Story behind the Cover
St. Stephen's Episcopal Church

“Many of the young folks in town today are surprised to learn that the Episcopal Church in Colebrook is one of the oldest in town. The fact that a church could be in existence for nearly a century and have no shelter of its own is hard to visualize – yet this is the story of St. Stephen's Church. Confusion exists perhaps because they fail to realize that a church is the people of the faith, and not the building that houses them.

It all began in the early 1800's when a handful of Episcopalians gathered in the old log schoolhouse on the Mohawk to worship, as did other groups of the day. They had no minister or lay reader, and it was not until 1820, when John Lane Sheafe, one of the early lawyers, appeared on the scene, that services were regularly conducted.” From “*Colebrook, A Place Up Back of New Hampshire*” by Dr. William H. “The lot on which the church now stands was purchased in 1909 through the efforts of Dr. George W. Dickson, a long time Colebrook dentist and the original owner of Dickson's Pharmacy. He was Chairman of the Building Committee, and with the church leadership of Marion Hordley Noyes, began to raise funds for a permanent structure.

Rev. Dunstan, with the help of Rev. Harte, raised enough funds to start preliminary construction. The corner stone was laid on October 6th, 1912, by Bishop Parker. The first service was held in the basement on the 30th of August 1914, when Dr. Leonard W. Harris, Jr. (a local doctor and the son of a former minister of the Congregational Church in Colebrook) did the Morning Prayer. At the next service (September 6th), Bishop Parker presided and consecrated the church. Attendance at that service was reported to have been 120.” From *A History of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church*, by Rev. Granvyl G. Hulse, Jr.

1973 Town Meeting Article #48

Provided indemnification for Town Officers and employees.

1994 Town Meeting Article #3

Ballot vote: Shall we adopt an exemption for the totally and permanently disabled? Motion made and passed.

1994 Town Meeting Article #30

Authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. Until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #31

Authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #33

Accept the provision of RSA 33:7 until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes.

1995 Town Meeting Article #5

Library to retain all money it receives from its income-generating equipment to be used for general repairs, etc. Until rescinded. (RSA 202.A:11, 11-b)

1995 Town Meeting #24

Voted to discontinue absolutely that portion of Spring Street commencing one hundred and fifty feet (150') above the present driveway to the residence of Robert and Kelly Lemieux to the intersection of Titus Hill road.

Official Town Meeting Minutes
March 14, 2006
Colebrook, New Hampshire

Moderator Jon Frizzell declared the Annual Town Meeting opened at 7 p.m. All in attendance stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a prayer conducted by Father Bellefeuille.

Article 1 To bring in your ballots for the selection of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

Article 2 To see how the Town will vote on the following three proposed amendments to the Colebrook Zoning Ordinance, to be voted on by official ballot. Copies of the complete proposals, as well as the current Zoning Ordinance, were available for review at the Town Clerk's Office, and were available during the election.

Amendment # 1: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Article IV, Section 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Colebrook as follows:

No new lot shall be approved by the Planning Board unless it has at least 150 feet of frontage either on a public street or on a private street approved by the Planning Board. No building whose use requires an approved sewage disposal system under Town or State law shall be constructed on any lot without at least 150 feet of frontage on a public street or approved private street, unless that lot legally existed as a separate lot, as reflected by properly-recorded plans or deeds, prior to March 14, 2006; provided, however, that all such buildings shall be in compliance with the current RSA.

Amendment #3: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to Article IV, Section 11 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Colebrook as follows:

3) A temporary sign (one placed outdoors for 30 days or less) is allowed without a permit or fee, provided however that: (a) prior to the erection of the sign, the Town of Colebrook shall be notified of the sign, its location, and expected time of removal, using a form provided by the Town; (b) the date of sign placement shall be shown on the sign itself in letters easily read from street level; (c) no temporary sign shall violate the provision of Subsection D, "Prohibited Signs"; and (d) any temporary sign remaining in place for a combined total of more than 30 days without a permit shall be a violation of this Ordinance. (Placement would be in Section 11.B as subparagraph #7.)

Irene Bean questioned the location of the new burn dump on South Hill Road. She remarked that the fire was less than two feet from the fir trees and no one appeared to be present, creating a safety issue. Town Manager Donna Caron stated the site had been approved by the State; however, taking into consideration the concerns aired, the Selectboard perhaps should review their decision to make this a permanent site. **The motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 4 Moderator Frizzell stated that a petition for a secret ballot on this Article had been received; therefore, this Article would be passed over until ballot clerks were available for ballot vote.

Article 5 Greg Placey made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$212,501.00** for the following **Capital Reserve Funds**. Moreover, to see if the Town will vote to list the Selectmen as agents to expend from these trust funds until rescinded.

1) Equipment Purchase (1999)	\$ 45,000.00
2) Police Cruiser (1999)	\$ 15,000.00
3) Digital Mapping (2005)	\$ 35,000.00

Larry Rappaport seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 6 Larry Rappaport made a motion, seconded by Grey Placy, to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$ 532,481.00** for the **Colebrook Water Works and the Colebrook Sewer Facilities**.

1) Water Department	\$ 329,840.00
2) Sewer Department	\$ 202,641.00

Granvyl Hulse asked the status of the new wells. Larry Rappaport explained that land had been purchased across from the State Rest Area on Route 3; test wells had been approved

by the State and it appears there will be enough water for at least two production wells. **The motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 7 Greg Placy made a motion, seconded by Larry Rappaport to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$95,746.00** for the support of the **Colebrook Public Library**, \$85,116.00 of which to be raised through taxation and \$10,630.00 of which is to come from other Library balance on hand January 1, 2005, book sales, donations, trust funds, non-resident fees, other communities, over due fines, book resale's, copying fees etc., such funds to be expended under the direction of the Board of Library Trustees. **The motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 8 Larry Rappaport made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$66,487.00** for the operation and maintenance of the **Colebrook Cemeteries**, the sum of \$54,487.00 to be raised through taxation and \$12,000.00 to be raised from burials, cemetery trust funds and other Colebrook Cemetery revenues. **Greg Placy seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 9 Larry Rappaport made a motion, seconded by Greg Placy, to raise and appropriate the sum of up to **\$10,000.00** to be added to the **Colebrook Cemetery Grounds Maintenance and Reclamation Fund** (Expendable Trust created 2005), and to authorize the use of the December 31, 2005 fund balance in that amount for this purpose. **The motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 10 Greg Placy made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$201,514.00** for the **Colebrook Dispatch Center**, (Capital Fund created 1999) of which \$ 120,023.26 will be raised through taxation, \$17,700.00 will be withdrawn from the Colebrook Dispatch Savings Equipment Fund and the remainder to be offset by revenues raised from the participating towns. **Larry Rappaport seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.**

Article 11 Larry Rappaport made a motion to modify the elderly exemptions from property tax in the town of Colebrook , based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers, to be as follows: for a person 68 years of age or older, **\$15,000.00**. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 5 years, own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$13,400.00 or, if married, a combined net income of less than \$20,400.00; and own net assets not in excess of \$35,000.00 excluding the value of the person's residence. **Greg Placy seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 12 Greg Placy made a motion to authorize the Selectmen to grant a fifty-foot (50') right-of-way to Morris Sage across the southeast corner of land owned by the Town known as the "Parsons Lot" (Tax Map #114-16) located off Lynch Road. (By Petition) **Larry Rappaport seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 13 Granvyl Hulse made a motion, seconded by Camilla Stewart, to **accept, ratify and confirm** the reports of the Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers. **The motion passed with a voice vote.**

Article 4 John Fothergill made a motion, seconded by Sharon Nelsson, to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$100,450.00** for the support of the Colebrook Ambulance Corps Building Fund, which will house the ambulances that provide emergency services for the Town." (By Petition) Moderator Jon Frizzell recognized Ed Laverty to address the article. With the aide

of a PowerPoint presentation, Mr. Lavery reviewed the history of the ambulance corp., finances and why this question appeared on the warrant. Discussion ensued regarding who would own the building, be responsible for maintenance and whether a committee should be formed for collaboration between the ambulance corp., fire department, radio dispatch, selectman, and hospital board personnel.

Moderator Frizzell read the petition requesting that Article 4 be a secret written ballot and the polls were opened. The motion was defeated with the following ballot results:

Linda Haynes and Sandra Riendeau expressed their desire to have the school board members and selectmen hold budget hearings and annual meetings together and informed the public present that they had a petition available for signature to that affect.

Town Manager Donna Caron thanked Greg Placy for his three years of service as selectman.

Terrence Rosi asked the Selectmen to look periodically at the affect the continuous large truck traffic to the landfill is having on Titus Hill Road. He felt the Selectboard should keep the residents of Titus Hill updated regarding this project and check with the residents more frequently to hear their concerns.

Ronald Hughes made a motion, seconded by Camilla Stewart, to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 8:55 p.m.

Tax Collector and Town Manager Report

Some of the challenges that faced the town this year were a statistical update of property values, truck traffic on Titus Hill Road, a flood in June and the need to raise water rates in order to pay for repairs and qualify for grants.

Each year the town fills out a state form listing all property sales, assessed values and selling values. After town officials and assessors reviewed this form, they saw that the majority of assessed values were much less than the selling prices. The assessors advised the board to conduct a statistical update to correct this problem. Most property owners saw an increase in their value and consequently paid more taxes. When values increase, the tax rate should decrease accordingly, unless higher budgets were voted in at the annual meetings. The town portion of the tax rate did decrease but not enough to offset the other rate increases. In the past the full value, but not the current use value, has been listed on the property tax cards. The Board of Selectmen voted to include the current use value on the cards so that the current use property owners would have access to all their property values. The office staff was very busy assisting the property owner's through these processes.

If you have a tax problem, please call the main office for assistance. If you do not have the full amount of taxes due by the due date, make a payment with what you have. Making payments will help keep your interest amount lower. The office staff will be glad to help you come up with a payment plan. In past years, the total tax monies unpaid the day after taxes were due equaled 11 or 12 percent. This year that amount equaled 9.2%. The amount unpaid the date names were listed in the town report, January 31st, was down to 8%. This is really good considering the increased values and the state of the local economy. In the unpaid tax list, the 2004 and prior year tax liens will go to deed during 2007. Most of these people will pay before the deed date.

Truck traffic to the landfill on Titus Hill was very heavy this summer. It has slowed down over the winter months, but occasionally drivers cannot make the hill, and that causes safety problems. The landfill attendants have been told to notify dispatch as soon as the road is blocked with the exact location of the blockage. This is so the dispatchers will know which way to send an ambulance or fire truck to ensure the safety of Titus Hill residents.

Before the landfill project started, the town had contamination on the abutter's property. Because of this, the town had to finance the water remediation building and system. New England Waste is paying all other construction and operating expenses. (When the first load of waste was brought into the Landfill New England Waste Systems paid the town a contracted price of \$250,000.00, which, was placed, into the Sanitary Landfill Closure Fund). Following is a small summary of funds spent on the remediation system and the accounts that were used.

In June, flash floods damaged town, state and private property. The town is in the process of applying for a highway grant for the Roaring Brook Road Project and an emergency CDBG grant to replace one water main and repair the other water main where they cross the Mohawk River. The Town Office is working with Senator Sununu's office, the Army Corp. of Engineers and other agencies to obtain grants for the Mohawk River retaining wall project. Matching funds for this project (\$118,950.00) are requested under a capital reserve account in the 2007 budget. Town representatives want to thank Daniel Hebert and Sheldon Gray, who donated their time to look at the river crossings and the retaining wall and figure a preliminary replacement cost, so the town could move forward with their funding requests to different agencies. Town, State and Federal officials have worked together and continue to work toward obtaining a large amount of grant monies for these projects. Because Colebrook was the only town in Coos County with severe damage and the 2006 grant funds were already depleted on other projects, the goal is to apply for 2007 grants. There is a line item in the budget designated as a portion of the town's share of the cost.

In order to replace 100-year-old water mains, the water rates will need to be increased. A study is being conducted to see how the water projects will affect the rates. Town officials are very aware of how much water users will be affected by the rate increase, and have held back on increasing the rates for this reason.

The Town of Colebrook applied for grant monies from the Tillotson Fund and received a \$15,000.00 grant to hire an architect to do preliminary drawings for a walking trail along the Mohawk River. Residents and tourist alike would have a scenic place to walk or have a picnic lunch. This trail could very easily connect the downtown area to the community pool and other points of interest around town.

For child safety purposes a sidewalk is needed along Dumont Street to the Elementary School property. Donald and Jeanne Gilbert and Edward Carrier have agreed to give the town an easement across their properties for this project. Once spring arrives, we will see how feasible it is to use that side of the street.

If Colebrook taxpayers and residents have a problem or complaint, please call the appropriate department. If you do not get results, please call the Town Office. We need to know about the problem so we can fix it.

I want to take this time to thank all town departments - main office staff, town clerk's office, dispatch, police and the public works departments - for your dedication to your jobs and the taxpayers of Colebrook. Colebrook benefits by having you on their team.

Colebrook Police Department Year ending 2006

Town meeting is upon us again and our little town is on the precipice of some major changes. Hopefully, these will come with ease and little anguish.

The police department is in good health. Corporal Joseph Caron should be rejoining the force following his convalescence. We hope he will be back before the town meeting.

Winterset has begun transforming the areas of Route 26 that are most dangerous in our jurisdiction. Construction could last two years so we are asking everyone who must travel that way to be patient. The Police Department is working with the New Hampshire State Police to provide a safe construction zone for the Winterset workers.

There are some trends that are developing with the Internet that the Police Department feel parents should be aware of. There has been an increase in the number of children under the age of 18 utilizing Internet meeting places, such as "My Space" and other chat hosts. Parents should be aware of whom their children are talking to and what they are talking about. Besides the predatory issues involving having access to the Internet, there have been a number of scams that have shown their faces in our town. If there is ever a question about the nature of any Internet contacts, feel free to call the Police Department.

In 2007, the Police Department will look to host more informational meetings about the Internet scams. A number of forged checks appeared in 2006, cashed by unsuspecting businesses. The elderly and destitute were the prime targets of these scams.

Dispatch Center

During the past year, one frequency for all emergency service agencies was established. At the same time volunteers from the North Country fire departments, ambulance corps and police departments worked on one common set of policies and procedures for dispatching all the agencies. All agencies have had trainings and will have future trainings as the need dictates. All procedures are a work in progress and will be updated as problems surface. In an emergency, it is instinct to follow the same procedure you have always used and the dispatch team is working very hard to make these new procedures their first instinct.

Gary Dinco is now the dispatch supervisor. He will assist in upgrading the dispatch equipment, purchasing a unit to house several of the many computers and improve the work environment. Dispatch is looking at a preventative maintenance program for their various computers that is efficient but also cost effective.

Every dispatcher's horror is a snowmobile accident with the injured party not knowing their location. The dispatch team has recently been given snowmobile trail maps including a directory and the software to bring up the location on the 911 computer. This will make snowmobile rescues easier to dispatch and locate for all emergency services.

Too often people use Colebrook's old emergency number to call in an emergency. **The only emergency number is 911.** Calls to report a burn permit should be made to 237-4487. People that currently have an alarm system and people setting up new alarm systems should contact the dispatch center for the new alarm number.

The Colebrook Ambulance Corps which is under the governance of Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital had its busiest year to date. We responded to 508 calls in our community and the surrounding towns. Together with members from Pittsburg ambulance, the Colebrook ambulance did 200 transfers to other hospitals in New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine and Massachusetts. We started the year with our busiest month and the purchase of a new Horton ambulance to do many of the transfers. The ambulance was homeless for the first several months, but now is housed off campus and used on a regular basis for transfers. We started the summer off by finishing an EMT-Basic that began in November 2005 and First Responder class with potential candidates from around the region. These classes were very successful graduating much needed trained personnel. The classes gave the Colebrook Ambulance a boost of manpower with six new EMT-B and three new First Responders members.

Throughout the year Ginger Wharem, (Vice President and Training Officer) organized monthly education for the Corps in addition to the mandatory Refresher training courses. These continuing education sessions are required for maintaining certification and to improve patient care. Local instructors and UCVH staff taught the sessions. The most anticipated training is the annual water rescue, held on Averill Pond this year.

We would like to thank all of the people in the community who have showed and continue to show us their support.

Public Works Report for 2006

The past year was an exciting one for us. We had a localized flood event, causing extensive damage in town. The storm broke over East Colebrook and washed out Roaring Brook Road. When the floodwaters reached town, they snapped off the water main that crosses the Mohawk River on Route 26 (Parsons Street). There is also a water main crossing on Pleasant Street now exposed as the flood scoured the cover material off the pipe. The wall on Academy Street next to Howard's Restaurant has a huge lateral crack in it now due to the water undermining the footing of the wall, causing the wall to begin to settle. In 2007, hopefully, we will be awarded some grant monies to address the problems the flood caused.

I wish to thank Sheldon Gray and Danny Smith for their help on Roaring Brook Road. Sheldon gave us the use of his equipment, knowing we had no funding for repairs to the road.

The Public Works crew cleaned seven miles of roadside ditches this year, mostly on Piper Hill Road. We also repaired a half mile of Piper Hill Road, putting down road fabric and gravel.

Foreman David Begin, with the crew, set up the plow and wing assembly on the 550 Ford, complete with hydraulics. This was at a third of the cost it would have been to send the work out. Anthony Rossitto of our Public Works crew did an excellent job of painting the backhoe. The two ten wheelers were sandblasted and painted by Jeff Bailey. We plan to paint the pay-loader in 2007.

The landfill is operating as designed. One and a quarter million gallons of contaminated groundwater have been pumped and treated from the existing "plume" on the site. The contamination had migrated across the town line into Columbia, heading toward Lime Pond. We have pulled the contamination BACK to the Colebrook side of the line, bringing the very high levels of contaminant down. It is hoped to have the "plume" fully treated within another year's time.

Reporting for the landfill is being done completely now in-house by April Hyde and myself. The first two quarterly reports cost a contracted amount of \$22,000. By completing our own reports, this amount was saved in 2006; it is estimated \$40,000 will be saved in 2007.

The first phase of the landfill closure will begin this summer, consisting of placing a plastic cover over the material with a final layer of topsoil and grass. This will stop the rainfall from penetrating and cut down on the amount of water pumped and treated.

We plan to drill the production well for the Water Department in 2007 and begin construction on a pump-house. It is hoped that more grant money can be obtained to facilitate connecting into the existing system. The study of the current system indicating recommendations for future repair and replacement work, along with new main installations, is almost completed.

The sewer plant has a new federal permit from EPA, which required some changes in testing and treatment. Most of our testing is completed in-house. We also run the tests for other towns, which brings in revenue for the department. The public works crew completed an addition to the Town Garage this year. This addition was funded by New England Waste Services, at no cost to the taxpayer, and provides more lab and office space.

The New Hampshire legislature passed a new law, which takes effect July 1, 2007, requiring the recycling of electronics. Bernard Carrier of Colebrook Plumbing and Heating donated a building to the Town for this purpose and we will have it by June 2007. There will be a disposal fee, which will be announced once we have some firm figures.

The recycling association wrote a letter thanking Colebrook residents and the public works employees for their recycling efforts. Using the recycled material to manufacture new products conserved 96,000 pounds of coal.

I wish to extend a huge thank you to my entire crew for a job well done! We worked with a budget that was cut back \$40,000 from the previous year and still provided the same services to the people of Colebrook. The crew has scrimped and saved wherever it was possible to make ends meet. Much of our "shopping" has been done next door at the Transfer Station.

Again, thank you guys, and gal, for a teamwork effort!

Colebrook Recreation Department Report

The Colebrook Recreation Department is continuing to offer programs that have been held in previous years such as Youth soccer league, Travel team soccer, Youth basketball league, grades 3 & 4 basketball travel team, Play Soccer camp, Summer day camp, HOAP, Tennis camp, Book discussion group, Paul Hogan basketball camp, and Movie nights. These programs are continuing to grow and will continue to improve. The enrollment in several programs has seen a dramatic increase while others have remained at a steady level. Many of these programs have worked due to the help of volunteer coaches and parents.

There has been development of several new family programs added over the past year: Father-daughter dance, Mother-Son Game Night, Crock Pot Cooking, and Creative Cakes for Kids, Harry Potter Night, Camera Class and Pool Egg Hunt. It is the continued hope that several of these programs will continue throughout the current year for the community to enjoy.

October was the start of the eighth HOAP (Healthy Older Adult Program) season with a kick-off brunch. Membership is, once again, over 100 members from Colebrook and the surrounding area. To become a member, an individual must be at least 55 years in age and complete a survey packet. Being a member of the program makes you eligible for several programs at a reduced cost. The daily swimming at the North Country Community Recreation Center is back again for another year, as well as the walking program at the River of Life. Some new events for HOAP are the Healthy HOAP Day, Trip to Tilton, and Dinner & a movie night. The HOAP program has continued to visit the theater, take a shopping trip, hold a holiday party, and go for tea. There are still several activities to complete this HOAP season.

With the addition of the Recreation Revolving Fund for the 2005 year, we were able to purchase glow sticks for the safety of the young trick or treater's this Halloween season. The Advisory Board also held the annual soccer and basketball tournaments as fundraisers. An addition to the fundraising campaign was the Patchwork Players who put on a performance in August for the community.

The recreation department offered eight different adult programs throughout the year involving over 200 members of the community; while sixteen, various sports and art programs were offered for the children of the community, serving over 500 children. This would not be possible without the help of volunteer coaches, instructors, and members of the community.

I would like to thank the Recreation Advisory Board and Travel Team Coaches for all of their assistance in 2006, especially those members whose terms have expired. Thank you for your time commitment as it is appreciated.

COLEBROOK PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT

The library loaned 21,864 materials this year. 15,755 were adult and 6109 children's materials. We borrowed 1096 and loaned 851 materials through the New Hampshire State Library System. This system is available to the public and most of our books are included. To access the site: www.nhu-pac.library.state.nh.us

The library also has access to NHewLINK through the State Library. This site contains databases for books, magazines, newspapers, genealogy, business and medical resources all available to the public from home. www.nhewlink.state.nh.us

CD's and DVD's are becoming popular. The library purchased best sellers and classic CDs with monies donated by the Gooch and Furbush families. We have not yet purchased DVDs. We wish to thank everyone who has donated his or her collections.

The library accepted with much regret the resignation of Children's Librarian, Bobie Cummings in April. We wish Bobie luck in her new business. The library hired Rose Hand to fill the position.

Monies from the interest of the Excelsior Lodge #73 IOOF fund were used to purchase the News & Sentinel, 1934-1959 on microfilm. Our collection now includes The Northern Sentinel from Nov.1870-Nov.1871 and Nov.1872-Nov.1875 and the News & Sentinel from 1900-1970.

We held 182 programs, including the Book Club, Movie Night, school visits, and day-care visits; some of the more memorable programs are listed.

This year's Summer Reading theme was "Treasure Reading". Kicking off the program was Deborah Humiston's "Ultimate Treasure Hunt". Entertainer Steve Blunt did a program called "Yo, Ho, Ho, to the Library O!" The ever popular program, "WildLife Encounters", came again this year with their numerous animals. Once again the Boston Museum of Science did our Summer Reading Awards night.

Local Midwife Monica Stevens presented a program on midwifery.

Russian artist Marina Forbes put on a great program of Russian culture. The small group attending worked on Russian **Martruska** dolls of various sizes.

The library sponsored the first "Pizza Taste Off". Local pizza parlors were invited to submit a small pizza to be judged for crust, sauce, and overall taste. The judges were local children. You may see our awards hanging prominently on business walls.

The Adult Tutorial Program is still using the old library basement for people interested in obtaining their GED. They meet Monday mornings.

The Board of Trustees and librarians are considering turning the old library basement into a Young Adult library. We understand the need for this age group to have their own space and not mingle with the toddlers and younger children. This would also open the Children's Room for small storyhours.

The Gates Staying Connected Technical Support Grant in the amount of \$600.00 to be used for providing technical assistance and support was offered in October through the New Hampshire State Library. We applied for and received the grant to be used for configuring patron authentication to provide the technology for the Overdrive Audiobook Program.

I would like to thank the dedicated volunteers Donna Forbes, Sandy & Bob Ferrini, and Clare Allaire for getting books ready for patrons every Wednesday; and Trustee Lori Morann for sprucing up the flower box and garden.

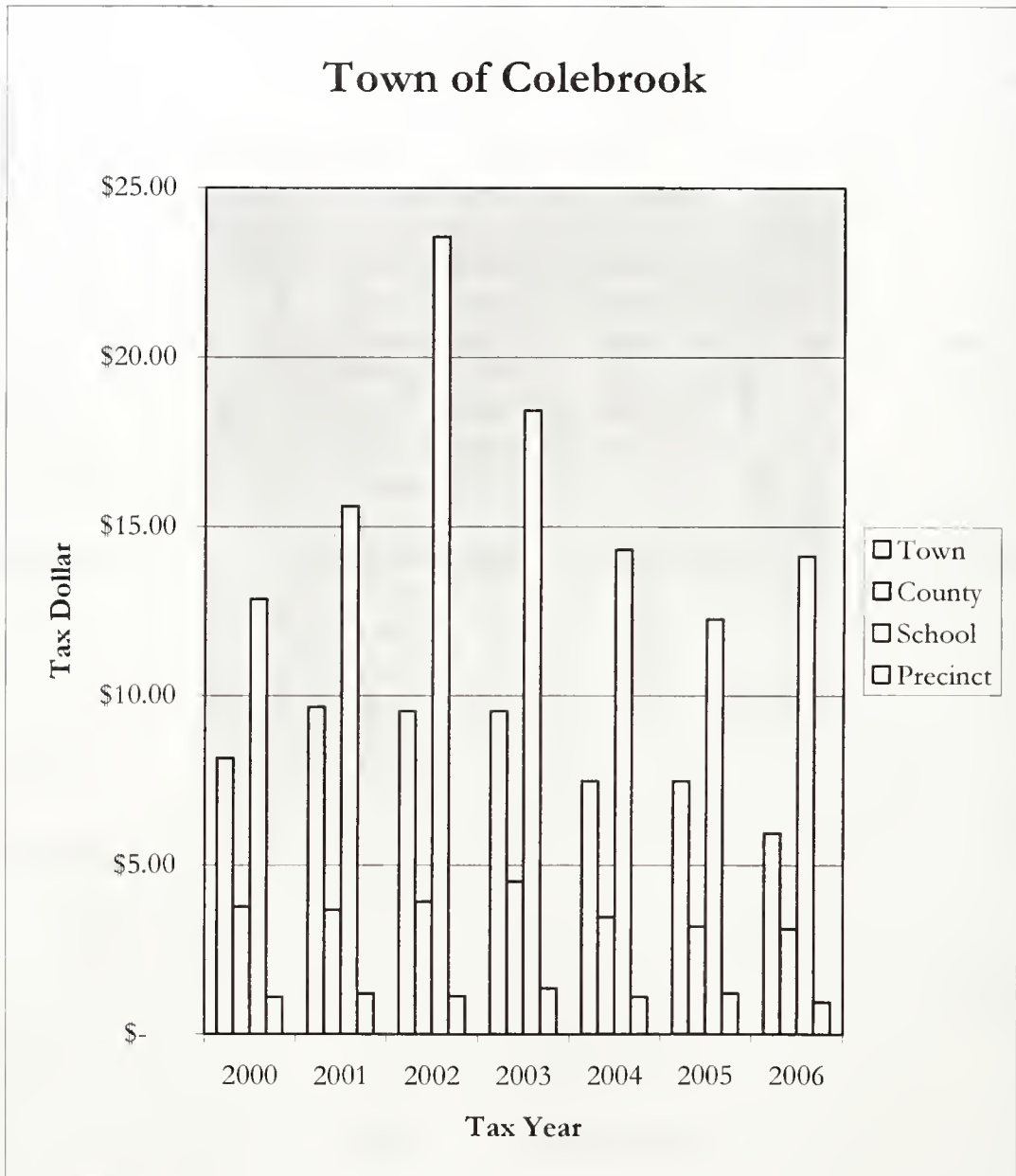

To the inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on **Tuesday, March 13, 2007 at 7:00 P.M.** in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1 To bring in your ballots for the selection of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

Article 2 To vote by ballot on the following amendments to the Town of Colebrook Zoning Ordinance and Floodplain Ordinance. The following questions will appear on the official ballot, and are not open to further amendment.

Amendment #1: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #1 to Section 6 of the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Colebrook, proposed by the Planning Board as follows: (Placement will be Section 6 between the existing B and C with re-lettering of current C to D.)

1) If construction is not begun within one year from the date of issuance of a Building permit, then the Building Permit shall become void, in the absence of further action by the Planning Board; provided, however, that this one-year period shall not be deemed to alter or supersede any other time period imposed by the Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment. In case of conflict, the more stringent time limitation shall control. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #2: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #2 to the definitions in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance, proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

2) "Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #3: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #3 to the definitions in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance, proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

3) "New construction" means, for the purposes of determining insurance rates, structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of an initial FIRM or after December 31, 1974, whichever is later, and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures. For floodplain management purposes, new construction means structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of a floodplain management regulation adopted by a community and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #4: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #4 to the definitions in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance, proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

- 4) “Violation” means the failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with the community’s floodplain management regulations. A structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required in 44CFR 60.3(b)(5), (c)(4), (c)(10), (d)(3), (e)(2), (e)(4), or (e)(5) is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #5: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #5, an addition (in italics) to the definition of “Development” in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance, proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

- 5) “Development” means any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to building or other structures, mining, filling, grading, paving excavation, drilling operations *or storage of equipment or materials.*” (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #6: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #6 to the definition of “Manufactured Home” in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance, proposed by the Planning Board as follows:

- 6) “This includes manufactured homes located in a manufactured home park or subdivision.” (This is to be added to the end of the definition.) (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #7: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #7 to Item VII. Section 1 in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance as follows:

- 7) Replace “Wetlands Board of the New Hampshire Environmental Services Department” with “Wetlands Bureau of the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services.” (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #8: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #8 to Item VII. Section 2 in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance as follows:

- 8) Replace “Wetlands Board” with “Wetlands Bureau”. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Amendment #9: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #9 to Item VIII. Section 1(c) and Section 2 (f) in the Town of Colebrook Floodplain Ordinance as follows:

- 9) Remove Section 1(c) and Section 2 (f) under Item VIII as there is no Zone AO or Zone AH located in the Town of Colebrook; therefore, it is not applicable. (The Planning Board recommends passage of this amendment.)

Article 3 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$1,955,395.00** for **General Government**. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

(The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

Article 5 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$110,000.00** for repairs to **Roaring Brook Road**, with this entire sum to be offset by grant funds, and no amount to be raised by taxation. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

Article 6 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$100,000.00** for the purchase of a new Plow Truck, and to authorize the withdrawal of this entire sum from the **Highway Capital Reserve Equipment Fund** (created 1999), with no amount to be raised by taxation; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to sell the existing Ford F-450. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

Article 7 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$40,000.00** for an **Engineering Study** to be done on the retaining wall near the Academy. If this study is not completed, the Town will not qualify for further grants from the State. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

(The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 11** To see if the Town will vote to establish an Expendable Trust fund for the purpose of **Disaster Management** and to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$40,000.00** to be placed in this fund, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to withdraw from this fund. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 12** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ **297,264.00** for the **Colebrook Water Works and the Colebrook Sewer Facilities**. Said funds to be offset by user fees. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)

- Article 13** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$250,000.00** for the purpose of repairing **Water Crossing Mains**, this entire sum is to come from grants, with no amount to be raised by taxation. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 14** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$204,000.00** for the purpose of **Water Wells**, this entire sum is to come from grants, with no amount to be raised by taxation. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 15** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$106,230.00** for the support of the **Colebrook Public Library**, \$94,880.00 of which to be raised through taxation and \$11,350.00 of which is to come from other Library balance on hand January 1, 2007, book sales, donations, trust funds, non-resident fees, other communities, over due fines, book resale's, copying fees etc., such funds to be expended under the direction of the Board of Library Trustees. - Article 17** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$5,000.00** to be added to the **Colebrook Cemetery Grounds Maintenance and Reclamation Fund Expendable Trust (2005)**, and to authorize the Board of Cemetery Trustees as agents to expend from this fund. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 18** To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the **Cemetery Fence Expendable Trust Fund** created in 2000. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of the withdrawal in the amount of **\$17,850.00** are to be transferred to the municipality's general fund. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.) (Majority vote is required.)
- Article 19** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$17,850.00** to be added to the **Cemetery Grounds Maintenance and Reclamation Expendable Trust Fund** (created 2007) this entire sum is to come from the deposit to the general fund made under Article 18, with no amount to be raised through taxation. (This article to be taken up only if Article 18 passes) (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.) (Majority vote required.)
- Article 20** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$205,081.00** for the **Colebrook Dispatch Center**, of which \$112,808.43 will be raised through taxation, \$11,500.00 will be withdrawn from the Colebrook Dispatch Savings Equipment Fund and the remainder to be offset by revenues raised from the participating towns. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article.)
- Article 21** Shall we modify the **Elderly Exemption** from property tax in the Town of Colebrook, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers, to be as follows: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years, **\$10,000.00**; for a person 75 years of age to 80 years, **\$12,500.00**; for a person 80 years of age or older **\$15,000.00**. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 3 consecutive years, own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married to each other for at least 5 consecutive years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income in each applicable age group of not more than **\$13,400.00** or, if married, a combined net income of less than **\$20,400.00**; and own net assets not in excess of **\$35,000.00** excluding the value of the person's residence. (The Selectmen recommend passage of this article).
- Article 22** Shall we modify the **Veterans Credit** (RSA 72:28) from \$100.00 to **\$125.00**? This amount will be deducted from the year-end total property tax bill. (The Selectmen recommend passage of the article.)
- Article 23** To see if the Town will go on record in support of effective actions by the President and the Congress to address the issue of climate change, which is increasingly harmful to the environment and economy of New Hampshire and to the future well being of the people of Colebrook.

These actions include:

- 1) Establishment of a national program requiring reductions of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions while protecting the U.S. economy.
- 2) Creation of a major national research initiative to foster rapid development of sustainable energy technologies thereby stimulating new jobs and investment.

In addition, the Town Of Colebrook encourages New Hampshire citizens to work for emission reductions within their communities, and we ask our Selectmen to consider the appointment of a voluntary energy committee to recommend local steps to save energy and reduce emissions.

The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation, to the President of the United States, and to declared candidates for those offices. (By Petition.)

Article 24 To see if the Town will vote to **accept, ratify** and **confirm** the reports of the Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers.

Article 25 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT ON THE COLEBROOK CEMETERIES

Colebrook has within its boundaries four cemeteries of which the trustees are responsible for three. The fourth is the private Roman Catholic cemetery on South Main Street just north of the Shrine.

The Cemetery Trustees have the responsibility of being the general overseers of the care and maintenance of the three cemeteries. However, in as much as the bulk of the money raised for the maintenance comes from perpetual trusts, the trustees of the Trust Funds of Colebrook are charged by State law with the task of insuring that the trust money is used as the original donors expected it to be.

Village Cemetery:

The Village Cemetery is located on U.S. Route 3 at the northern edge of the village. The bulk of the old cemeteries trust funds are dedicated to this cemetery.

Reed Cemetery:

The Reed Cemetery is located in East Colebrook at the junction of the Forbes and Reed Roads. With one exception the rules that apply to the burials in the Village Cemetery apply to those of the Reed Cemetery. The exception is that, due to the limited space available for future burials, only those persons with either a strong family connection to the cemetery or own their lots may be buried in that cemetery.

Titus Hill Cemetery:

This cemetery is located on Titus Hill Road, east of the village. Since there are no maps associated with this cemetery and no records exist of where the old graves are located, this cemetery, for all practical purposes, is closed to future burials.

St. Brendan's Cemetery:

This is a private cemetery under the control of St. Brendan's Catholic Church in Colebrook; with the exception that the town annually provides a sum of money to assist in its maintenance. We exercise no jurisdiction over its operation. All trust funds that were previously held by the Trustees pertaining to persons buried in this cemetery were turned over (with State approval) to the St. Brendan Trustees in the early 1980's.

Cemetery Trust Funds:

There are five different types of trust funds relating to the village cemeteries: perpetual care, cleaning of tombstones, flowers, trees and shrubs, and general maintenance.

NOTE:

It should be stressed here that the Colebrook Trustees of the Trust Funds are not bound to accept bequeaths from wills or otherwise perform tasks which they feel are not in the best interest of the Town. (e.g. further flower funds.) The Trustees may reject such bequeaths. Consequently, should lawyers or persons drawing up wills call for advice, it is strongly urged that the Trustees advise the person plainly that any bequests against Trustees policy will not be accepted.

Perpetual Care:

This is by far the largest number of trust funds held by the Trustees of the Trust Funds. They can be divided into three types:

- a. **RESTRICTED:** the oldest and largest number of trust funds. These are set up so that the interest is used only for the maintenance of a specified lot.
- b. **NON-RESTRICTED:** in the early 1980's the wording of the perpetual care trust funds was changed to allow the excess interest accumulated from each new trust to be used for the care of the cemetery as a whole.
- c. **GENERAL TRUSTS:** starting in 1986, by a vote of the townspeople at the Annual Town Meeting, it was decided to do away with specific trusts. Perpetual care funds are now transferred to a general cemetery trust fund, and except for the year that the money was received, the identity of the trust is no longer kept separate. We do, however, keep a name card on file of these trusts for reference purposes.

Cleaning of Stones:

There are three trusts that contain within their instructions wording that calls for occasional cleaning of the tombstones. These instructions are to be honored as long as adequate funds are available over and above the general care and maintenance of the lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted, as the Cemetery Trustees have initiated a cleaning and reclamation program for the complete cemetery.

Flower Funds:

Originally there were twenty-four (24) lots for which flower funds had been established. These called for flowers to be placed on the lots each Memorial Day. These requests have been honored as long as funds were available to maintain the lots and purchase the flowers. Only nine (9) remain with sufficient funds. Annually (just before Memorial Day) the Trustees of the Trust Funds will contact one of the local flower shops and contract the placement of the flowers on the respective lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted.

(All lot locations are based on Nancy Dodge's register of cemetery plots and are all located in the Village Cemetery)

Trees and Shrubs:

This fund was established by Elizabeth and Nellie Young to beautify the Village Cemetery. It can be used for the purchase of trees and shrubs, perennials, etc little or nothing of the account had been used over the years, and as a result it has grown to considerable size. Presently, approximately \$500 is withdrawn each year to trim the hedges and shrubs.

General Maintenance:

Frank Leonard left money for the general care and maintenance of the Village Cemetery. The interest of this fund has been used primarily to paint the wrought iron fence.

Tibbett's Family Trust:

These funds are to be used to create and maintain the Tibbett's Memorial Park, and such other programs that will add to the beauty of the cemetery. The expenditure of these funds is to be determined annually by the Trustees of the Trust Funds in conjunction with the Cemetery Trustees.

New Cemetery Trusts:

The purchase price of a new lot includes both the costs of the lot and the perpetual care. It is paid to the Treasurer of the Cemetery Trustees, who then turns it over to the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

Colebrook Cemetery Trustees Report

In July, we completed our new cemetery fence project when the memorial plaques were mounted on the outside wall of the tomb. It was possible to do this project through the generosity of so many.

Sexton Arthur Truesdale and his crew, Larry Shawney, Glenn Raymond Jr., Maryanne Rossitto and Gregory Raymond kept the grounds in excellent condition. Removing fallen trees and brush, along with pruning trees, was a project that they completed at all the Town Cemeteries. The area where sunrise services are held was cleared, making a big improvement in this section.

Several people worked diligently to keep the cemetery a place to be proud of and we wish to acknowledge them. Ellie Gooch and Virginia Stickney placed flowers and Christmas wreaths at the main entrance to the cemetery at the location of the old tomb. Frances N. Haynes and Jean Haynes planted flowers, which were taken care of by the cemetery crew.

Within the Colebrook Village Cemetery, lots were sold to Herman and Brenda Paquette, Melony Lyons and Shane Caron, Brenda Brooks Gadwah and Brett Adair Brooks, Richard and Linda Gelinas and the Hartman family. Lots were purchased in the Tibbetts Memorial Park by Arthur Bolton Jr., George and Cathy Bolton, Mary Bolton Haynes and Matthew Elliott. There were eleven entombments from other towns, which we received reimbursement for, as well as twenty full burials and fifteen cremations.

There were eleven stones in the Reed Cemetery repaired with three more to be done in the spring. Five stones in the Colebrook Village Cemetery were repaired with appropriated funds. A three-piece marble monument, vandalized in 2006, was reset and repaired at no charge by David Hicks. This is a project we plan to continue this coming year with funds raised through our annual budget. Several stones, selected by the cemetery trustees, will be cleaned by the cemetery crew.

Work began on the area of the old disposal area and will be completed next year.

The Trustees feel we had a very productive year and look forward to next year. Future improvements we are committed to are:

- ❖ Repair and clean old stones
- ❖ Excavate the area of the old disposal area
- ❖ Pave the roadway to the tomb
- ❖ Pave remaining entranceways up to the fence line
- ❖ Continue with our reclamation area project
- ❖ Rebuild the existing road system

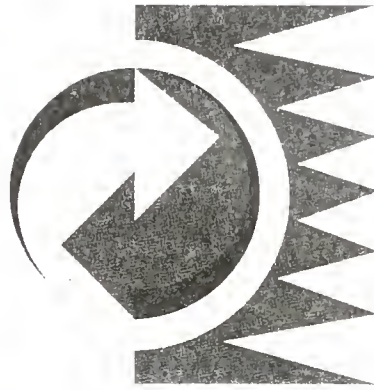
