shall be by deed following a public auction, or the property may be sold by advertised sealed bids, or may be otherwise disposed of, as justice requires, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #32

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept, on behalf of the Town, gifts, legacies, and devises made to the Town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by RSA 31:19.

1994 Town Meeting Article #33

Shall the Town accept the provision of RSA 33:7 providing that any Town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes?

1995 Town Meeting Article #5

Shall we permit the public Library to retain all money it receives from its income-generating equipment to be used for general repairs and upgrading and for the purchase of books, supplies and income-generating equipment?

1995 Town Meeting Article #25

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by Town meeting, money from the State, Federal or other Governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year, in accordance with RSA 31:95-b.

1996 Town Meeting Article #17

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 202-A: 4-d authorizing the Library Trustees to accept gifts of personal property, other than money, which may be offered to the library for any public purpose, provided, however, that no acceptance of personal property by the Library trustees shall be deemed to bind the town or the library trustees to raise, appropriate or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair or replacement of such personal property.

1996 Town Meeting Article #20

I Roger C. Lepine of RR 1 Box 142 Munn Road, Colebrook, New Hampshire 03576-9713, hereby PETITION the Town of Colebrook, New Hampshire to maintain and plow said road, Munn Road, in which the Town stop 300 feet short of my property.

1997 Town Meeting Article #24

To see if the Town will vote to establish a Cemetery Expendable Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31-19a, for the improvement of the Colebrook Cemeteries, and designate the Cemetery Trustees as Agents to expend, and to authorize the Selectmen to appropriate \$2,000.00 of said funds to be transferred from the December 31, 1998 general fund balance.

1997 Town Meeting Article #26

To see if the Town will allow the Tax Collector to accept the pre-payment of taxes pursuant to FSA 80:1-a.

1998 Town Meeting Article #11

To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict year-end surpluses of revenue from the Colebrook Dispatch Center to expenditures for the purpose of Dispatch Center? Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund to be known as the Colebrook Dispatch Center Reserve Fund, separate from the General Fund. Any surplus in said fund shall not be deemed part of the General Fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body for a specific purpose of the fund of source of the revenue.

1998 Town Meeting Article #14

To see if the Town will vote to clarify the separation of the Special Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, as represented on the trustees of the Trust Funds 1998 year end report, in the following manner: \$18,506.03 of the sums accumulated to be spent toward the purchase of a police cruiser and \$27,759.05 of the sums accumulated to be spent toward the purchase of highway equipment.

1998 Town Meeting Article #27

To see if the Town will vote to discontinue and release from public servitude the section of road previously the Old Route 3 from Piper Hill Road, South to the present Route 3.

Official Town Meeting Minutes
March 9, 1999
Town of Colebrook, New Hampshire

The Moderator, Philip Waystack, declared the 1999 Annual Town Meeting open at 7:00 p.m. Father Bellefeuille gave the opening prayer, followed by the people present reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moderator Waystack asked the people present to observe a moment of silence for the loss of a good friend and dedicated public servant, George Gould. George was a selectman for the Town of Colebrook.

Article 1 To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

Article 2 To act upon all of the following articles contained in this warrant.

Article 3 Steve Brooks made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,237,000 for the purposes of completing the **Colebrook Wastewater Facility Upgrade and Industrial Park Expansion**. Such sum to be used for the purpose of preparing plans and specifications, permit applications, land acquisitions and/or easements and for the construction of the Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade and Industrial Park Expansion. Said sums to be raised from federal, state and local revenue sources previously obtained. Said sources are as follows: \$1,000,000 from the Economic Development Administration grant, \$700,000 from the Community Development Block Grant, \$404,000 from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services grant and \$133,000 from the Town's sewer savings account. No additional funding will be raised through taxation. This will be a non-lapsing appropriation for two years or until the project is completed, whichever is sooner. Sally Wentzell seconded the motion and the motion carried with a voice vote.

Article 4 A motion was made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the sum of \$288,338.00 for **General Government**:

1) Executive	\$72,931.00
2) Election, Registration and Vital Statistics	\$13,345.00
3) Financial Admin/Tax Collection/Treasurer	\$61,390.00
4) Planning Zoning	\$ 5,817.00
5) Legal and Data Processing	\$38,500.00

7) Interest on long-term notes	\$15,000.00
8) Principal on long-term notes	\$35,000.00
9) Economic Development	\$ 4,000.00

After discussion, Jules Kennett made a motion to amend this article by reducing the sum sought to be raised and appropriated from \$288,338.00 to a reduction of \$246,338. Barbara Kennett seconded the amendment. The motion as amended failed with a voice vote. The motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$288,338.00 for General Government then passed with a voice vote.

- Article 5** Steve Brooks made a motion to discontinue the **Land and Property Reappraisal Fund**. Said funds, approximately **\$14,000.00**, are to be transferred to the town's general fund. Sally Wentzell seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 6** Steve Brooks made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$20,000.00** for the purpose of conducting a Town-wide land and mobile home update at a cost of about **\$7,500.00**, Gas Pipeline update, at a cost of about **\$5,000** and for the Town's **Annual Assessing Update**. The sum of **\$14,000** to be raised from the closure of the Land and Property Reappraisal Fund and **\$6,000** to be raised by taxation. Passage of this article is contingent on the passage of Article 5. Sally Wentzell seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 7** A motion was made by Steve Brooks and seconded by Sally Wentzell to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$178,755.00** for the **Police Department**. Bud Hulse questioned the status of the negotiations between the police department and dispatch personnel. Steve Brooks answered that the Town is currently in fact-finding. The motion as made passed with a voice vote.
- Article 8** A motion made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$25,000.00** from the **Capital Equipment Reserve Fund** for the purchase and outfitting of a new police cruiser passed with a voice vote.
- Article 9** Steve Brooks made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$107,240.00** for the **Colebrook Dispatch Center**, of which **\$41,444.65** will be raised through taxation and the remainder to be offset by revenues raised from the participating towns. The motion passed with a voice vote.
- Article 10** A motion made by Steve Brooks and seconded by Sally Wentzell to discontinue the **Dispatch Center Capital Reserve Fund** established under the provisions of RSA 35:1 and to use the sum of **\$9,500.00** to offset the operating cost of the Colebrook Dispatch Center passed with a voice vote.
- Article 11** Steve Brooks made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict year-end surpluses of revenue from the Colebrook Dispatch Center to expenditures for the purpose of Dispatch Center. Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund to be known as the **Colebrook Dispatch Center Reserve Fund**, separate from the General Fund. Any surplus in such fund shall not be deemed part of the General Fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body for a specific purpose of the fund of source of the revenue. The motion passed with a voice vote.
- Article 12** A motion made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the amount of **\$13,750.00** for **Public Safety** purposes passed with a voice vote.
- Article 13** Sally Wentzell made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$25,000.00** to be added to the existing **Equipment Purchasing Capital Reserve Fund** with the sum of **\$15,000.00** to be used for the purchase of highway equipment and the sum of **\$10,000.00** for the purchase of a new police cruiser. Steve Brooks seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

Article 14 A motion was made by Sally Wentzell, seconded by Steve Brooks, to clarify the separation of the **Special Equipment Capital Reserve Fund**, as represented on the Trustees of the Trust Funds 1998 year-end report, in the following manner: \$18,506.03 of the sums accumulated to be spent toward the purchase of a police cruiser and \$27,759.05 of the sums accumulated to be spent toward the purchase of highway equipment. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 15 Steve Brooks made a motion to raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary (\$5,050) for **Welfare** for the ensuing year. Sally Wentzell seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

Article 16 Sally Wentzell made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$213,955.00 for the **Colebrook Water Works** and the **Colebrook Sewer Facilities**: Steve Brooks seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

1) Water Department	\$135,325.00
2) Sewer Department	\$ 78,630.00

Article 17 Steve Brooks made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$304,900.00 for the expense and maintenance of **Highways and Streets** for the ensuing year:

1) Highways	\$261,900.00
2) Street Lighting	\$ 23,000.00
3) Snow Plowing	\$ 20,000.00

Steve explained that the plan was to gravel the **L. Forbes Road** to help take care of the mud problem in the spring. It is planned to rip up and repair the water mains on **Couture Street**, then lay down new gravel. Paving should also occur on **Mountain View Lane**, **Gould Street** and the **Transfer Station Road**.

Donald Dickson asked if the town had considered a long-range plan. He stated that the roads were in the worse condition he had seen in 66 years. Others agreed. Ross Holt suggested that town consider a **Road Management Bond Improvement Plan**. The motion as read passed with a voice vote.

Article 18 Sally Wentzell made a motion, seconded by Steve Brooks, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$110,160.00 for the maintenance and expenses of the **Transfer Station** for the ensuing year. She explained that the biggest part of the increase in this item was due to the tipping fees more than doubling. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 19 A motion was made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 to be added to the **Sanitary Landfill Closure Fund**. Such sum represents the estimated property tax revenue of the Portland Natural Gas pipeline. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 20 Steve Brooks made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,675.00 for the **Recycling Program**. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 21 A motion made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for **Parks and Patriotic** purposes passed with a voice vote.

Article 22 Steve Brooks made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$39,790.00 for the **Colebrook Recreation Department**. Sally Wentzell seconded the motion. Chris Martin, recreation director, was given a round of applause for the outstanding job she has done in the short time the department has been in existence. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 23 Sally Wentzell made a motion, seconded by Steve Brooks, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$39,115.00 for the following agencies: The motion carried with a voice vote.

Carroll Jackson, Library Trustee, called the Moderator's attention to a typographical error in Article 24. It should read, "balance on hand January 1, 1999", rather than "balance on hand January 1, 1998."

Article 24 Carroll Jackson made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$83,612.00 for the support of the **Colebrook Public Library**, \$61,763.00 of which to be raised through taxation and \$21,849.00 of which to come from other sources such as Library balance on hand January 1, 1999, book sales, donations, trust funds, non-resident fees, other communities, over due fines, book resale's, copying fees etc., such funds to be expended under the direction of the Board of Library Trustees. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 25 A motion made by Sally Wentzell and seconded by Steve Brooks to raise and appropriate the sum of \$36,888.00 for the operation and maintenance of the **Colebrook Cemeteries**, the sum of \$21,888.00 to be raised through taxation and \$15,000 to be raised from burials, cemetery trust funds and other Colebrook Cemetery revenues passed with a voice vote.

Article 26 Sally Wentzell made a motion, seconded by Steve Brooks, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the **Cemetery Expendable Trust Fund**. Such funds to be transferred from the December 31, 1999 general fund balance. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 27 Steve Brooks made a motion, seconded by Sally Wentzell, to discontinue and release from public servitude the section of road previously the old Route 3 from Piper Hill Road, south to present Route 3. Steve explained that the section of road in question is on Jack Riendeau's property and does the town no good. By selling it, it would go back into the tax base. Bernie Hicks asked if the old road that circles up in front of the house was part of this article. Steve answered that that portion of the road was not in question. Gary Dinco asked if it was true that the town would not be liable or responsible in the future for anything if the road is turned over. The answer was in the affirmative. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 28 Ronald Hughes made a motion, seconded by Carroll Jackson, to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of the Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town officers. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 29 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting:

Sylvia Collins was given a standing round of applause for her seventeen years as Library Trustee.

Meg Sheltry made a suggestion that the yellow budget pages be numbered next year so the material in discussion could be more easily found.

Bud Hulse asked if it would be appropriate to not adjourn the meeting, but only recess it, due to negotiations still being conducted for the police department and dispatch personnel.

Jonathan Frizzell made a motion to restrict reconsideration of all other articles passed here this evening. Ronald Hughes seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

Brent Lyons made a motion to recess the meeting to a time not specified until such time as negotiations are completed. Bud Hulse seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

The Moderator declared the meeting recessed at 9:45 pm.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

As I write this in early September, I can easily say that 1999 was a year of transition for the town and myself. The town saw an old police chief go and a new chief arrive. The transition to a new town manager will be the next transition. And of course as the calendars rolled on December 31st we saw the transition to a new century.

Again I must thank every employee of the town for doing a superb job throughout the year. Through their efforts and a blessed spring, without the hardship of yearly mud, we were able to accomplish a number of visible and not so visible projects. On L. Forbes Road, the town laid fabric to help alleviate the severe mud problems in that area, hopefully cutting off another spring like 1998's horrendous mud problems. I am sure everyone has noticed the new pavement at the transfer station. The highway department will save a lot of time and energy, and of course cost, with the new pavement in place. In an effort to extend the life expectancy of our roads, two new programs were started in an effort to rid our roads of their number one enemy, water. Crack sealing was done for the first time in 1999, and with new pavement being laid, an aggressive crack sealing program can extend the life expectancy of a road for several years, meaning a significant cost savings to the town. Also Catch Basin Cleaners was up to clean half our storm drains and the plan is to do the other half this year.

The town's assessor's, Avitar Associates, began the first phase of our land and mobile home update by updating all of the mobile homes in town. When both the land and mobile homes are completed, the assessed value of property in town should return to a more fair and equitable assessment of the town.

Internally the automation of our dispatch and police records keeping systems is an understanding way in which to bring these departments efficiently into the 21st century. The software provides easy access to information, convenient and effective storage of the information and enhances the efficiency of both departments.

Looking forward into the coming year, we should finally see the completion of our wastewater treatment plant upgrade, allowing the sewer department to lift the moratorium on new users and the long awaited new industrial building that will hopefully hatch a new business.

Looking toward the future, the newfound wealth from the gas pipeline offers the town a unique opportunity to initiate an aggressive capital improvement program while still lowering taxes and continuing to address the future closure of the landfill.

To everyone in the community, I thank you for your kindness and hospitality. All of our departments have had another busy year. And for the efforts of all of our town employees I owe a large debt of thanks. Best of luck to everyone for a productive and prosperous 21st century.

COLEBROOK POLICE REPORT

During the course of the past year (1999), I had the privilege of becoming your new Police Chief. Within the past months I have attempted to improve the relationship between the Department and the Community by becoming more visible and more Community oriented. I would like to take this opportunity to discuss the new implementations and future innovations, which I feel, are in the Town's best interest regarding the security within this Community.

In the past year the Department acquired some new personnel in Full-Time and Part-Time Officer positions. Including myself, we now have (4) Full Time Officers and (3) Part Time. All of these officers are very dedicated in providing the type of service, which you the community, expect of an efficient Police Department.

I would like to take the time to explain what being a police officer in your community entails. Unlike larger Townships, our Town Officer is responsible for reporting incidents both criminal and traffic related, arrests, traffic enforcement, traffic direction, community related functions such as CPAL and DARE. The officer in your community is the report initiator, the detective, the arresting officer and in some cases, the prosecutor which is a monumental task regarding the necessary paperwork.

Today's officers have to be a multi-talented/faceted individual and very knowledgeable regarding the law and its application. Very shortly, the State will require Full Time officers to have at least a two-year college degree or its equivalent.

With the above in mind, I have obtained several officers who have either prior experience or the capabilities to produce and protect at a very high level. This is obtained through extensive testing, background checks, proficiency/upgrade training. Training is an annual requirement but this department will be undertaking training, which will be over and above the mandatory requirements.

During the course of this year we have one primary concern. What will the year 2000 mean for our community? Only time can tell but what this Police Department can assure you is that we will constantly improve and develop new techniques to keep you and your families safe. We have made tremendous technological advances regarding equipment such as: (1) In-Car Video/Audio, (2) Interview/Booking Room Video Equipment and Multi-User Software to facilitate our Reporting System. These above endeavors have all been made possible through Grants from the N.H. Attorney General's Office, N.H. Highway and Safety and donations from N.H. M.A.D.D. & S.A.D.D. These Grants were made possible by the efforts of Officer Jimmy Crossley who has been assigned this task of applying for these Grants. I would like to personally thank him for a job well done.

Over the course of the last year this Department has continued the State's policy of Zero tolerance for Driving While Intoxicated and other Liquor Law violations such as Unlawful Possession and Unlawful Transport. This concept will be maintained and will be enforced even more stringently because it is my opinion that most instances of offense stem

from ALCOHOL related causes. This will be easier due to gaining the In-car video system, which will be a great asset in DWI Field Sobriety Tests.

Our new Records Management System (IMC) went into effect on December 1, 1999. We will be able from this point on to maintain all calls for service and other associated records by computer which makes the task of reporting requirements much easier.

Last but not least, several agencies should receive acknowledgement for their support of our community: N.H. State Police, N.H. Fish & Game, and other local police & fire agencies.

In closing we shall never forget those members of our law enforcement that have made the ultimate sacrifice in serving the community. God Bless them and their Families.

Public Works Report for 1999

This year we laid road fabric and gravel on the L. Forbes road for a distance of 1,585 feet, starting at Ginger Jannenga's property and ending at the Reed Cemetery. This work should alleviate the extreme mud problems in that section of roadway for the next ten or eleven years.

The old pavement on Mountain View Lane and Gould Street was ground up and then these streets, along with the Transfer Station Road, were repaved with new pavement.

This past year half of the water meters in town were replaced with touch pad meters. We hope to replace the remainder this coming year.

The sewer ejector pit on Edwards Street was rebuilt this year. The design phase of the sewer treatment plant upgrade and the industrial park improvements have been completed and approved by all agencies involved. Construction should begin in the spring of 2000.

It is our hope to rebuild Pleasant Street from Cross Street east this coming year. Couture Street is also in the planning for a new water main, storm drains, and paving.

Future plans for street reconstruction are as follows if money and time permit. In 2001, we would like to see the sewer on Park Street rebuilt, and in conjunction, repave Merrill Street. It is hoped that Academy Street could be done at the same time. Edwards Street should get an overlay of pavement. High Street and the east end of Spring Street should be rebuilt. In 2002, Colby Street should be shimmed and overlaid with pavement. We would like to see Monadnock Street, Brandy Lee Lane, Dumont Street and Hill Avenue repaved in 2003. In 2004 Cross Street should be rebuilt and paving the gravel streets left in town should be considered.

Outside the precinct:

It is hoped we can complete the following plans for roads outside the precinct:

- 2000: Rebuild Reed Road from Bruce Hawes's 2000 feet east.
- 2001: Rebuild Piper Hill Road along the relatively flat section of road at the top of the hill for a distance of 2000 feet.
- 2002: Pave East Colebrook Road from Route 26 to L. Forbes Road.
Pave Keazers hill.
- 2003: Pave Titus Hill Road from Spring Street to Skyline Drive.
- 2004: Finish paving Titus Hill Road

We are also trying crack sealing on our roads, which should extend the life of our paved roads.

COLEBROOK RECREATION DEPARTMENT REPORT

As 1999 began, so started the first full year of recreational programming. The biggest challenge to the department is having a building or facility of our own. Many places and organizations have allowed me to use or rent their facility and I would like to thank them. These individuals or organizations play an important role in the development of the recreation department.

This year Fran Bigney and I started **HOAP (Healthy Older Adult Program)**. This is a grant-based program geared to help our maturing population of the area. The goal of the program is to come up with a measure of how active and healthy this population is. After completion of the six-month grant program, we will have an idea of how to develop programming for the healthy older adults in our area.

The youth soccer program saw a 20% increase over last fall. There were almost 90 children playing soccer this fall in our two leagues, which are divided into grades 1 – 3 and grades 4 – 6. I would like to thank all the parents that came out to watch each game this fall. A big thank you to all of those who helped coach and gave support from the sidelines. As summer slowly approaches, we look forward to our first soccer camp, to be conducted by **Play Soccer**.

Youth basketball increased its numbers this season from 30 participants to about 45 basketball players. Many of these players have moved on to play on either the schools' pee wee basketball teams or the recreation department's newly formed 3rd and 4th grade travel teams. We would like to give these kids more playing time, but are limited to whenever we can use the gym.

Our men's basketball league returned this season with a strong numbers of participants. The men's league plays games every Sunday evening from mid-November to mid-March. We have also started adult coed volleyball on Sunday afternoons. Everyone is welcome to come out and participate in a pick up style game where anyone and everyone who shows up gets a chance to play.

The summer of 1999 introduced the first full summer program for the recreation department. We tried a variety of summer activities, including lacrosse, sports bugs, arts & crafts, sports club, basketball skills and many other activities. We had a fair turn out for these activities, and I would like to thank all my summer staff for giving me an extra hand running the programs. They made the summer more enjoyable for those that participated. The summer staff consisted of Sara Gooch, who worked for the Town of Colebrook, along with three talented individuals from the summer youth works program. These students were Chuck Patterson, Aaron Dinco and Vicky MacLean.

As we look to this summer I hope to increase the number of children participating in the summer program. We will try to offer some of the same programs as last summer, while adding new programs such as day camps, trips camp, and hopefully some science camps. If any parents or individuals have any suggestions on what may interest their children, please feel free to contact me at 237-4070 at any time.

The recreation department is always investigating programs and new and exciting things for people to do. We will continue to add more programs and activities for all to participate in. With each new year, we will try to meet the challenges of the programming needs with the major goal covering all ages from 2 – 99.

Tax Collector's Report

I was appointed tax collector in September when our previous town manager, John Groulx, resigned to take another position as a town administrator in Maryland.

This year has certainly been an interesting year for tax collectors. The State of New Hampshire instituted a state education tax, which was changed several times. These changes were the reason tax bills were not mailed until December 1st, 1999. The last day to pay taxes was January 3rd, 2000 and the unpaid tax list in this town report is printed as of January 4th, 2000.

Due to banks paying escrow accounts late and there being no grace period between the last day to pay taxes and the date the unpaid tax list is printed in the town report, you will see names on this report that have never been listed in the past.

The 1999 tax rate of \$23.07 in precinct and \$21.63 out of precinct is a \$9.25 decrease from 1998's tax rate. The tax rate reduction is attributed to the new education tax, as well as tax dollars generated from the gas pipeline assessment. The state's share of tax revenue from all utilities was taxed directly by the state and amounted to \$74,642.72.

No one knows what the state will enact for education bills during the coming year, but hopefully, Colebrook's tax rate will not have to increase dramatically.

As usual, I have enjoyed working with all taxpayers and residents of Colebrook and look forward to working with you during the coming year. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the office at 237-4142.

This was an extremely busy year with a lot of additions, new homes and secondary homes being built. The Board also had many inquiries and issued many permits that will be completed in 2000. It looks to be another busy year.

The Colebrook Planning Board also agreed to accept the Connecticut River Joint Commission Plan. It is a plan recommending the best management practices for the area regarding agriculture, forestry, and development as it pertains to the Connecticut River. Kevin McKinnon sat on this board for six years. Planning Board members felt that, if the town were to have some say as far as state regulations, it would be important to accept the Commission's plan.

Fred Miller was elected to the Select Board in March and had to resign his position on the Planning Board. As is the practice, as first-year Selectman, he became the Selectmen's delegate to the Board. The current Board consists of: Eugene Jannenga, Chairman; James Stewart; Laurence Rappaport; Edward Carrier with alternates Joe Ippolito and Mike Ouellet. Sheila Beauchemin acts as the clerk.

The Board is thankful to the Colebrook citizens and is looking forward to working for and serving them another year.

REPORT ON THE COLEBROOK CEMETERIES

Colebrook has within its boundaries four cemeteries of which the trustees are responsible for three. The fourth is the private Roman Catholic cemetery on South Main Street just north of the Shrine.

The Cemetery Trustees have the responsibility of being the general overseers of the care and maintenance of the three cemeteries. However, in as much as the bulk of the money raised for the maintenance comes from perpetual trusts, the trustees of the Trust Funds of Colebrook are charged by State law with the task of insuring that the trust money is used as the original donors expected it to be.

Village Cemetery:

The village Cemetery is located on U.S. Route 3 at the northern edge of the village. The bulk of the old cemeteries trust funds are dedicated to this cemetery.

Reed Cemetery:

The Reed Cemetery is located in East Colebrook at the junction of the Forbes and Reed Roads. With one exception the rules that apply to the burials in the Village Cemetery apply to those of the Reed Cemetery. The exception is that, due to the limited space available for future burials, only those persons with either a strong family connection to the cemetery or own their lots may be buried in that cemetery.

Titus Hill Cemetery:

This cemetery is located on Titus Hill Road, east of the village. Since there are no maps associated with this cemetery and no records exist of where the old graves are located this cemetery, for all practical purposes, is closed to future burials.

St. Brendan's Cemetery:

This is a private cemetery under the control of St. Brendan's Catholic Church in Colebrook; with the exception that the town annually provides a sum of money to assist in its maintenance we exercise no jurisdiction over its operation. All trust funds that were previously held by the Trustees pertaining to persons buried in this cemetery were turned over (with State approval) to the St. Brendan Trustees in the early 1980's.

Cemetery Trust Funds:

There are five different types of trust funds relating to the village cemeteries: perpetual care, cleaning of tombstones, flowers, trees and shrubs, and general maintenance.

NOTE:

It should be stressed here that the Colebrook Trustees of the Trust funds are not bound to accept bequeaths from wills or otherwise perform task which they feel are not in the best interest of the Town. (e.g. further flower funds.) The Trustees may reject such bequeaths. Consequently, should lawyers or persons drawing up wills call for advice, it is strongly urged that the Trustees advise the person plainly that any bequests against Trustees policy will not be accepted.

Perpetual Care:

This is by far the largest number of trust funds held by the Trustees of the Trust Funds. They can be divided into three types:

- a. **RESTRICTED:** the oldest and largest number of trust funds. These are set up so that the interest is used only for the maintenance of a specified lot.
- b. **NON-RESTRICTED:** in the early 1980's the wording of the perpetual care trust funds was changed to allow the excess interest accumulated from each new trust to be used for the care of the cemetery as a whole.
- c. **GENERAL TRUSTS:** starting in 1986, by a vote of the town's people at the Annual Town Meeting, it was decided to do away with specific trusts. Perpetual care funds are now transferred to a general cemetery trust fund, and except for the year that the money was received, the identity of the trust is no longer kept separate. We do, however, keep a name card on file of these trusts for reference purposes.

Cleaning of Stones:

There are three trusts that contain within their instructions wording that call for occasional cleaning of the tombstones. These instructions are to be honored as long as adequate funds are available over and above the general care and maintenance of the lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted, as the Cemetery Trustee's have initiated a cleaning and reclamation program for the complete cemetery.

Flower Funds:

Originally there were twenty-four (24) lots for which flower funds had been established. These called for flowers to be placed on the lots each Memorial Day. These requests have been honored as long as funds were available to maintain the lots and purchase the flowers. Only nine (9) remain with sufficient funds. Annually (just before Memorial Day) the Trustees of the Trust Funds will contact one of the local flower shops and contract the placement of the flowers on the respective lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted.

(All lot locations are based on Nancy Dodge's register of cemetery plots and are all located in the Village Cemetery)

Trees and Shrubs:

This fund was established by Elizabeth and Nellie Young to beautify the Village Cemetery. It can be used for the purchase of trees and shrubs, perennials, etc. little or nothing of the account had been used over the years, and as a result it has grown to considerable size. Presently, approximately \$500 is withdrawn each year to trim the hedges and shrubs.

General Maintenance:

Frank Leonard left money for the general care and maintenance of the Village Cemetery. The interest of this fund has been used primarily to paint the wrought iron fence.

Tibbett's Family Trust:

These funds are to be used to create and maintain the Tibbett's Memorial Park, and such other programs that will add to the beauty of the cemetery. The expenditure of these funds is to be determined annually by the Trustees of the Trust funds in conjunction with the Cemetery Trustees.

New Cemetery Trusts:

The purchase price of a new lot includes both the costs of the lot and the perpetual care. It is paid to the Treasurer of the Cemetery Trustees, who then turns it over to the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

COLEBROOK CEMETERY TRUSTEES REPORT

With forty committals this has been a very busy and sorrowful year. Once again the Cemetery Trustees wish to express their grateful appreciation to our sexton Roland B. Martin and his workers Robert Grassette, Louis Roy, and Michael Martin, for the excellent maintenance of our cemeteries. They have continued on with the program of cleaning and washing the head stones, lifting, leveling and straightening head and foot stones, as well as, filling in and reseeding sunken graves. It certainly has greatly added to the appearance of the cemetery grounds.

Ellie Gooch and Virginia Stickney placed planters of flowers at the entrance of the Colebrook Village Cemetery, which adds greatly to the beauty of the cemetery, and we want to express our special thanks to them. At Christmas Ellie showed the true spirit of Christmas by placing Christmas Wreaths on the gates at the Main entrance to the Colebrook Village Cemetery.

Two of our trustees, Frances and Jean Haynes assisted by Ellie Gooch spent many hours planting, watering, and caring for the beautiful floral display in the area of the old tomb. Your fellow board members want to thank each of you so much for all you have done.

The section of the cemetery that was cleared and leveled last spring for single burial plots has been named the Abner and Laura Bean Memorial Park.

This year we are placing a warrant article in the Town Meeting Warrant to create a cemetery fence expendable trust fund. We would appreciate any person wishing to help by purchasing a section in memory of loved ones.

There are four projects the trustees are committed to for future improvements and they are:

1. Paving the remaining entranceways up to the hedge line.
2. Rebuilding the existing road system.
3. Replacing some of the damaged hedges in both the Village and Reed Cemeteries.
4. Placement of a new fence along route 3, this being a very costly project it will be spread out over a period of years so as not to greatly increase the yearly working budget.

TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

In Planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the Town of Colebrook, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 1998, we considered the Town's internal control structure to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance of the internal control structure.

However, during our audit we became aware of the following conditions that should be corrected in order to strengthen internal controls and operating efficiency. This letter does not affect our report dated May 20, 1999, on the financial statements of the Town of Colebrook, New Hampshire.

Our following remarks are being made in the hope that they will improve existing procedures and are in no way a criticism of Town personnel.

1. Trust Funds

It was noted in the audit of the Trust Funds that the Trustees transferred money from income to principal in the Cemetery Trust.

Recommendation

Additions to principal should only come from sale of cemetery lots or from capital gains on investments. The Trustees cannot arbitrarily move funds from income to principal.

2. Tax Collector Abatements

Errors were noted in the way some abatements were handled in the accounting system.

Recommendation

Abatements after payment are accounted for in the general ledger only and have no effect on the Tax Collector's records. Abatements before payment must be processed by the Tax Collector as well as shown as a reduction in taxes receivable in the Town's balance sheet.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town for their assistance during the course of our audit.

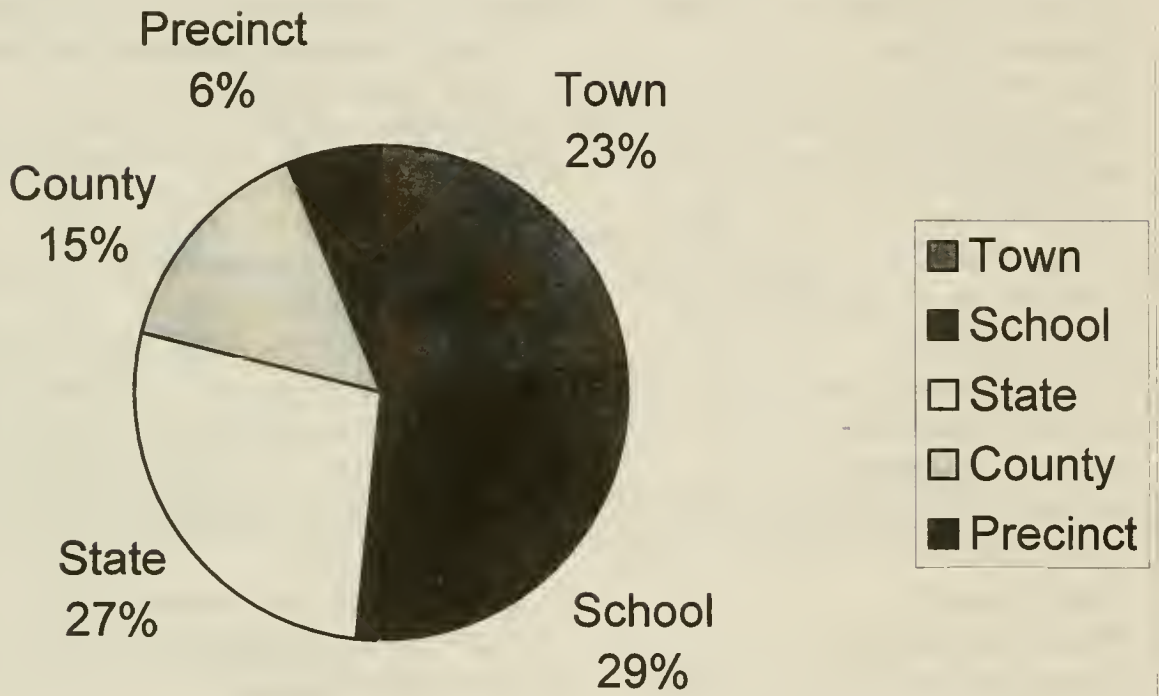

Scrap Metal	All metal items including car parts, toys and metal roofing. There is a disposal fee for refrigerators and air conditioners.	Please remove all non-metal parts and follow instructions regarding fees and/or placement.
Motor Vehicle Batteries	All wet-cell batteries from cars, trucks, motorcycles, snow mobiles etc.	Use caution-handling batteries. Place in designated areas.
